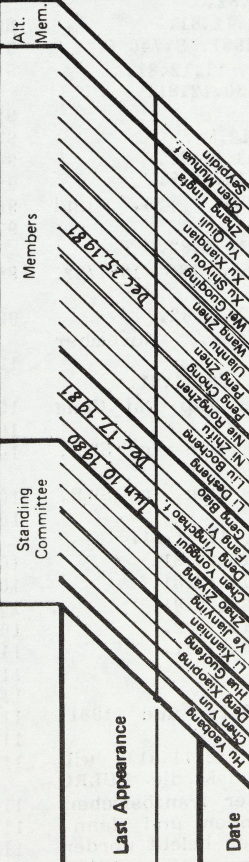
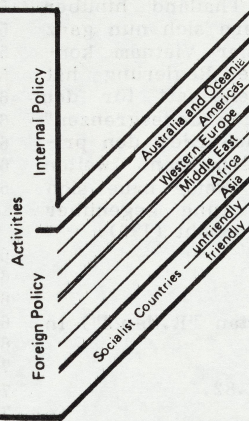

2. Contract for selling 630 heads of Xinjiang breeding sheep with fine wool and supplying technical service to Yugoslavia by China. The technical service is related to duck-breeding and mushroom-raising.

Identified as deputy political commissar of Wuhan Military Region (Wuhan Radio, Jan 16, 1982)  
Ren, a member of the CCP 11th Central Committee, was Secretary of Tibet Autonomous Region CP from 1971 until May 1980 and responsible for a policy which led to Great Han chauvinism in that Autonomous Region. As to be seen, a member of the inner circle of the CCP hardly can fall.

Identified as deputy commandant of the PLA Air Force Academy (XNA, Jan 18, 1982)  
Shen is a major-general of the PLA Air Force. He was elected deputy for the PLA to the 5th NPC in 1978.

#### Wang Zhengchu 王政柱

Identified as deputy director of the PLA General Logistics Department (XNA, Jan 29, 1982)  
Wang is a rear-admiral who served in the South China Fleet before the Cultural Revolution.

#### Wu Chunren 吴纯仁

Identified as deputy commander of the Fuzhou Military Region (Fuzhou Radio, Jan 22, 1982)  
Wu is an old military cadre who served in the 1st Front and the 4th Field Armies (Lin Biao's armies). He was a deputy commander of Guangzhou Military Region when he was elected an alternate member of the CCP 9th Central Committee in 1969. Not confirmed on this post by the 10th Party Congress in 1973 he possibly held his military post until 1977. In Jan 1978 he was named a cadre of Fuzhou Military Region for the first time. His now identified post possibly dates back to this time.

#### Xu Yunbei 徐运北

Identified as vice-minister of light industry (XNA, Jan 30, 1982)  
Xu was minister of this resort before the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1972 he was a vice-chairman of the Beijing Revolutionary Committee since that time until 1977.

### Congo

At the construction site of the people's palace more than 100 Chinese technicians are working. The palace covers a total floor space of 30,000 square meters.

### Nepal

A new sugar mill will be constructed with Chinese aid at Sumwal Village, Nawalparasi, in southwestern Nepal. The sugar mill after its completion will have a daily crushing capacity of 1,000 tons of sugarcane. An alcohol distillery attached to it will turn out 16,000 liters of alcohol per day (95 degrees) for industrial and medical use. The mill will be named after Lumbini, the birth place of Buddha Sakyamuni. Nepal is self-sufficient in sugar. The sugar mill will enable the country to produce more sugar for domestic and foreign needs.
