A rice mill in Pazundaung, Rangoon Division, built with Chinese assistance, was completed in July 1983. Construction began in January 1981 with all equipment provided by China. The rice mill handles 150 t of paddy with a production of 100 t per day.

Ecuador

China has offered to help build a mini-hydroelectric station under a long-term, interest-free loan of 2,000,000 U.S. dollars.

Equatorial Guinea

A Chinese-aided hydropower station with an installed capacity of 3,200 kW was completed and handed over. The power station, situated 17 kilometers east of Bata, will provide cheap electricity for that coastal provincial city through a twin project of a Chinese-aided high-tension network.

Gambia

A health center, built with Chinese aid in Farafenni, was handed over on August 24. Three other centers are still under construction.

Jordan

The Maan housing projects, with 440,000 square meters of floor space, is one of the first projects China has undertaken in Jordan. They were contracted by a Chinese house-building company. 365 Chinese workers and technicians participated in the construction which started on February 1982, with the first-phase scheduled to be completed on April 1984.

Mali

China has agreed to help Mali overhaul equipment in the Siribala sugar refinery. The refinery, located in Mali's Segou Region, has a daily handling capacity of 1,000 tons of sugar cane. Its production can meet most of Mali's needs.

Nigeria

An agreement and seven contracts have been signed between a study group from the municipality of Beijing and the Rivers state of eastern Nigeria after the group's visit to the state from August 16 to 27. According to the agreement and contracts signed, Beijing and the Rivers state would cooperate bilaterally in the fields of medicine, pharmacy, small industries, printing and agriculture. Specialists would be dispatched and technical services offered by Beijing.

Seychelles

China and the Seychelles reached an agreement in principle on assisting Seychelles with the extension of a senior middle school built with Chinese aid, promoting technical interchange in fisheries development, cinnamon processing, embroidery and mushroom cultivation, providing maize seed and expanding trade.

Sierra Leone

A government building, constructed with Chinese aid, was handed over in Freetown on August 26.

Tanzania/Zambia

The China-Tanzania-Zambia talks on technical cooperation on Tanzania, the Tanzani-Zambia railway, ended on August 10 following a three-day discussion with the signing of an agreement. Under it, the repay time limit for the loans China had given to Tanzania and Zambia for construction of the railway will be extended for another ten years and the credit to the purchase of 12 locomotives for five years. China has decided to provide a fresh loan of 30 million yuan (about 15 million U.S. dollars) for the purchase of spare parts and equipment for the railway. China has also agreed to send more Chinese technicians to help improve the railway's management.

Tanzania

China will send expert teams to conduct feasibility study for joint ven-

tures proposed by Tanzania. These ventures are a ship repair yard at Dar es salaam port, a joint fishing project and a joint construction company. The two countries will work for two joint ventures in restaurants and wood processing under an earlier agreement. China will also sent teams to survey problems in some completed projects, such as the Ubungo farm implements factory, friendship textile mill as well as the central railway line. China has also agreed on a barter trade system under which Tanzania will export industrial and agricultural products in exchange for spare parts and raw materials. China is likely to import cement, cashew nuts, timber and other products from Tanzania under the barter system. (XNA, Aug 14, 1983)

Yemen, People's Republic

Work on rebuilding the "Zingibar Friendship Bridge" with Chinese aid given gratis started on 21st August. The bridge, which links Aden with the main highways in four provinces, was built by China in 1971 and destroyed by floods in March 1982. (XNA, Aug 22, 1983; cit. SWB 7422, Aug 26, 1983)

Zambia

The Chingola maize mill in Zambia's copperbelt province built with Chinese aid was handed over on August 18. Construction on the mill started in August 1981 and was completed in May of this year, eight months ahead of schedule. With an annual capacity of 60,000 tons, it will provide high quality maize flour to the neighboring copperbelt and Western provinces. (XNA, Aug 18, 1983)

The 2.4-km bridge across the Luapula river on the Chinese-aided 249 km Serenje-Samfya highway was opened on August 19. (XNA, Aug 19, 1983)

The Chinese-aided Mulungushi textile mill was handed over on August 23. It is situated in the capital of Zambia's cotton-producing central province, is one of the country's two biggest textile mills with an annual capacity of some 14 million meters of cloth. (XNA, Aug 23, 1983)
