## China's Economic Aid

February 1980

### GHANA

In Afife, some 160 kilometres east of Accra, a Chinese-aided irrigation and rice cultivation project is under construction. When completed it will irrigate some 800 hectares of land (XNA Feb 10, 1980).

### GUYANA

In Sanata a Chinese-aided textile mill is under construction. Construction started in mid-1976. Upon completion, the mill will be capable of producing a total of 6 million metres of bleached, dyed and printed goods per year out of locally available cotton (XNA Feb 20, 1980).

### SRI LANKA

A six-member team of Chinese experts will arrive to advise

the government on setting up a number of mini hydroelectric plants (Colombo Radio Feb 6, 1980).

### ZAMBIA

The whole Zambian section of the Tan-Zam Railway formally resumed traffic on February 7, following the reconstruction of the Chambesi bridge and the repair of the Lunsemfwa bridge. Both bridges were blown up in October and November last year (XNA Feb 7, 1980).

### Known Cadres on New Posts

BO YIBO 薄一波

Appointed minister of the State Machine-Building Commission (XNA Feb 12, 1980).

Bo is a member of the CCP's 11th Central Committee and vice-premier of the State Council. The new appointment brings additional power and influence to one of Deng Xiaoping's oldest followers and a specialist in economic affairs (Bo was chairman of the State Economic Commission from 1956 until the Cultural Revolution).

CHEN BEICHEN 陈北辰

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Chen had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Revolutionary Committee before.

CHEN GUODONG 陈国栋

Identified as 2nd secretary of the Shanghai Municipal CP (Shanghai Radio Feb 2, 1980).

Chen is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP. From March 1978 until March 1979 he had been chairman of the Supply and Marketing Cooperatives to become minister of food three months later.

CHEN PURU 陈璞如

Elected governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Chen is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and has also been secretary of the Liaoning CP since March 1977.

GAO YANGWEN 高扬文

Appointed minister of coal industry (XNA Feb 12, 1980).

Before his present appointment, Gao had been vice-

minister of metallurgical industry (since September 1978), a post he had also held before the Cultural Revolution.

GU MING 顾明

Identified as vice-minister of the State Investment Commission (XNA Feb 9, 1980).

Since 1972 Gu has also been vice-minister of the State Planning Commission. Before the Cultural Revolution he was vice-chairman of the State Capital Construction Commission.

GUAN SHANFU 关山复

Appointed chief procurator, Supreme People's Procuratorate (XNA Feb 12, 1980).

Guan, who belongs to the Manchu minority, had been secretary of Jilin Province and director of the Propaganda Department of the North East Bureau under the CCP Central Committee before the Cultural Revolution. Re-activated in 1977 he became a member of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission in May 1979.

GUO LINXIANG 郭林祥

Identified as first political commissar of the Nanjing Military Region (Nanjing Radio Feb 13, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Guo had been political commissar of the Chengdu Military Region. Reactivated in 1973 he became political commissar of the PLA General Logistics Department the following year, and political commissar of Xinjiang Military Region in 1975. He retained the latter post until the fall of 1979.

GUO ZHI 郭志

Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).

Guo had been vice-chairman of the Hebei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before. Since November 1978 he has also been secretary of the Hebei Provincial CP.

HAN QIMIN (f) (see next page)

HAN QIMIN (f) 韩启民  
Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).  
Han had been deputy for Hebei Province to the 3rd National People's Congress.

HAN XIANCHU 韩先楚  
Identified as a member of the Standing Committee, Military Commission under the CCP Central Committee (XNA Feb 15, 1980).  
Han has been a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1969. In January 1974 he became commander of the Lanzhou Military Region. It is not clear whether or not he still holds that post.

HONG YI 洪毅  
Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).  
Hong had been vice-chairman of the Hebei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

HU YIMIN 胡亦民  
Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).  
Hu had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee before. Since June 1973 he has also been secretary of the Liaoning Provincial CP.

HUANG OUDONG 黄欧东  
Elected chairman of the Standing Committee, Liaoning Provincial People's Congress (XNA Feb 3, 1980).  
Huang is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP. Before the Cultural Revolution he had been governor and 2nd CP secretary of Liaoning Province. In December 1978 he was again made 2nd CP secretary in Liaoning Province.

