AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

- Sep 02 **Kenya**
Programme for the implementation of the 1981-1984 cultural cooperation agreement. Under it China and Kenya will exchange cultural and educational delegations, writers, publishers, journalists, art troupes and sports teams, and offer scholarships for each other.

- Sep 02? **North Korea**
Protocol on border railway transport

- Sep 03 **Japan**
Atomic cooperation agreement. The Japan atomic industrial forum and China's 2nd Ministry of Machine-building signed a two-year atoms-for-peace agreement calling for exchanges of experts and engineers; participation in nuclear seminars and conferences; and technological exchanges in nuclear-related fields. China is preparing to construct a 300,000 kW capacity atomic power station and Japan will probably extend technological cooperation for this, according to the forum.

- Sep 05 **U.S.A.**
Cultural exchange program for 1982-1983. It includes exchanges in the fields of art, education, journalism, broadcasting, television, libraries, archives, translation, publications, sports and social sciences. It stipulated that the two governments would encourage and promote the expansion of non-governmental cultural exchanges.

- Sep 07 **Mali**
Cultural agreement. The five-year agreement stipulates that the two countries will further enhance exchanges and cooperation in the fields of culture, education, science, public health, sports, publications, press and broadcasting. The contents provide for the exchange of visits by writers, artists, troupes, sportsmen, teachers and scholars, mutual translation and publication of outstanding literary and art works and mutual granting of scholarships.

- Sep 08 **Belgium**
Cultural cooperation program for 1982-1983. Under it the two countries will strengthen cooperation and exchanges in the fields of education, science, public health, cultural arts, and sports; exchange cultural delegations, artists, sportsmen and scientists, mutually provide scholarships; exchange professors to give lectures and conferences, and continue to encourage the direct establishment of cooperation among universities, music groups and broadcast and television institutions. Under the program, China will sponsor an exhibition of Chinese treasures in Belgium in 1982.

- Sep 14 **United Nations**
Convention on prohibitions or restrictions on the use of certain conventional weapons which may be deemed to be excessively injurious or to have indiscriminate effects.
After signing the convention the Chinese representative handed over a written statement. The statement
- says: "The government of the People's Republic of China deems that the basic spirit of the convention reflects the reasonable demand and good intention of numerous countries and peoples of the world regarding prohibitions or restrictions on the use of certain conventional weapons which are excessively injurious or have indiscriminate effects. This basic spirit conforms to China's consistent position and serves the interest of opposing aggression and maintaining peace. However, the convention fails to provide for supervision or verification of any violation of its clauses, thus weakening its binding force. The protocol on prohibitions or restrictions on the use of mines, booby traps and other devices fails to lay down strict restrictions on the use of such weapons by the aggressor on the territory of his victim and to provide adequately for the right of a state victim of an aggression to defend itself by all necessary means. The protocol on prohibitions or restrictions on the use of incendiary weapons does not stipulate restrictions on the use of such weapons against combat personnel. The Chinese texts of the convention and protocols are not accurate or satisfactory enough. It is the hope of the Chinese government that these inadequacies can be remedied in due course."

Protocol on the 23rd session of the Sino-Czechoslovak Joint Commission for Scientific and Technical Cooperation

- Sep 18 **Zimbabwe**
Protocol on economic and technical cooperation relating to the construction of a stadium with 60,000 seats in Salisbury

- Sep 22 **Federal Republic of Germany**
Agreement on railway cooperation. According to it, on the basis of equality and mutual benefit, the two sides will exchange railway information, periodicals and reference materials and give specialized support in modernization. Railway engineers, technicians, managerial experts and other specialists will make study tours, advisory and investigative exchange and attend special meetings. There will also be cooperative research on projects of mutual interest and exchange of research results and experiences.

Protocol on economic cooperation. The protocol said that particular attention should be given to agriculture, the construction industry, the forest products industry, light industry, transportation, mining, the power industry and petroleum exploration.

- Sep 27 **Togo**
Cultural agreement. The contracting parties agree, under the principle of equality and mutual benefit, to develop cooperation and exchanges in the fields of culture, education, public health, sports, pub-

lishing, the press, broadcasting, film and television service. The agreement is valid for five years. XNA, Sep 27, 1981

Sep 29 Federal Republic of Germany

Agreement on scientific cooperation between the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the Max Planck Society. In the spirit of mutual equality and bene-

fit, the two sides agreed to further promotion of cooperation on the basis of the 1978 scientific cooperation agreement, cooperation in basic research in particular. Both sides said that they would strengthen their direct cooperation between research institutes and scientists. The agreement will become effective January 1, 1982, and will be valid for three years. XNA, Sep 29, 1981

Known Cadres on New Posts

An Lin 安林

Appointed vice-mayor of Beijing in Aug 1981 (XNA, Sep 14, 1981)

In June 1981 An was identified as member of the Standing Committee of Beijing Municipality CP.

Chen Tan 陈垣

Appointed president of the Higher Railway Transport Court (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)

In 1959 Chen held the post of director of the General Administration under the Railway Ministry.

Chen Xitong 陈希同

Identified as secretary of the Beijing Municipality CP (Beijing Radio, Sep 5, 1981)

Chen was elected vice-mayor of Beijing in Dec 1979.

Gu Jingsheng 谷景生

Identified as 2nd secretary of the Xinjiang Autonomous Region CP (Urumqi Radio, Sep 4, 1981)

Gu is a major-general of the PLA. Before the Cultural Revolution he was director of the Mass Work Department under the PLA General Political Department. Reactivated in 1978 he became deputy political commissar of the Guangzhou Military Region in Jan 1980 (until mid-1981).

