AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

North Korea (Mar 04)
Protocol of goods exchange for 1982

U.S.A. (Mar 05)
Agreement with respect to mutual exemption from taxation of transportation income of shipping and air transport enterprises. The agreement stipulates that income and profits of an enterprise of a contracting state from the operation of ships or aircraft in international traffic shall be taxable only in that contracting state. These income and profits include those from the operation of passenger, cargo, or mail transportation.

Upper Volta (Mar 13)
A. Trade agreement. It stipulates that both countries accord each other most-favored-nation treatment in the spirit of cooperation and mutual benefit.
B. Protocol on sending a Chinese medical team.

Friendship and cooperation agreement between the All-China Journalists' Association and the Korean Journalists' Association.

Syria (Mar 16)
A. Five-year trade agreement. It stipulates that both sides provide preferential treatment.
B. Protocol on the cancellation of the payment agreement signed on 21 February 1963. It stipulates that payment of trade between the two countries should be made with convertible currency system. The two countries previously used a charge account system.

Great Britain (Mar 18?)
Additional agreement on civil aviation. Under it the British Cathay Pacific Airways will increase passenger carrying capacity by 70 percent on the air route between Shanghai and Hongkong

from May 1 and the Chinese Airline will increase traffic by 70 percent along the same route.

Under the agreement signed by the two sides, the Chinese and British civil aviation enterprises opened the Beijing-London air route and the route between Hongkong and the Mainland. The Hongkong-based Cathay Pacific Airways of Britain is not allowed to operate services between Hongkong and London after it began to operate regular services between Hongkong and Shanghai in 1980. But within one month's operation, the Cathay Pacific Airways began flying to London. Thus the airways should lose its qualification for operating the Shanghai-Hongkong route in line with the agreement. For convenience of people coming and going between Hongkong and the Mainland, and in consideration of the interest of the Cathay Pacific Airways, the Chinese authorities still made temporary arrangements to enable the Cathay Pacific Airways to continue its services on the Shanghai-Hongkong route to April 30 this year.

Protocol on sending a new medical team to Mauritania.

Yugoslavia (Mar 20)
Plan for cooperation and technical exchange in sports during 1982. Under the plan, the two countries this year will exchange track and field, judo, basketball, volleyball, diving and chess teams and will launch cooperative training programs in handball and water polo events.

France (Mar 22)
Agreement to exchange film exhibition. Under the agreement, a Chinese film exhibition, including silent films, will be shown in Paris and other departments in France in 1983. Arrangements for the exhibition will be made jointly by the Chinese film-library, the French film-library and the Georges Pompidou National Art and Culture Centre. In addition, an exhibition of 50 Chinese films on the development of Chinese cinema will be shown in Paris in June. An exhibition of French films will be held in Beijing and some provinces in China in the fall of 1983.

Brazil (Mar 25)
Agreement on scientific and technical cooperation. Under it, the Chinese and Brazilian governments will strengthen cooperation in scientific and technical fields and promote the advancement of sciences and technologies on the basis of the principle of respect for each other's sovereignty and noninterference in each other's internal affairs. The agreement stipulates that scientific and technical cooperation will include exchange of scientific and technical projects, reports, discussions and lectures; and exchanges of scientific and technical data and information, research and experiment results. According to the agreement, a joint committee for scientific and technical cooperation will be set up for handling matters related to the implementation

of the agreement and supplementary protocols.

U.S.A. (Mar 25)
Agreement for jointly conducting a feasibility study on the development of a coal mine in Northwest China between the China National Coal Development Corporation and the Island Creek Coal Company, a subsidiary of Occidental Petroleum Corporation, U.S.A. According to the agreement, the Antai-bao Surface Coal Mine in the Pingshuo Mine area, Shanxi Province, will be launched as a contractual joint venture with joint commitments of investment and risks. The planned yearly output is 15 mio.t.

Goods exchange and payment agreement for 1982.

Japan (Mar 26)
Exchange of notes on the 1981 Japanese government loan to the Chinese government. The interest-free loan is to be repaid in 23 years, including a grace period of 13 years. Under the terms contained in the notes, the eight projects mentioned in the additional agreement between two governments on economic and technical cooperation signed on 3rd July 1980 are to be replaced by the bridge construction project on the Rangoon-Syrian railway and highway.

The factory is also a joint venture between Nepal and West Germany, with the Nepalese government and businessmen investing 55 percent of the capital and a West German company 45 percent.

Installation of generating units is underway and about 1,000 ha of land have been reclaimed. Within this year, two generators with a capacity of 4,600 kW are expected to come into operation to supply the local residents with water and electricity.
