

AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

June 2 Great Britain

Cooperation agreement on radio and te-levision between the Central Broad-casting Administration of China and the British Broadcasting Corporation XNA, Jun 2, 1980

June 4 Argentina

Financial agreement with the Bank of China on behalf of the Central Bank of the Republic of Argentina. By the agreement, the Argentine Central Bank grants the PRC a credit line in the amount of 300,000,000 \$, which may be used for purchasing non-traditional products manufactured in the Republic of Argentina. Regarding the terms of this financial credit, the yearly rate of interest will be 7.5%, payable in US\$. The terms of payment vary according to the nature of the goods: capital goods will be financed for a term of up to 8.5 years; durable and semidurable goods for up to three years; the term of payment for industrial plants and so-called turn-key projects will be agreed upon in each case; the term of financing for ships will be up to 10 years; for other manufactured goods the terms vary according to the stipulations of the Central Bank of the Republic of Argentina. This credit should be used within 18 months from the signing of the agreement and the time limit for using it can be exten-ded; also the amount of the credit can be increased. This credit creates the necessary conditions for the Argentine private sector to increase substantially the sale of manufactured products to the PRC Argentine Agency, Jun 7, 1980; cit. SWB/W 1087

June 5 Germany, Fed-Rep.

A contract for technical cooperation and for the purchase of a continuous cold-rolling mill for making 2030 mm strip steel was signed in Shanghai on 5th June by the China National Technical Import Corporation and a financial group represented by Schloemann-Siemag Aktiengesellschaft of West Germany. Members of the financial group include firms in West Germany, USA and Japan. A loan agreement to finance the project

was signed at the same time by representatives of the Bank of China, Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau and the Dresdner Bank of West Germany, and the Banque de Paris et des Pays Bas. The cold-rolling mill will be built at the Baoshan iron and steel complex in Shanghai XNA, Jun 5, 1980

June 5 Romania

Cooperation agreement between the All-China Federation of Supply and Markerederation of Supply and Marketing Cooperatives and the Central Federation of Romanian Consumers' Cooperatives. It stipulates concrete principles and measures for promoting cooperation and coordination in the exchange of goods, experience, specialists and information lists and information XNA, Jun 6, 1980

June 6 Nigeria

Protocol on extension of the service period of the chinese borehole technical team in Nigeria and a "certificate of job completion" were signed here today between China and Nigeria. The latter document marks the formal handing-over to the Nigerian government of the total forty boreholes drilled by chinese technicians in the chad basin developement authority area of the borno state. Cooperation between the two countries may take on the broadest forms, including anything on which specific agreements can be reached such as the drafting of studies and programmes, construction of new industrial plants, and the exchange of licences and technical information and its implementation. These can lead to future agreements between enterprises and corporations and also leave open the possibility - already existent - of banking agreements for financing pertinent programmes

Agreement on scientific and technical cooperation. It covers the exchange of scientific, technical and specialized personnel for studies and perfection studies and an exchange of specialists for the exchange of techniques and expertise. It was also agreed to make joint investigations on subjects of mutual interest, to hold binational conferences and meetings on science and technology, and to exchange scientific data, experimental products and equipment and also improved strains of vegetables. It was also agreed to establish a joint scientific and technical commission having the same characteristics as the joint economic commission. Cooperation agreement between the China Council for Promotion of International Trade and the Sankinkai Association on promoting joint venture enterprises and other trade farms, raising money for joint enterprises, and training technicians and managers XNA, Jun 18, 1980

June 19 Japan

Memorandum on academic exchange between the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences and the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science. On the principle of Protocol on medical cooperation. c) to make stops in the said territory at points on routes specified in the route schedule to the present agreement for the purpose of putting down and taking on international passengers, baggage, cargo and mail.

The agreement also provides that China will operate a round trip air service between a point in China and Bangkok and Thailand will operate a round trip air service between a point in Thailand and Guangzhou. Once signed, the agreement will come into force on the day of exchange of diplomatic notes. It will remain valid unless either contracting party desires to end it XNA, Jun 28, 1980

Botswana

A Chinese medical cooperation team will be sent to Botswana under a protocol signed on 10th June. The protocol says: "With a view to developing friendly cooperation between the two countries in the medical field, the Chinese government agrees to send a medical team to work in Botswana along with the Botswana medical personnel and to exchange experience and learn from each other through medical practice and close cooperation" (XNA, Jun 11, 1980)

Burma

China rendered an interest-free loan of 100,000,000 Renminbi - about 42,000,000 kyat - to Burma (Rangoon Radio, Jun 26, 1980; cit. SWB 6462)

Burundi

The textile complex of Bujumbura, build with Chinese aid, has been inaugurated on May 31

Niger

Water well projects in Northern Niger built with Chinese aid have been completed and handed over recently (XNA, Jun 19, 1980)

Nigeria

A protocol on extension of the service period of the Chinese borehole technical team in Nigeria and a certificate of job completion were signed on 6th June. The latter document marks the formal handing-over to the Nigerian government of the total 40 boreholes drilled by Chinese technicans in the Chad basin development authority area of Bornu State. The Chinese technicians started well-drilling in Nigeria in 1977 (XNA, Jun 6, 1980)

Sierra Leone

The Chinese stadium technical team has completed a one-year assignment in Sierra Leone. It came in April 1979 at the request of the Sierra Leonean government to give technical guidance and train Sierra Leonean technicians on the use of the equipment in the "Siaka Stevens Stadium" built with Chinese aid and to render assistance to Sierra Leone in managing the stadium (XNA, Jun 6, 1980)

Yemen, Arab Republic (North-)

The China Construction Engineering Corporation and the China Road and Bridge Engineering Company have in the past year or more signed contracts with the Yemen Arab Republic for the design and construction of over 20 projects. Up to now, three projects - the construction of a helicopter parking apron in the republican palace, the extension of a roundabout in the northern suburb of San'a and the reconstruction of two roads in San'a have been completed (XNA, Jun 30, 1980)

Yemen, People's Republic (South-)

The foundation stone was laid for the construction of the Chinese-aided Shihr- Sayhout highway in Hadhramaut province. This highway starting from Shihr in the west to Sayhout of Al-Matra province in the east covers a distance of 203 kilometres. It will link with another Chinese-aided 463-kilometre highway of Ain-Mukalla. This highwas runs through four provinces, so it will be a main communication lin in the country (XNA, Jun 23, 1980)
