**May 02 Finland**

Agreement on cultural cooperation for 1980-1981

**May 04 Pakistan**

Border trade protocol. Under this protocol Pakistan will export dry fruit, cotton textiles, cigarettes, leather products, and medicinal herbs; China will export hardware, tea and electric appliances.

Initialling of a civil air transport agreement. Under this agreement Thai airliners will fly between a point in Thailand and China's Guangzhou and Shanghai, while Chinese airliners will start their service between a point in China and Bangkok and another point in Thailand still to be chosen.

Scientific cooperation agreement for academic and personnel exchanges.

**May 10 Pakistan**

Protocol on scientific and technological cooperation for 1980-1981. It stipulates Chinese assistance to Pakistan in the chemical fertilizers industry, construction technology, agriculture, cement industry and biogas. Pakistan is to provide China with assistance in farming, animal husbandry, fruit-growing and sugar production.

Initialling of an agreement on economic, industrial and technical cooperation.

Scientific cooperation plan for 1980-1982 between the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the Romanian National Coun-

cil for Science and Technology and the Academy of Romania.

May 28 **Japan**

Agreement to promote and expand scientific and technological cooperation. This cooperation may be undertaken in the following forms: Exchanges of scientists and technicians; forums, seminars and other types of discussion to be attended by scientific and technical personnel from both countries; joint research; exchanges of relevant scientific and technological information; and other forms of cooperation agreed upon by the two governments. A China-Japan Committee for Scientific and Technological Cooperation, consisting of representatives from the two governments, is to be established to help advance the objectives of the agreement. This committee will meet in China and Japan alternately. The two governments should support and promote as far as possible scientific and technological cooperation between various groupings, institutions and individuals in the two countries. The two-year accord went into effect upon signature, and will remain valid after the date of expiration if neither party informs the other of its intention to end it six months advance.

May 29 **France**

Oil exploration contracts between the Petroleum Corporation of China and the Société Nationale Elf Aquitaine and Total. The two cooperation contracts cover joint risks and agreement on compensation for losses. The Chinese side undertakes to pay 51 per cent of the total investment and the French firms the remaining 49 per cent. The cost of the operations China has conducted so far in the designated areas will be counted as the Chinese share in the exploration investment. The French firms are to make up the rest in the agreed ratio.

According to the contracts, the term of exploration is four years, and the term of production is 15 years. If no commercial oil discoveries are made, the French firms will get a proportion of oil annually for 15 years.

The contracts stipulate that in the 15 years after commercial production begins, part of the oil will be used to cover operational costs, part will be retained by China and part will go to cover payment for risks of exploration as well as investment in the exploration and development undertaken by both sides with the French side having the right to

buy the remainder of the third part of the oil.

Within 45 days of the contracts becoming effective, the two sides are to set up joint committees of management, technology as well as a joint administrative body in charge of purchases and sub-contracts.

Executive plan on cultural cooperation for 1980-1981. The plan covers mutual studies and exchange visits on culture, education, youth and sport, and exchange of books, radio and television programmes, textbooks and publications on sport and youth.

Contract on oil prospecting and exploitation within the framework of the protocol of December 6, 1979 between the Japanese Oil Public Corporation and the China Oil and Natural Gas Exploration and Exploitation Company for the joint development of undersea oil deposits in Bohai Bay. Under the contract, development will cover about 25,500 sq.m. in the southern and western parts off Bohai Bay and the deeper part of Chengbei oilfield in western Bohai Bay. The Japanese partners will invest 210,000,000 dollars in initial exploration. Japan will cover 49% and China 51% of an estimated development cost of 1,000 million dollars. China will supply Japan for 15 years with 42,5% of the crude oil produced from joint development. Crude oil production is expected to start in 1985 in the southern and western parts of Bohai Bay and in 1982 in the Chengbei oilfield. Officials said oil deposits in the southern and western parts of Bohai bay are estimated at about 110,000,000 kilolitres. Crude supplies to Japan from these deposits are estimated at about 3,000,000 kilolitres a year at peak. Deposits of the Chengbei oilfield are estimated at 3,200,000 kilolitres, with an annual supply of about 90,000 kilolitres anticipated to Japan.

May 29 **USA**

Approving pending export license applications by the US government for items on the munitions list to China. The

items in question include tactical air defence radar sets, transport helicopters, pressure transducers used in testing jet engines, truck tractors, an antenna for an early warning radar set, tactical radio equipment, transport aircraft and passive countermeasure devices.

The U.S. government has also authorized the sale of secure communications equipment for use in the Chinese embassy and consulates in the United States.

The US government also had approved export license applications for certain dualuse technology items and would be submitting them to the coordinating committee. These were for the establishment of facilities in China to assemble certain integrated circuits for civil use and to manufacture commercial transport helicopters. The approval also covered application for the sale of peripheral equipment for use with existing computers in China's petrochemical operations and for the sale of computers for use in metal refining in China.

