 Loan agreement in accordance with the notes exchanged on April 25, 1980. Under it Japan will provide a loan of 50 billion Yen to China in the fiscal year of 1979. It was signed here this afternoon between the Foreign Investment Commission of China and the Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund of Japan.

The loan will be used in the following six projects: the Shijiusuo port construction project; the Qinhuangdao port expansion project; the Wuqiangxi hydro-electric power project; the Yanzhou-Shijiusuo railway construction project; the Beijing-Qinhuangdao railway double-tracking and electrification project and the Hengyang-Guangzhou railway double-tracking and electrification project (XNA Apr 30, 1980).

Japanese government sources said on 16th April that 14,000 million Yen of the loan was for the Wuqiangxi hydro-electric project in Hunan which will produce up to 1,750,000 kWh of electricity; its reservoir would contain 4,300 million cu.m. of water. The bulldozers, cement, dump trucks and other materials needed for the reservoir would be imported from Japan.

Under this agreement the Japanese printing industry has agreed to put up 100,000,000 Yen for a Japanese book composition plant in Shanghai with annual capacity of 100,000 pages. The plant will be completed in May and will start operations in October or November. The Export-Import Bank of Japan is likely to supply the required amount of funds, which will be repaid over 25 years with Japanese Yen. Of the 100,000,000 Yen, half will be spent for the purchase of machinery and equipment from Japan which will be shipped this summer; the remaining half will be set aside for operation.

It included the reclamation of 1,000 hectares of fields, the establishment of an irrigation and drainage pumping station, and the digging of a 194 kilometer long trunk canal and branch canals.

The expansion project of the Ubongo farm implement factory built with Chinese aid has been completed. After the expansion, the factory will increase its yearly output of hand hoes from 180,000 to two million, ploughs from 35,000 to 200,000 and pangas from 200,000 to 300,000.