Han Liping 韩力平

Identified as vice-minister of railways (XNA, Sep 7, 1981)

In 1973 Han was identified as director of the Bureau of Foreign Affairs under the Ministry of Communications. In 1978 he was identified in the same position under the Ministry of Railways.

Han Mingzeng 韩明曾

Appointed president of the Transport Tribunal under the Supreme People's Court (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)

In 1962 Han was identified as a judge of the Supreme People's Court.

Jiang Wen 江文

Appointed deputy chief procurator of the Supreme People's Procuratorate (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)

In 1979 Jiang was identified as director of the Communications Department of the PLA General Staff. In Sep 1980 he was appointed procurator of the Special Procuratorate for the Trial of Lin Biao and the Jiang Qing Counter-revolutionary Cliques.

Jin Shuwang 金树望

Appointed vice-minister of the State Organizational Commission (XNA, Sep 17, 1981)

Before the Cultural Revolution Jin was deputy director of the State Personnel Bureau. He was reactivated only now.

Li Menghua 李梦华

Appointed minister of the Commission for Physical Culture and Sports (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)

Li was a vice-minister of this commission before.

Lin Hua

Appointed vice-minister of the State Planning Commission (XNA, Sep 17, 1981)

In 1979 Lin was identified as director of 2nd Bureau under the State Scientific and Technological Commission.

Liu Jianzhang 刘建章

Appointed minister of railways (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)

Liu was a vice-minister of this ministry before (since 1975), a position he already held before the Cultural Revolution.

Liu Jiping 刘季平

Appointed vice-minister of culture (XNA, Sep 17, 1981)

Before the Cultural Revolution Liu was secretary of the

Shandong Province CP. Reactivated in 1973 he became curator of the Beijing Library in 1978, a post he possibly still holds. One year later he was elected president of the Society of Libraries.

Liu Qing 刘清

Identified as vice-minister of the 6th Ministry of Machine Building (XNA, Sep 16, 1981)
Before the Cultural Revolution Liu was a member of the China Machinery Import and Export Corporation and became its manager general after his reactivation in 1973. In 1980 he was identified as vice-chairman of the International United Shipping and Investment Corporation and in April 1981 managing director of the China Corporation of Shipbuilding Industry.

Liu Shutian

Identified as vice-minister of water conservancy (Beijing Review, Sep 1, 1981)
Liu is secretary of the Party Committee of the Bureau for the Gezhouba project.

Lu Xuzhang 卢绪章

Appointed vice-minister of the Foreign Investment Commission (XNA, Sep 17, 1981)
A vice-minister of foreign trade before the Cultural Revolution, Lu was reactivated in 1976 to become director of the International Travel Service two years later. In July 1981 he was identified as vice-minister of the Administrative Commission on Import and Export Affairs.

Mo Wenhua 莫文华

Identified as political commissar of the PLA Armored Forces (XNA, Sep 26, 1981)
Mo is a lieutenant-general of the PLA. Deriving from the New 4th Army he was commandant of the PLA Military College before the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1974 he has since held military posts, possibly with the PLA Engineering Corps.

Mo Wenxiang 莫文祥

Appointed minister of the 3rd Ministry of Machine Building (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)

Identified as secretary of Sichuan Province CP (XNA, Sep 2, 1981)
Tian was elected vice-governor of Sichuan in March 1981 (see C.a 1981/3).

Tian Yinong 田一龙

Identified as vice-minister of finance (XNA, Sep 23, 1981)

Tian became known when he was elected member of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission in May 1979.

Wang Defang

Identified as vice-minister of the State Energy Commission (XNA, Sep 15, 1981)
Wang was a deputy director of the Shanghai Electricity Control Office in 1959 and reactivated only now.

Wang Kunlun 王昆仑

Elected chairman of the Revolutionary Committee of the Chinese Kuomintang (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)
Wang was a vice-chairman before.

Wu Wentao 吴文涛

Appointed director of the Foreign Languages Publishing and Distribution Administration (XNA, Sep 17, 1981)
Before the Cultural Revolution Wu was a member of the Commission for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries and a deputy for Hubei from the 1st through 3rd NPC.

Xiang Chunyi 项淳一

Appointed vice-chairman of the NPC Legal Commission (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)
Xiang was a member and deputy secretary-general of that commission before.

Yang Yimu 杨一木

Appointed director of the State Bureau of Complete Sets of Machinery and Equipment (XNA, Sep 17, 1981)
A vice-governor of Gansu Province before the Cultural Revolution, Yang was elected vice-chairman of the Gansu Revolutionary Committee in 1977, a post he held until Jan 1980.

Zhao Chongde 赵重德

Identified as vice-minister of foreign trade (XNA, Sep 28, 1981)
In 1964 and 1965 Zhao led trade delegations to Poland. In 1971 he was identified as director of a bureau under the Ministry of Foreign Trade. He disappeared thereafter to be reactivated now.

Zheng Tuobin 郑拓彬

Appointed minister of foreign trade (XNA, Sep 10, 1981)
Zheng was a vice-minister of this ministry since 1978.

Zheng Xiwen 郑希文

Identified as vice-minister of justice (XNA, Sep 15, 1981)
Zheng possibly is identical with a former deputy director of the Political Department of Beijing Military Region.

Zhong Qiuyuan

Appointed vice-minister of culture (XNA, Sep 17, 1981)
Zhong became known two months ago when he was referred to as a member of the Central Patriotic Sanitation Campaign Committee.
