

February 1 JAPAN Exchange of notes on setting up consulates-general in Sapporo and Guangzhou (1)

MALTA Agreement on cooperation in the field of tourism (1)

Protocol between the Office of the Environmental Protection Leading Group under the Chinese State Council and the US Environmental Protection Agency on scientific and technical cooperation in the field of environmental protection. The Protocol stipulates:

The two parties agree to cooperate with each other in the field of science and technology

of environmental protection, and undertake cooperative activities in the study of the effects of air, water, soil, marine and other environmental pollution on human health and ecological systems, and improvement of urban environment, and preservation of

nature. The protocol will be valid for five years (2).

# China's Economic Aid

### February 1980

### **GHANA**

In Afife, some 160 kilometres east of Accra, a Chinese-aided irrigation and rice cultivation project is under construction. When completed it will irrigate some 800 hectares of land (XNA Feb 10, 1980).

#### GUYANA

In Sanata a Chinese-aided textile mill is under construction. Construction started in mid-1976. Upon completion, the mill will be capable of producing a total of 6 million metres of bleached, dyed and printed goods per year out of locally available cotton (XNA Feb 20, 1980).

#### SRILANKA

A six-member team of Chinese experts will arrive to advise

the government on setting up a number of mini hydroelectric plants (Colombo Radio Feb 6, 1980).

### ZAMBIA

The whole Zambian section of the Tan-Zam Railway formally resumed traffic on February 7, following the reconstruction of the Chambesi bridge and the repair of the Lunsemfwa bridge. Both briges were blown up in October and November last year (XNA Feb 7, 1980).




