

AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

North Korea (Mar 04) Protocol of goods exchange for 1982 XNA, Mar 4, 1982

U.S.A. (Mar 05)

Agreement with respect to mutual exemption from taxation of transportation income of shipping and air transport enterprises. The agreement stipulates that income and profits of an enterprise of a contracting state from the operation of ships or aircraft in international traffic shall be taxable only in that contracting state. These income and profits include those from the operation of passenger, cargo, or mail transportation.

Upper Volta (Mar 13)

A. Trade agreement. It stipulates that both countries accord each other most-favored-nation treatment in the spirit of cooperation and mutual benefit.

B. Protocol on sending a Chinese medical team.

North Korea (Mar 15)

Friendship and cooperation agreement between the All-China Journalists' Association and the Korean Journalists' Association. XNA, Mar 15, 1982

Soviet Union (Mar 15?)

Minutes of the 24th meeting of the Sino-Soviet Joint Commission for Boundary Rivers Navigation.

Syria (Mar 16)

A. Five-year trade agreement. It stipulates that both sides provide preferential treatment.

B. Protocol on the cancellation of the payment agreement signed on 21 February 1963. It stipulates that payment of trade between the two countries should be made with convertible currency system. The two countries previously used a charge account system.

Great Britain (Mar 18?)

Additional agreement on civil aviation. Under it the British Cathay Pacific Airways will increase passenger carrying capacity by 70 percent on the air route between Shanghai and Hongkong

from May 1 and the Chinese Airline will increase traffic by 70 percent along the some route.

Under the agreement signed by the two sides, the Chinese and British civil aviation enterprises opened the Beijing-London air route and the route between Hongkong and the Mainland. The Hongkong-based Cathay Pacific Airways of Britain is not allowed to operate services between Hongkong and London after it began to operate regular services between Hongkong and Shanghai in 1980. But within one month's operation, the Cathay Pacific Airways began flying to London. Thus the airways should lose its qualification for operating the Shanghai-Hongkong route in line with the agreement. For convenience of people coming and going between Hongkong and the Mainland, and in consideration of the interest of the Cathay Pacific Airways, the Chinese authorities still made temporary arrangements to enable the Cathay Pacific Airways to continue its services on the Shanghai-Hongkong route to April 30 this jear.

Mauritania (Mar 19)

Protocol on sending a new medical team to Mauritania. XNA, mar 19, 1982

Yugoslavia (Mar 20)

Plan for cooperation and technical exchange in sports during 1982. Under the plan, the two countries this year will exchange track and field, judo, basketball, volleyball, diving and chess teams and will launch cooperative training programs in handball and water polo events.

France (Mar 22)

Agreement to exchange film exhibition. Under the agreement, a Chinese film exhibition, including silent films, will be shown in Paris and other departments in France in 1983. Arrangements for the exhibition will be made jointly by the Chinese film-library, the French film-library and the Georges Pompidou National Art and Culture Centre. In addition, an exhibition of 50 Chinese films on the development of Chinese cinema will be shown in Paris in June. An exhibition of French films will be held in Beijing and some provinces in China in the fall of 1983. XNA, Mar 22, 1982

Brazil (Mar 25)

Agreement on scientific and technical cooperation. Under it, the Chinese and Brazilian governments will strengthen cooperation in scientific and technical fields and promote the advancement of sciences and technologies on the basis of the principle of respect for each other's sovereignty and noninterference in each other's internal affairs. The agreement stipulates that scientific and technical cooperation will include exchange of scientific and technical projects, reports, discussions and lectures; and exchanges of scientific and technical data and information, research and experiment results. cording to the agreement, a joint comfor scientific and technical cooperation will be set up for handling matters related to the implementation

of the agreement and supplementary protocols.

U.S.A. (Mar 25)

Agreement for jointly conducting a feasibility study on the development of a coal mine in Northwest China between the China National Coal Development Corporation and the Island Creek Coal Company, a subsidiary of Occidental Petroleum Corporation, U.S.A.

According to the agreement, the Antaibao Surface Coal Mine in the Pingshuo Mine area, Shanxi Province, will be launched as a contractual joint venture with joint commitments of investment and risks. The planned yearly output is 15 mio.t.