JI PENGFEI 姬鹏飞  
Appointed secretary-general of the State Council (XNA Feb 12, 1980).  
Ji is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and director of its International Liaison Department. He is also a vice-premier of the State Council. In his new position he will coordinate the Government's work.

JIA QINGLI  
Identified as vice-minister of chemical industry (XNA Jan 30, 1980).  
In 1963 Jia was identified as deputy director of the Lanzhou oil refinery.

JIANG SHENGJIE 姜圣阶  
Identified as vice-minister of the 2nd Ministry of Machine Building (XNA Feb 23, 1980).  
Jiang became known in 1972 when he was deputy director of the Institute of Atomic Energy, Academy of

Sciences. In that capacity he visited France as a member of a study group for the peaceful use of atomic energy. He disappeared in 1977 and was reactivated now.

JIANG YIZHEN 江一真  
Elected chairman of the Standing Committee, Hebei Provincial People's Congress (XNA Feb 9, 1980).  
Before the Cultural Revolution Jiang had been governor of Fujian Province (until 1959), vice-minister of state farms and land reclamation (1962-63) and vice-minister of agriculture (1964-66). Reactivated in 1974 he became minister of public health in 1977, a post he held until April 1979. The following month he was identified as 2nd CP secretary and vice-chairman of the Hebei Provincial Revolutionary Committee.

JIAO LINYI 焦林义  
Identified as secretary of Hunan Provincial CP (Changsha Radio Feb 5, 1980).  
Jiao is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP. Before and after the Cultural Revolution he had been 1st secretary of the Guangzhou Municipal CP. In 1975 he also became secretary of Guangdong Provincial CP, a post he held until the fall of 1979.

LAN KAIMIN 兰凯民  
Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).  
Lan had been vice-chairman of the Hebei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

LI ERZHONG 李尔重  
Elected governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 6, 1980).  
In January 1980 Li was identified as secretary of the Hebei Provincial CP (see C.a. 1980/1).

LI FENG 李锋  
Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).  
Li was identified as deputy secretary-general of Hebei Provincial CP in 1958.

LI WENQING 李文清  
Identified as deputy commander of the Chengdu Military Region (Chengdu Radio Feb 9, 1980).  
Li, a PLA major-general, held the same post until the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1976 he was identified as a military cadre of the Chengdu Military Region and it may be assumed that he has held his present post since that time.

LI ZICHAO 李子超  
Identified as secretary of Shandong Provincial CP (Jinan Radio Feb 3, 1980).  
Li had been a member of the Standing Committee of the Shandong Provincial CP before he was given his present appointment.

LIAO HANSHENG 廖 汉 生

Identified as first political commissar of the Shenyang Military Region (Shenyang Radio Feb 1, 1980).

Liao, who is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and a PLA lieutenant-general, held the same position in the Nanjing Military Region before.

LIN HUJIA 林 宇 加

Identified as first political commissar of the Beijing Military Region and of Beijing Garrison (RMRB Feb 1, 1980).

Lin is also first secretary of the Beijing Municipal CP (since October 1978) and mayor of the Beijing Municipality (since December 1979).

MA HUI 马 辉

Elected vice-chairman of the Standing Committee, Hebei Provincial People's Congress (XNA Feb 9, 1980).

Ma is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and a PLA major-general. Since 1964 he has been commander of the Hebei Military District which makes him the oldest military district commander in the People's Republic of China.

RAO SHOUKUN 饶 守 坤

Identified as commander of the Jinan Military Region (Jinan Radio Feb 12, 1980).

Rao is a vice-admiral of the PLA's Navy. Before the Cultural Revolution he was deputy commander of the East China Sea Fleet of the PLA Navy. Reactivated in 1979 he was then made commander of the North China Sea Fleet, a post he retained until now.

RU FUYI 茹 夫 一

Identified as deputy commander of the Chengdu Military Region (Chengdu Radio Feb 9, 1980).

In 1960 Ru was identified as chief of staff of the Chengdu Military Region. Reactivated in 1977, he was vice-chairman of the Sichuan Provincial Revolutionary Committee from December 1977 until December 1979.

SHI HUAIBI 史 怀 璧

Identified as vice-minister of civil affairs (XNA Feb 16, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Shi had been vice-governor of Yunnan Province. Reactivated in 1973 he became vice-chairman of the Shanxi Provincial Revolutionary Committee in 1977, a post he held until the fall of 1979.

