AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

- Mar 02 International Monetary Fund**
The International Monetary Fund has approved a request by the government of the People's Republic of China for a standby borrowing arrangement of 450 million sdr over the next 12 months, in support of the government's 1981 economic readjustment program. China will also receive a loan from the trust fund, an IMF press release said. China's fund quota is 1.8 billion sdr.

Agreement on the protection of migratory birds and their habitats. In the agreement, the two governments note that birds are an important factor in ecology and a valuable natural resource in the fields of economy, science, culture, art and recreation. Many species of birds migrate between the two countries. The agreement records that 270 kinds of geese, cranes and pheasants are now protected in China and Japan. It says that the two sides will cooperate in scientific investigations and the protection of birds and that the agreement itself will enhance scientific and cultural exchanges and friendly relations between China and Japan.

The protocol, signed on the basis of mutual benefit and friendship, said the two sides will join efforts in studying traditional Chinese medicine with the goal of raising the curative effects of traditional Chinese medicine for the health of the people of the two countries.

Reciprocal agreement on avoiding double taxation arising from the business of air transport. According to the agreement, the two governments will exempt each other's air transport industries from any tax on revenues, income or capital gains earned within the other's borders. It also exempts Chinese nationals posted to the United Kingdom by their air transport industry and United Kingdom nationals posted to China by their air transport industry from any income tax of any sort in the host country.

First trade agreement, under which both sides agree to accord reciprocally the most-favored nation treatment in tariff, import and export duty, re-export and transit duty and in issuing import and export permits and dealing with customs formalities.

Memorandum of understanding of the protocol and action plan for the research and conservation center for the giant panda, which is situated in Wolong, Sichuan Province. The memorandum says that both sides "note with satisfaction that the protocol and action plan for the research and conservation center for the giant panda, signed in Soestdijk, The Netherlands, on June 30, 1980, has been approved by the competent authorities of both sides and has come into effect." It adds that both sides "further note with satisfaction that progress has been made with both the capital construction and the research program agreed upon in the action plan." In the memorandum WWF has reaffirmed its commitment to provide 1 million US\$ against the estimated total costs of about 4.3 million Yuan (one U.S. Dollar equals 1.52 Yuan in last December) needed for the capital construction of six items for the panda center listed in the action plan. "The balance of these costs will be provided by the Chinese side through self fundraising."

Under the protocol, the products China exports to Romania include coke, coal, mineral products, chemical products, machines, light industry products and canned food. What Romania exports to China includes drilling machines, jeeps, cars, locomotives, combine harvesters, rolled steel, aluminium ingot and plant equipment for producing cement.

The foreign ministers of the European Community have reached an agreement in principle on providing food aid for the People's Republic of China, a spokesman of the EEC Council announced here this evening (Brussels 17th March). The aid, which amounts to 5,200,000 European units of account (about 6,240,000 US\$), was approved at the two-day EEC Council meeting ending today. The 10 EEC countries agreed that they would grant 2,000 metric tons of milk powder (worth about 1,200,000 e.u.a.) and 8,000 metric tons of rape-oil (worth about 4,000,000 e.u.a.) to help the two Chinese provinces (Hebei and Hubei) stricken with droughts and floods respectively. The EEC food aid, the first of its kind to China, was approved after the EEC countries had looked into the situation in the afflicted regions and into their own possibilities.

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

Wolfgang Bartke

General: Construction Abroad

The China Construction Company is actively expanding business abroad. The company has signed 109 construction contracts with clients in North Yemen, Iraq and other countries and areas. The construction projects include houses, office buildings, hotels, restaurants, hospitals and so forth.

The China Building Engineering Corporation (also known as the China Construction Machinery Corporation), which contracts for construction work in foreign countries, has completed 21 construction projects in North Yemen, Kuwait and other countries since its founding. These projects represent a part of the 109 contracts signed by the corporation with foreign customers. The 109 contracts cover such work as designing, construction and equipment installation. All of the 21 buildings have been completed and turned over to customers for use either at or prior to the time prescribed. The China Building Engineering Corporation is an organization established in early 1979 exclusively for undertaking construction projects in foreign countries. There are also six branch offices of the corporation in North Yemen, Iraq, Kuwait, Thailand, Hongkong and Macao. In the past two years the corporation has signed 15 long-term cooperation agreements with contractors in Kuwait, Sudan, Italy, Japan and the USA. It has also made joint investments with businessmen in North Yemen, Hongkong, Macao and other places in six companies that undertake building engineering and real-estate deals.

Congo

The Chinese and Congolese governments signed a protocol on 21st March on the Chinese government continuing to dispatch medical teams to Congo. The cooperation in medical work and public health between China and Congo started in 1967. The Chinese government has since sent a total of six medical teams.