##### Apr 21 Philippines

Details on the trade protocol. (see C.a. 1980/4, page 341) The Philippines and China signed a four-year commodity exchange agreement whose volume could reach 2,000 million US\$. Under the agreement the Philippines is committed to supply China with 25,000 to 50,000 tons of coconut oil, 50,000 to 100,000 tons of copper concentrates, 50,000 to 100,000 cu.m. of wood, 30,000 to 40,000 cu.m. of plywood, 2,000 to 3,000 tons of PVC resins, 200 to 400 tons of refined glycerine and certain qualities of raw sugar, chrome ore, calcium carbide and television tubes. In exchange, China will supply the Philippines this year with 1,000,000 tons of crude oil, 150,000 tons of gasoline, 2,000 tons of sodium sulphate, 1,200 tons of glacial acetic acid, 350 tons of white mineral oil, 5 tons each of suphonamide and paracetamol and certain qualities of machinery and equipment, minerals and mineral products and chemicals.

##### Apr 24 Japan

Fuji Ltd announced on 24th April that it had reached an overall cooperation agreement with the Peking-based China International Trust and Investment Corporation. The scope of cooperation covered joint ventures, the induction of foreign capital and technology, and fund operation. Under the agreement, Fuji bank will make available its know-how, and introduce its clients to the Chinese corporation in connection with processing trade, leasing business and joint enterprise.

##### Apr 24 Japan

The Industrial Bank of Japan announced that an agreement had been signed earlier in the day in Hongkong with the Bank of China and the Hongkong-based China Resources Company for the establishment of a merchant bank in Hongkong in July.

##### Apr 24 USA

The Bank of China, the US First National Bank of Chicago, the Japanese Kogyo Bank and the Huarun company signed an agreement under which they will pool capital to open the China-Chicago-Kogyo Finance Company, Ltd. The company will be registered in Hongkong. The company will have a capital of 10,000,000 HK\$; the Bank of China, the First National Bank of Chicago and the Kogyo Bank will own 30% of the company's shares, and the Huarun company will control the rest. This finance company is aimed mainly at promoting commerce and investment in the Pacific region and in the shareholder countries - Chins, Japan and the USA. The company will first concentrate its business in the Pacific region and then expand to various parts of the world. It plans to handle and participate in providing consortium loans, to be an agent in selling shares, to provide trade credit and letters of credit, to invest in real estate, to buy and sell foreign exchange, to take deposits and make loans and to provide financial guidance and counselling. The First National Bank of Chicago will appoint (?David Warner), at present director-manager of the First Commercial Bank of Chicago in Singapore, to be the first director-manager of the China-Chicago-Kogyo Finance Company. The Bank of China will assume the chairmanship of its board of directors.

**Apr 25 Japan, Hong Kong**

The Bank of Tokyo has reached basic agreement with the Bank of China and the Hongkong-based Chincheng bank for the creation of a joint bank in Hongkong. The joint bank will be capitalized at 5,000,000 HK\$, of which 50% will be put up by the Bank of Tokyo, 15% by the Bank of China and 35% by Chincheng bank. The general manager of the joint bank will

be a representative from the Bank of Tokyo, and the bank will have three directors each from the Japanese and Chinese sides. The new bank will extend loans to enterprises in China, particularly in southern China covering Guangdong and Fujian Provinces. The bank will underwrite and sell bonds issued by China in the future.

**Burma**

A rubber-ball factory built with Chinese aid in Rangoon was completed. Construction was started in January 1978. During a 3-months trial production beginning December 1979, more than 50,000 balls were produced for use in football, volleyball and basketball games as well as for children.

The Santa textile mill, a part of which was inaugurated in February this year, had an exhibition of its products. On display were grey and plain cotton cloth and prints as well as shirts, pants, school uniforms, bed spreads and table cloths.

A 2,629 metre-long dam reconstructed under Chinese assistance was handed over on May 15. The Markala dam, the biggest conservancy project on the Niger river, was built in 1947 and its reconstruction began in February 1979 under Chinese assistance.

**Pakistan**

Karachi Radio summed up China's aid to Pakistan, as follows:

"China has been providing real, meaningful help and assistance to Pakistan in the economic as well as military fields. In the economic field, China has to date supplied to Pakistan assistance worth 368,000,000 dollars. This aid has been in the form of four grants and one 250,000,000 dollar interest-free credit. China thus set an example for the industrialized countries whose terms of financial credit are so stringent that they become a liability for

the recipient nations at a later stage and a hurdle in their economic progress. The Chinese aid of 368,000,000 dollars does not include the assistance given by China in building the Karakorum highway... China has also come forward to help Pakistan set up a number of important projects in the defence production sector. This has enabled Pakistan in attaining a degree of self-reliance in military needs."

**Senegal**

A foundation-laying ceremony was held at Affiniam village today to start the building of the Bignona dam across the Casamance river in southern Senegal. Comprising a flood inlet and outlet regulator, a Diversion dam and locks among other things, the project will be built jointly by Senegal and China in three and a half years. When completed, it will help exploit 5,600 hectares of land and improve the soil of another 5,880 hectares in the area.

**Sierra Leone**

The third Chinese medical team left here for home today after completing its mission in Sierra Leone. The team came here in October 1977. Since their arrival at Rotifunk, a small town in the southern province, the 14 Chinese medical workers of the team, with the help and cooperation of the local medical workers, treated 246,000 out-patients and 3,000 in-patients in a hospital there, died 3,500 operations and made x-ray examinations for 9,000 patients. Most of the patients came from all parts of the country and some even from Guinea, Liberia and other Western African countries. The work of the third team was taken over by a new medical team which arrived here on April 16.
