

10	HONG KONG	Agreement for a second direct passenger train service between Guangzhou and Hong Kong. The new express service will begin on February 1 (2)
18	SRI LANKA	Agreement on economic and technical cooperation. Under the agreement, China is to provide Sri Lanka with an interest-free loan of RMB 50 million Yuan within a period of seven years. The Chinese loan will be provided in the form of assisting Sri Lanka in building complete projects, providing it with individual equipment and conducting technical cooperation (3)
19	JAPAN	Agreement on the reclamation of virgin land in Northeast China between the Chinese Ministry of State Farms and Land Reclamation and the Japanese Nichimen Co. Ltd. on a compensation trade basis. According to the agreement, the Japanese firm will offer two loans to China. The first loan, amounting to 13.5 million US dollars within the fixed time, and interest, will be paid back by China in soybeans to be produced on the reclaim- ed land. Problems related to the second loan will be discussed and resolved by the two sides later. The loans will be used to buy up-to-date machinery and introduce technical know-how. The joint reclamation programme includes the creation of a modern farm covering an area of 20,000 hectares. The farm, with soybeans and wheat as its main crops, will commence production in 1981. The second Chinese medical team left for home and the third will arrive in the near future (XNA Jan 31, 1980).

CONGO, Republic of

The Chinese government is to provide equipment and technicians to transform the Chacona boat-building yard into one capable of building both wooden and steel boats (XNA Jan 2, 1980).

MAURITANIA

The foundation-stonelaying ceremony for the Chineseaided Nouakchott Olympic Stadium took place on January 23. The stadium covers an area of 18 hectares. It will have 19,412 square meters of floor space and a seating capacity of 10,000 (XNA Jan 23, 1980).

MOZAMBIQUE

The Chinese medical team left for home on January 26 after having worked in hospitals in Tete and Manica Provinces for more than a year. It had treated 118,448 sick and wounded (XNA Jan 26, 1980).

SRI LANKA

China will lend Sri Lanka 500,000,000 rupees for projects including water supply and urban development (Colombo Radio Jan 19, 1980). The loan is interest-free (XNA Jan 18, 1980).

YEMEN, Arab Republic

China will send another 51 medical workers to work in Hodeida General Hospital under a supplementary protocol signed in Sanaa on January 29. The protocol envisages raising the number of Chinese medical personnel to 116.

Under a contract signed on January 22 between the Chinese National Complete Plant Exporting Corporation and the Yemeni Agriculture Ministry, eleven Chinese agrotechnicians will come to Yemen.

27 Chinese textile technicians arrived in Sanaa on January 29, in accordance with a contract rendering technical service to Yemen signed in December 1979 (XNA Jan 29, 1980).

Known Cadres on New Posts

P4、 日月 CHEN MING

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20,1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Chen had been a cadre in the Ministry of Foreign Trade to become commercial counsellor in Paris in 1964. He disappeared in 1966 and was not reactivated until now.

陈铁 CHEN TIE

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Chen, a former KMT general, had been on the same post between 1963 and the Cultural Revolution. He was reactivated now.

丁载孔 DING YIMIN

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Government of Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980).

Ding, who belongs to the Hui minotiry, had been vice-chairman of Ningxia Revolutionary Committee before.

HAN NINGFU 卓宁夫

Elected governor of Hubei Province (Wuhan Radio Jan 18, 1980).

Han had been vice-chairman of the Hubei Revolutionary Committee before. He also holds the post of a secretary of Hubei CP.

HUA YUQING 详 次昰 卿 Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20, 1980).

A vice-mayor of Wuhan Municipality before the Cultural Revolution, Hua was reactivated in 1978 and became one of the directors in the Board of Directors of the China International Trust and Investment Corporation and vice-chairman of the Federation of Industrialists and Businessmen in October 1979.

HUANG ZHIZHEN 黄知真

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20,1980)

Huang, who is a member of the CCP's 11th Central Committee and a secretary of Hubei CP, had been vice-chairman of the Hubei Revolutionary Committee before.

JIA QINGLI

Identified as vice-minister of chemical industry (XNA Jan 30, 1980).

In 1963 Jia was identified as deputy director of the Lanzhou oil refinery.

余 JIN MING

BA

Identified as first secretary of the Hebei Provincial CP (XNA Jan 25, 1980).

Jin, a vice-minister of finance from 1953 until 1961 and secretary of the Central-South Bureau of the CCP Central Committee after 1961, disappeared in 1966. Reactivated in 1978, he was appointed secretary-general of the State Council in April, and member of the State Financial and Economic Commission in July 1979.

LI ERZHONG 李尔重

Identified as secretary of the Hebei Provincial CP (XNA Jan 25, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Li had been secretary of the Wuhan Municipal CP. Reactivated in 1975, he was a cadre in Guangdong Province until autumn 1977 to become a secretary of the Shaanxi Provincial CP and vice-chairm^{an of} Shaanxi Revolutionary Committee afterwards. He held those posts until December 1979.

LI FUQUAN 李夫全

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20, 1980).

Li had been vice-chairman of the Hubei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

李力 LILI

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Government of the Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980). Li became known as chairman of the Revolutionary Committee of the National Institute of Minorities in 1974.

