art groups and art exhibitions; and mutual visits and competition by sport teams.

The two sides have also agreed to take up immunization measures for the prevention of contagious diseases among the livestock to be sent for trans-frontier pasturing. In addition, both countries will make efforts to develop their own pasture grounds so as to permit, through phased reductions of the number of their livestock for trans-frontier pasturing, the termination of trans-frontier pasturing when the agreement expires.
