AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

Denmark (Apr 02)

The China National Technical Import Corporation has signed a loan contract with the Denmark Dairy Product Equipment Corporation on technical assistance and equipment supply for the building of the No 2 Heilongjiang provincial dairy product plant in Anda county. Under the contract, the Danish government offers a 25-year interest-free loan of 15,000,000 yuan. The plant covers 100,000 sq.m. and will have a daily production capacity of 200 tons of fresh milk. The annual output of these products will be 7,000 tons. The plant is expected to make an annual profit of 11,000,000 yuan. Construction will begin in the second quarter of 1982 and will be completed in 1985. The factory will produce 24.6 tons of milk powder a day. China will also use part of the interest-free loan and export credit offered by the Danish government to buy equipment for a sugar refinery in Jilin Province, a milk bottling company in Beijing and a ceramic factory.

United Nations (Apr 02?)

The World Food Program signed eight agreements with China to provide gratis aid in the form of grain worth 51.57 Mio.US\$ for the fiscal year 1981. The aid will be used for the construction of eight projects. Four of them are in Guangdong, Fujian and Yunnan Provinces and the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region to help raise the living standards of refugees from Indo-China. Forty percent of the aid will go to workers planting shelter-belts in the Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region's Xiji county. The county on the loess highlands will increase its tree coverage from the present three percent to 16 percent of the total land area there. The shelter-belts will also enable the county to increase grain output. The rest of the aid will go to workers in three other projects: a large reservoir in Xinglong state farm on Hainan Island, Guangdong Province; a pumping station to raise Yellow River water diverted for irrigation in Gaolan county, Gansu Province; and a project related to restoring production and strengthening flood-prevention in areas of Hubei Province hit by floods in 1980.

Memorandum of understanding for 1982 sports exchange. According to the memorandum, China will send tennis, diving and ice hockey teams to Canada this year, and Canada will send rhythmic gymnasts, and softball teams and water-skiing and figure-skating coaches to China.

Portugal (Apr 08)

Agreement on cooperation in the fields of culture, science and technology. On the basis of mutual benefit the agreement was aimed at strengthening friendly relations between the two countries and promoting their cooperation in the fields of culture, science, technology, art, education and sports. This agreement will be valid for a period of five years from the date it comes into force.

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

Agricultural Aid

China now provides agricultural aid to 22 developing countries in Asia, Africa, Latin America and Oceania, according to the ministry of agriculture. The ministry is building 32 agricultural projects in these countries, involving more than 200 Chinese agricultural experts, said an official of the foreign affairs department of the ministry. These projects include opening reclamation areas, building of agrotechniques popularization stations, scientific research experimental stations, vegetable, tobacco, veterinary and methane stations, tea plantations, silkworm breeding farms and agrotechniques training centers. The Chinese experts either undertake whole pro-

jects, including surveys, designs, construction, trial production and personnel training, or provide technical services. Since the 1960s, China has been providing agricultural aid to the developing countries. Chinese expert groups have delivered six or seven agricultural aid project to the recipient countries in each of the past four years, while undertaking new projects. They have already begun or will soon begin surveys on new agricultural aid projects in Kenya, Nigeria, Niger, Rwanda, Benin and Barbados. In providing aid to other countries, China places emphasis on agricultural aid. In building each agricultural aid project, Chinese experts also train technicians of the recipient countries to enable them to master techniques and learn managerial skills. In this way, the recipient countries will be able to expand their agricultural production with their own efforts. In the 1970s Chinese experts helped Sierra Leone rebuild eight agrotechniques stations, build five new ones, and reclaim and transform 5,000 acres of farmland. China also undertook 80 agricultural projects in 40 countries, including Tanzania, Zambia, Zaire, Algeria and the Sudan. Most of these projects have been completed. Working in these countries were groups of Chinese agro-technicians, veterinarians, and experts in vegetable, tea and cotton growing and silkworm breeding. (XNA, Apr 28, 1982)