李庶民 LISHUMIN

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Government of the Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980).

Li became known when he was appointed a member of the National Games Organizing Committee in July 1979.

LITINGGUI 李庭桂

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Li had been vice-chairman of the Guizhou Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

LI YUNHE 奎 挥和

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Government of the Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980). Li had been a Xinjiang cadre before and it was in that Region that he climbed up in the Communist Party to become a deputy secretary of the Xinjiang CP in 1977.

LIANG BUTING 梁光庭

Identified as first secretary of the Qinghai Provincial CP (XINING Radio Jan 7, 1980).

Liang was a cadre in the youth organization and later on, in the trade unions before the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in May 1979 he was identified as second secretary of the Qinghai CP four months later.

LIN SHAONAN (f) 林小南

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20, 1980).

Lin had been vice-chairman of the Hubei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before. She is the widow of Zhang Tixue, at one time governor of Hubei Province, who died on Sep 3, 1973.

MAQINGNIAN

马青年 Elected chairman of the People's Congress of the Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Ma had been vice-governor of Gansu Province. Reactivated in February 1978, he was elected vice-chairman of the 5th CPPCC one month later.

马腾雷 MA TENG'AI

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Government of the Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980). ^{Ma} had been on the same post between 1958 and the Cultural Revolution. He was not reactivated until now.

5 位 MA XIN

Elected chairman of the People's Government of the Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980).

Ma had been vice-chairman of the Ningxia Autonomous Region's Revolutionary Committee before.

QIN JIWEI 秦 基 伟

Identified as commander of the Beijing Military Region (RMRB Jan 23, 1980).

Qin is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and had been first political commissar of the Beijing Military Region since November 1978 until he was given the command of the Region. Before the Cultural Revolution, Qin had been commander of the Kunming Military Region, After his reactivation in 1973 he became commander of the Chengdu Military Region in 1974, a post he held until 1975.

RAN YANNONG 冉 硯 次

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Ran had been vice-chairman of the Guizhou Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

石川 SHI CHUAN

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20, 1980).


Elected governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Tan had been governor of Shandong Province (1958-1963) and first secretary of the Shandong Provincial CP (1961-1966). He also was an alternate member of the 8th Central Committee of the CCP. He survived the Cultural Revolution unharmed and became secretary of the Fujian Provincial CP in 1971. Two years later he was transferred to Zhejiang to become first secretary of the Provincial CP in June 1973. In spring 1977 he was ordered to Qinghai Province where he was made first CP



secretary, a post he held until December 1979.

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20, 1980).

Tian had been vice-chairman of the Hubei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

WANG BINGYUN 王秉鋆

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Wang, who belongs to the Buyi minority, was first identified in May 1979 when he was appointed member of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission,

WANG HANZHANG 王汉章

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20, 1980).

Wang had been vice-chairman of the Hubei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

WANG ZHAOWEN 王朝文

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Wang had been vice-chairman of the Guizhou Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

WANG ZHENJIANG 王振江

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Wang had been vice-chairman of the Guizhou Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.



Elected vice-chairman of the People's Government of the Ningxia Autonomous Region (XNA Jan 16, 1980). Xia became known when she was elected deputy for Ningxia to the 3rd National People's Congress in 1964. She was not reactivated until now.



Identified as commander of the Chengdu Military Region (Chengdu Radio Jan 25, 1980).

You has been a member of the CCP Central Committee since the 10th Party Congress in 1973. Since then he had been commander of the Inner Mongolia Military District. In 1975 he was identified as deputy commander of the Beijing Military Region.

Identified as secretary of Jilin Provincial CP (Changchun Radio Jan 23, 1980).

Yu had been deputy secretary of the Jilin Provincial CP before.

F YU LIN

Identified as secretary of the Jilin Provincial CP (Changchun Radio Jan 23, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Yu had been a party cadre of Heilongjiang Province and of the Northeast Bureau of the CCP Central Committee. He was not reactivated until now.

ZHANG JINXIAN 张进生

Elected vice-governor of Hubei Province (XNA Jan 20 1980).

Zhang had been vice-chairman of the Hubei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

张世 E ZHANG SHIJUN

Identified as vice-minister of forestry (Harbin Radio Jan 7, 1980).

Zhang had been on the same post before the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1978, he had been a vice-chairman of the Heilongjiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee before his recent appointment as vice-minister of forestry,

ZHANG XINZHU 张修竹

Identified as vice-minister of state farms and land reclamation (XNA Jan 19, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Zhang had been deputy director of the State Staff Office for Agriculture and Forestry.

ZHANG YUHUAN 张王 理

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Zhang became known when he was identified as a member of the Standing Committee of the Guizhou Provincial CP in 1974.

ZHANG YUQIN (f) 张玉芹

Elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province (XNA Jan 24, 1980).

Zhang had been vice-chairman of the Guizhou Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

ZHUANG XIQUAN 庄希皇

Identified as vice-minister of the State Overseas Chinese Affairs Commission (XNA Jan 14, 1980).

Zhuang is a member of the NPC Standing Committee (since 1965). Since December 1978 he has also held the post of chairman of the Federation of Returned Overseas Chinese.