Hungary (Mar 26) Goods exchange and payment agreement for 1982. XNA, Mar 26, 1982

Japan (Mar 26)

Exchange of notes on the 1981 Japanese government loan to the Chinese government. In accordance with article eight of the China-Japan joint press communique issued Dec 7, 1979, during former japanese prime minister Masayoshi Ohira's visit to China, the Japanese government agreed their overseas economic cooperation fund would offer a loan to finance construction of Shijiusuo Port, Qinhuangdao Port, the Beijing-Qinhuangdao Railway, the Yanzhou-Shijiusuo Railway, and other projects.

Japan (Mar 29)

Note on a grant by Japan for physical education in China. Unter it Japan will extend a grant of up to fifty million yen (about 380,000 RMB) to the Beijing Institute of Physical Education and the Chinese Judo Association to buy equipment for physical education research and judo.

Philippines (Mar 29)

Agreement on a joint production of a film to be called "The King of Sulu and the Emperor of China" was signed here today. According to the agreement, the screen play will be subject to approval by both parties and that the finsihed film will have only one edition. The speech spoken in the film will be in Chinese and in Filipino. Chinese characters in the film will be played by Chinese, and Philippine characters will be played by Filipinos. XNA, Mar 29, 1982

Egypt (Mar 30?)

Trade protocol for 1982. It provides for Egypt to supply China for the first time with linen, furniture and dye-stuffs in addition to traditional export. Exports of Chinese commodities to Egypt include textiles and machinery

and chemical materials. XNA, Mar 31, 1982

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

Burms

China and Burma on 23rd February exchanged notes concerning the Burma-China agreement of 12 July 1979, under which an interest-free loan of 100,000,000 yuan or 413,000,000 kyat, is to be extended for construction of a bridge on the Rangoon-Syrian railway and highway. The interest-free loan is to be repaid in 23 years, including a grace period of 13 years, Under the terms contained in the notes, the eight projects menditoned in the additional agreement between two governments on economic and technical cooperation signed on 3rd July 1980 are to be replaced by the bridge construction project on the Rangoon-Syrian railway and highway. Fiji

On Taveuni Island in the northern part of Fiji a rattan weaving center is under construction with Chinese aid, as is a bamboo weaving center on Viti Levu Island.

Mauritania

Under a new protocol China will send a 24-member medical team to work in Kiffa and Selibaby. (XNA, Mar 19, 1982)

Nepal

The Hetauda Leather Industries Ltd., situated in Hetauda, a new city some 130 km south of Kathmandu, was inaugurated on March 28. The factoory which processes 500 hides per day, was equipped with a complete set of leather making machines made and installed by China. The installation of the factory was completed in August 1981 in a brief span of one year and trial production in the last seven months proved very well. The factory is also a joint venture between Nepal and West Germany, with the Nepalese government and businessmen investing 55 percent of the capital and a West German company 45 percent. Nigeria

The Chinese-aided Itoikin agricultural project in the Ogun-Oshun river basin was handed over. It is situated about 70 km away from Lagos. (XNA, Mar 29, 1982)

Pakistan

The Hazara urea fertilizer plant in Punjab Province went into trial production. Employing 400 engineers and workers, the plant is designed to manufacture 170 tons of ammonia daily to be converted into 290 tons of urea. (XNA, Mar 28, 1982)

Somalia

The Fanole dam project on the Juba river is under construction with Chinese aid. This is the first key water control project in Somalia for hydropower generation and irrigation on 7,500 ha of farmland and water supply to the local residents. The project has been undertaken by the Chinese since the Soviet experts were driven out of Somalia in 1978. Installation of generating units is underway and about 1,000 ha of land have been reclaimed. Within this year, two generators with a capacity of 4,600 kW are expected to come into operation to supply the local residents with water and electricity. (XNA, Mar 7, 1982)

Tunisia

The Rabat sports facilities which will be the site of the 1983 Mediterranean Sports Meet were designed by Chinese architects. (XNA, Mar 18, 1982)

Upper Volta

A protocol to send a new Chinese medical team was signed on March 13. (XNA, Mar 13, 1982)

Construction abroad

The Beijing based China Construction Engineering corporation has signed 227 contracts worth 240,300,000 US\$ with foreign firms since its inauguration in 1979. The corporation does business with 200 firms and government departments in 30 countries and regions. It has undertaken construction projects in North Yemen, Sudan, Thailand, Hongkong and Macao, providing workers, buying and selling real estate, and processing and manufacturing building materials. It has branches in eight countries and regions, and nine joint

companies, some with overseas Chinese businessmen. The corporation has more than 6,000 Chinese workers abroad. (XNA, Feb 23, 1982)