Medical Aid

Chinese medical teams have treated more than 52 million patients in West Asia and Africa in the past 19 years. 34 teams staffed by 1,075 medical workers have been working in West Asia and Africa since 1963. Teams have been sent to 41 countries and regions, rendering both treatment and training to a great number of personnel in the third world. (XNA, Apr 16, 1982)

Burma

The Shwedaung textile mill in Pegu Division was completed and handed over. It occupies an area of 29.7 acres and has 40,000 spindles and 600 looms. It produces polyester cotton blended fabrics and cotton yarn. (XNA, Mar 30, 1982)

Guinea Bissau

A protocol for China to send a medical team to work in Guinea Bissau was signed on April 22, 1982. (XNA, Apr 22, 1982)

Liberia

The ground-breaking ceremony for the construction of a national sports complex took place in Monrovia on April 4th. It will have a seating capacity of 30,000 people when completed. (XNA, Apr 4, 1982)

Nepal

The Hetauda Leather Industries Ltd. was inaugurated on March 28th. The factory which processes 500 hides per day, was equipped with a complete set of leather making machines made and installed by China. The factory is also a joint venture between Nepal and the

Federal Republic of Germany, with the Nepalese government and businessmen investing 55 percent of the capital and a German company 45 percent. (XNA, March 28, 1982)

Somalia

The Chinese Complete Plant Export Corporation succeeded in bidding for the undertaking of a drilling project in the north-west of Somalia. (XNA, Apr 7, 1982)

Sri Lanka

Two specialists from the Aquatic Products Institute in Shanghai left for Sri Lanka to help expand the nation's freshwater fish farming program. Invited under a contract signed last February between the U.N. development program and the state administration of Aquatic Products of China, the specialists will help train technicians to raise Chinese carp, design a fish farming research center and expand the existing experimental fish farming station. Another two specialists from the Institute will join them in Sri Lanka later. They will stay there for a period of seven to 12 months. The program was initiated in 1971 when a group of technicians from the bureau went to Sri Lanka for comprehensive studies of fish farming. Between 1974 and 1978, bureau personnel established an experimental fish farming station in Uda-Walave. Last year the bureau sent specialists to Sri Lanka to pass the experience of artificial propagation of grass carp and big head carp. (XNA, Apr 23, 1982)

Uganda

China has extended a loan of 120,000 pound to the Uganda government for the purchase of spares for the Kibimba Rice Company. (Kampala Radio, Mar 4, 1982; cit. SWB/W 117)

A protocol on the dispatch of a medical team to Zaire by the Chinese government was signed here on April 27th. The protocol stipulates that 30 Chinese medical workers will be sent to work in three hospitals in Zaire for a period of two years. (XNA, Apr 27, 1982)

United Nations

China has undertaken over 70 projects to share its experience and expertise with other developing countries. The project include facilities in China for courses, seminars, conferences and study tours for training in acupuncture, training centers demonstrating fresh water fish-breeding, methane gas generation, small hydro-electric power stations construction, primary cooperative medical service and economic development in the rural areas and sericulture. Also under the U.N. development program, China has provided other developing countries with experts and equipment. (XNA, Apr 16, 1982)

Before the Cultural Revolution Deng was a deputy editor-in-chief of Hongqi. Reactivated in 1975 he became a vice-president of the Academy of Social Sciences in 1978 and deputy director of the General Office under the CCP Central Committee in 1981.

Fu Hao 符浩

Identified as vice-minister of foreign affairs (XNA, April 1, 1982)
Until Jan 1981 Fu held the post of ambassador to Japan.

Lü Zhixian 吕志先

Identified as vice-minister of the Commission for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries (XNA, Apr 10, 1982)
Until Jan 1982 Lü held the post of ambassador to North Korea.

Qiao Shih 乔石

Appointed director of the International Liaison Department under the CCP Central Committee (XNA, Apr 12, 1982)