The farm recently reaped a good harvest on its 48 hectares of experimental paddy fields. Output per hectare was 4,320 kilogrammes.

Known Cadres on New Posts

Bai Xiangyin 白向银

Identified as vice-minister of building materials industry (XNA, Mar 25, 1981)

Bai had been in the same position from 1970 until Jan 1975 to become a vice-minister of the Capital Construction Commission in 1977.

Chen Muhua (f) 陈慕华

Appointed minister of the Commission for Family Planning (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Chen, an alternate member of the Politburo, also holds the post of a minister for economic relations with foreign countries (since 1977) and of vice-premier (1978)

Chen Xinren 陈辛仁

Identified as vice-minister of the Commission for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries (XNA, Mar 13, 1981)

Chen was a cadre of the diplomatic service before. He held ambassador posts in Finland (1954-1958), Iran (1972-1974), the Netherlands (1975-1978) and the Philippines (1978-1981).

Dai Suli 戴苏里

Identified as 2nd secretary of Henan Province CP (Chengzhou Radio, Mar 7, 1981)

Dai, an alternate member of the CCP 11th Central Committee, had been secretary before.

Dong Zhanlin 董占林

Identified as deputy commander of Lanzhou Military Region (XNA, Mar 9, 1981)

In 1958 Dong was identified as a PLA colonel and commander of a division of the People's Volunteers in Korea

Du Xingyuan 杜星垣

Appointed secretary of the State Council (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Before the Cultural revolution Du held several posts as vice-minister, to become vice-minister of water conservancy and electric power in 1962, a position he held until 1977. In 1979 he was elected secretary of Sichuan Province CP, a post he held until 1980.

Geng Biao 耿飇

Appointed minister of national defense (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Geng has been a member of the Politburo since 1977. The following year he was appointed vice-premier and in March 1980, secretary-general of the Military Commission under the CCP Central Committee.

Han Guang 韩光

Appointed minister of the Capital Construction Commission (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Han who is a member of the CCP 11th Central Committee had been vice-minister of this commission before.

Hao Jianxiu (f) 赫建秀

Appointed minister of textile industry (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Hao, a member of the CCP 11th Central committee, had been vice-minister in the same ministry before. She is now China's third female minister, the other ones being Chen Muhua, minister of the Commission of Family Planning, and Qian Zhengying, minister of water conservancy.

Huang Zhen 黄镇

Appointed minister of the Commission for Cultural Relations

with Foreign Countries (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Huang, a member of the CCP 11th Central Committee after the Cultural Revolution, held prominent positions in the diplomatic field: ambassador to France (1969-1973) and chief of the Liaison Office in the USA (1973-1977). In December 1977 he became minister of culture, a post he held until now.

Ji Chaozhu 冀朝铸

Identified as deputy director of the Department of American and Oceanic Affairs under the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (XNA, Mar 14, 1981)

From 1975 until 1976 Ji had been deputy director of the Foreign Ministry's Department of International Organizations and Conferences, Agreements and Laws. When Deng Xiaoping visited the USA and Japan in 1979 he served as his interpreter.

Kang Shien 康世恩

Appointed minister of petroleum industry (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Kang is a member of the CCP 11th Central Committee. In March 1978 he was appointed vice-premier and minister of the State Economic Commission. The latter position he held until now. He got his new position although he received a demerit, first grade, in August 1980, for his failure to handle the capsizing of the "Bohai No.2" offshore drilling rig promptly and conscientiously.

Li Peng

Appointed minister of power industry (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Li had been vice-minister in the same ministry before. He succeeds Liu Lanbo who became an adviser to the State Council.

Li Qiang 李强

Appointed adviser to the State Council (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Li, a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1969, has held the post of minister of foreign trade ever since 1973.

Liang Xiang 梁湘

Elected vice-governor of Guangdong Province (Guangzhou Radio, Mar 4, 1981)

Liang, a vice-mayor of Guangzhou before the Cultural Revolution, became secretary of Guangzhou CP in 1976 and vice-chairman of Guangdong Revolutionary Committee the following year. The latter post he held until December 1979.

Lin Hujia 林乎加

Appointed minister of agriculture (XNA, Mar 6, 1981)

Lin is a member of the CCP 11th Central committee. Before the Cultural Revolution he had been secretary of Zhejiang Province CP. Reactivated in 1974 he held the following positions:

Secretary of Shanghai Municipality CP (1977-1978), 1st secretary of Tianjin Municipality CP (1978), 1st secretary of Beijing Municipality CP (1978-1981), and major of Beijing (1979-1981)

Liu Haiqing 刘海清
