Czechoslovakia will export Tatra-815 lorries, textile machinery, (?leather processing) machinery, metal-working machinery, diesel engines, motorcycles, other machinery and equipment, rolled steel, and chemicals, in exchange for cotton, tungsten concentrate, other raw materials, foodstuffs such as rice, cocoa, meat products, corn and soya, as well as consumer goods. The trade agreement assumes that the volume of goods exchange would more than double as compared to this year.
