Under the supplementary accord the two countries will select annually a quan-tity of publications for sale in each other's capital. (XNA Sep 13, 1983)

Iran (Sep 14)

Agreement on cultural, scientific and technical cooperation. It is valid for five years and stipulates that both sides endeavour to enhance their cultural, scientific and technical relations in accord with the principles of respect for sovereignty and non-inter-ference in each other's internal affairs, and on the basis of reciprocation and observance of mutual interests. Ac-cording to the agreement, China and Iran will encourage: cooperation be-tween universities and educational and research institutes; exchanges of information and publications in the fields of literature, art, philosophy, religion, archaeology and history; exchanges of experts and researchers in culture, education and art with a view to conducting studies in specialized fields of interest to both sides; exchanges of movie and TV films; mutual visits of

art groups and art exhibitions; and mutual visits and competition by sport teams.

Bulgaria (Sep 28)

Protocol of the 21st session of the Scientific and Technological Cooperation Committee. Under it, both sides agreed on technological exchanges and research cooperation in vegetable culti-vation. They also identified the fields of exchanges in agriculture and in the light, textile, machinery and coal industries.

Cultural exchange program. Under it China and France will further cooperation and exchanges in education, the

The French will provide scholarships for 30 to 35 Chinese postgraduates annually. Painting, photo-graphy, calligraphy, and film exhibitions will be exchanged, including an exhibition of French painting from 1870-1920 and retropesctive film exhibitions from both countries. Teachers. writers, publishers, social scientists and artists will make mutual visits. (XNA, Oct 1, 1983)

Germany, Democratic Republic (Sep 30)

Protocol on sports exchange for 1984. Under it the German Democratic Republic will send gymnastic, track and field, diving and ice hockey teams to visit China next year while China will send six sports teams to G.D.R. (XNA, Oct 1 1983)

Nepal (Sep 30)

Minutes on trans-frontier pasturing by border inhabitants. Under the minutes, the Chinese government is to extend grazing facilities on the Chinese terri-tory for livestock from Nepal's Humla and Mustand districts for a period of five years and for livestock from Nepal's Sindhupalchok and Dolakha dis-tricts for a period of three years, totaling 10,000 head. Likewise, 900 head of livestock from Burang county of China's Tibet Autonomous Region will be permitted to cross the frontier for grazing inside the Nepalese territory for a period of five years. The two sides have also agreed to take up immunization measures for the prevention of contagious diseases among the livestock to be sent for trans-frontier pasturing. In addition, both countries will make efforts to develop their own pasture grounds so as to permit, through phased reductions of the number of their livestock for trans-frontier pasturing, the termination of trans-frontier pasturing when the agreement expires.