TAN LIREN 谈 立 人

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Tan had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

WANG DONGNING 王 东 宁

Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).

Wang had been on the same post from 1964 until the Cultural Revolution. He was not reactivated until now.

WANG GUANGZHONG 王 光 中

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Wang had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

WANG JIYUAN 王 纪 元

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Wang had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

WANG PING 王 平

Identified as a member of the Standing Committee, Military Commission under the CCP Central Committee (XNA Feb 15, 1980).

Wang is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and a colonel-general of the PLA. Since 1978 he has been political commissar of the PLA General Logistics Department and deputy director of the All-Army Physical Culture Guidance Committee.

WU KEHUA 吴 克 华

Identified as commander of the Guangzhou Military Region (Guangzhou Radio Feb 6, 1980).

Wu is an alternate member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and a lieutenant-general of the PLA. Before the Cultural Revolution he commanded the PLA Artillery. Reactivated in 1974 he was first commander of the Chengdu Military Region (Oct 1977 to March 1979) and then commander of the Xinjiang Military Region (April 1974 to fall 1979).

XIAO QUANFU 肖 全 夫

Identified as commander of the Xinjiang Military Region (Ürümqi Radio Feb 2, 1980).

Xiao, a PLA mayor-general, had been deputy commander of the Shenyang Military Region from 1975 until January 1980.

XIE HUANGTIAN 谢 荒 田

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Xie had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

YANG DEZHI 杨 得 志

Identified as a member of the Standing Committee, Military Commission under the CCP Central Committee (XNA Feb 15, 1980).

Yang is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP. His last military appointment was that of commander of the Kunming Military Region (February 1979 until February 1980).

YE FEI 叶飞

Identified as commander of the PLA Navy XNA Feb 19, 1980).

Ye is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and a PLA colonel-general. Before the Cultural Revolution he had been first secretary of the Fujian Provincial CP. Reactivated in 1973 he was minister of communications from 1975 until February 1979. The following month saw him as first secretary of the PLA Navy's Party Committee.

YUE ZONGTAI 岳宗泰

Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).

Yue had been vice-chairman of the Hebei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

ZHANG CAIQIAN 张才千

Identified as commander of the Wuhan Military Region (Wuhan Radio Feb 2, 1980).

Zhang is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and a PLA lieutenant-general. From 1969 until 1970 he was deputy commander of the Nanjing Military Region until he was made deputy chief of staff of the PLA in 1971, a post he held until now.

ZHANG JINGFU 张劲夫

Identified as second secretary of the Anhui Provincial CP (Hefei Radio Feb 12, 1980).

Zhang was elected governor of Anhui Province in December 1979 (for further details see p.1338 in C.a.1979/12).

ZHANG KERANG 张克让

Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA Feb 9, 1980).

Zhang had been vice-chairman of the Hebei Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

ZHANG SHUDE 张树德

Identified as secretary of Henan Provincial CP (Zhengzhou Radio Feb 7, 1980).

Zhang had been secretary of the Liaoning Provincial CP before (since October 1977).

ZHANG TIEJIN

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Zhang became known in July 1978 as a member of the Standing Committee of the Liaoning Provincial CP.

ZHANG ZHIXIU 张锺秀

Identified as commander of Kunming Military Region (XNA Feb 9, 1980).

Zhang is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP and a PLA major-general. He had been deputy commander in the same military region before (since October 1975).

ZHANG ZHIYUAN 张知远

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Zhang had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

ZHAO QI 赵奇

Elected vice-governor of Liaoning Province (XNA Feb 3, 1980).

Zhao had been vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee before.

ZHAO XINCHU 赵辛初

Appointed minister of food (XNA Feb 12, 1980).

Zhao is a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP. From 1957 until 1964 he had been secretary of the Hubei Provincial CP and vice-minister of culture from 1965 until the Cultural Revolution. He was reactivated as secretary of the Hubei Provincial CP in 1973 and became its first secretary in May 1975 (until August 1978). In October 1978 he was identified as vice-minister of the State Planning Commission, a position he probably still holds.

ZHU WEIHUA 朱韦华

Identified as secretary of the Shanxi Provincial CP (XNA Feb 10, 1980).

Zhu was identified as a member of the Standing Committee of the Shanxi Provincial CP in 1974 and as vice-chairman of the CPPCC's Shanxi Branch in 1978.
