## AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

### Finland (Jun 11)

Long-term trade agreement. It will become effective from January 1, 1983 for a period of five years. It will automatically be extended for one year at a time, unless either of the two contracting parties gives a written notice of termination not later than six months before its expiry.

A new border trade agreement for the next fiscal year was signed in Gilgit. It provides for increasing trade contacts between Pakistan's northern frontier areas and Xinjiang Autonomous Region. Under the agreement, goods worth 4,100,000 rupees will be exchanged each way, which reflects an increase of 5% compared to last year.

## CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

### Burundi

The China-aided Mugere hydro-electric station was inaugurated on June 26. The station, more than 20 kilometers south of Bujumbura, is the largest of its kind in Burundi with an installed capacity of 8,000 kilowatt. It will supply two thirds of Bujumbura's power needs and Burundi will no longer depend totally on power imports when the station is put into operation.

### Nepal

China and Nepal signed minutes of talks on restoring the flood-damaged section of the Kathmandu-Kodari highway and reconstructing the friendship bridge over the Sino-Nepalese border river. The Kathmandu-Kodari highway was built in 1976 with China's assistance. 27 kilometers of the road were seriously damaged by flood in July 1981 and the friendship bridge on it washed away.

### Philippines

In cooperation with China the Philippine government is now pursuing a five-year small-scale hydro power development program. By 1985, mini-hydro electric power will provide 40 percent of rural energy demands. Last year six mini-hydro electric power stations were set up, this year 14 projects are under construction. China has contributed to this five-year program. Under an agreement signed between the two countries in 1980, China provides 30 million US\$ in credit to the Philippines. She will also provide 105 power stations with about 500 sets of generators which have a total capacity of 100,000 kilowatts. China also sends engineers and technicians to the Philippines to help construct mini-hydro power stations. The Philippines will manufacture generators and spare parts with Chinese technology. And some Philippine technicians are now in China for management training. (This is China's first aid project in the Philippines)
