## AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

- July 1 **Germany, Fed. Rep.**  
The China national Arts and Crafts Import and Export Corporation and Bremen Melchers and Company signed a protocol setting up the China Jewelry Company Ltd., a jointly-financed company in Bremen

Agreement on cultural exchanges. Under the agreement, the two countries will step up cooperation and exchanges in the fields of culture, arts, education, social sciences, radio and television, publications and sports through the exchange of students, delegations and relevant materials
- July 2 **France**  
China and France have signed an industrial cooperation agreement worth some 97,500,000 dollars for the construction in China of Dauphin helicopters, reliable sources here (Peking) said. The French Aerospatiale Company and the Turbomeca from which specialize in making engines will supply helicopters and help China to build a factory in North or North-East China to manufacture the aircraft. The Dauphin helicopter is designed to search for offshore oil
- July 3 **Burma**  
Protocol of the agreement on economic and technical cooperation relating to eight projects to be financed by China with 100 million Yuan under the agreement of economic and technical cooperation signed on July 12, 1979 (XNA, Jul 3, 1980; XNA, Jul 12, 1979). Among the eight projects are a highway bridge linking Rangoon with Syriam across the Rangoon river (XNA, Jul 4, 1980); a yarn-making machine with 40,000 spindles; three rice mills each with a daily milling capacity of 150 tons; the Moulmein city water supply project; a lock and key factory; and 3,000,000 Yuan worth of machinery and tools

- July 4 **Portugal**  
Trade agreement. It stipulates that each contracting party grants the other party most-favoured-nation treatment such as it extends to a third country in trade with regard to import and export customs duties, internal taxes, service charges, the issuance of import and export licenses and the clearance of customs procedures. The contracting parties agreed to set up a joint committee made up of representatives of the two governments to examine the implementation of the trade agreement and study measures to expand bilateral trade (XNA, Jul 4, 1980). Under this agreement Portugal will supply China with paper pulp, chemical products, fertilizers and assistance in the ship building industry (Lisbon Radio, Jul 5, 1980; cit. SWB 6465). The agreement provides for the supply of the same item until 1983, worth 500,000,000 escudos; a third contract for the supply of processed cork, worth 12,000,000 escudos, has also been signed

- Jul 9 **Great Britain, USA**  
Three Chinese cigarette factories and two American tobacco companies and one British have signed agreements to produce cigarettes in China with tobacco supplied by the US and British companies. Canton No 2 cigarette factory and the Philip Morris Asia Incorporated have entered into an agreement to make "L and M" filter tipped king-size cigarettes. The Xiamen construction and development company in Fujian Province has signed an agreement with the R.J.Reynolds Tobacco Company Limited to produce "Camel" brand filter cigarettes - production is scheduled to begin late this year with equipment supplied by Reynolds, using American tobacco. A new brand using both Chinese and American tobacco will be developed by China and Reynolds, to be sold in China and abroad. An agreement was signed between

the Peking cigarette factory and the British-American Tobacco Company Limited (BAT) to produce "State Express 555" king-size filter tipped cigarettes. Under the agreement, the BAT offers the Peking factory a machine for making and packing to be trial-used for two years. These cigarettes are to be sold in tourist hotels and other special outlets in China.

#### July 11 **Japan**

Japan's six major steelmakers reached final agreement on 11th July with the China National Metals and Minerals Import-Export Corporation to supply 1,075,700 metric tons of general carbon steel products. The tonnage on order, all for shipment in the latter half of the year, is about the same as that ordered for the first half. The total comprises 450,000 tons of cold-rolled sheets - for motor vehicles, 350,000 tons of wire rods - for nails, rivets, bolts, nuts, 113,000 tons of hot coil - hot-rolled sheets in coil or material for cold-rolled sheets and galvanized sheets, 6,000 tons of plates - for shipbuilding and construction, 70,000 tons of galvanized sheets, 6,000 tons

of plates - for shipbuilding and construction, 70,000 tons of galvanized sheets - for roofs, 8,700 tons of electrical sheets, 68,000 tons of electrolytic tinplate - for construction, and 10,000 tons of carbon steel for machine structure - for motor vehicles. The six major mills are Nippon Steel, Nippon Kokan, Kawasaki Steel, Sumitomo Metal Industries, Kobe Steel, and Nisshin Steel.

#### July 14? **Japan**

Cooperation agreements between the Bank of China's Tianjin branch, the Beijing Municipal Economic Construction Corporation and the long-term Credit Bank of Japan. The agreement with the Tianjin branch provides for the Japanese bank to cooperate with the sole Chinese foreign exchange bank in raising foreign capital and in economic and technological exchange in the fields of joint ventures, reciprocal trade and leasing business. Under the agreement with the Peking corporation, the Japanese bank will aid in the municipality's modernization projects.

#### July 16? **Pakistan**

Trade protocol. Under it Pakistan will export cotton yarn, textile goods, finished leather and leather products to China. Official sources said that the protocol prohibited re-export of the imported items by either of the two countries without the consent of the exporting country. The transactions under this protocol shall be subject to the prices of goods and commodities being at world market level and the quality and specifications in accordance with the recognized standards.

China signs the convention on the elimination of all forms of discrimination against women. She declares however, that Paragraph 1 of Article 29 of the convention concerning the interpretation or application of the convention will not be binding on the PRC

Cooperation agreement between the China International Trust and Investment Corporation and Mitsui Bank. It calls on the partners to introduce firms interested in joint ventures, compensatory trade and other dealings between Japan

and China. The two companies have also agreed to cooperate with each other in fund raising and financing, exchanging information and training their employees.

operate in the modernization of various sectors of the Chinese economy, ranging from light industry to energy development, for the coming five years.

**Algeria**

A two-year protocol for health cooperation was signed on 9th July. Under the protocol, 202 Chinese medical personnel will be sent to Algeria, and further cooperation will be developed, particularly in scientific research. (Algiers Radio, Jul 9, 1980; cit. SWB/W 1092)

**Burma**

A protocol on economic and technical cooperation was signed on 3rd July. Under it China will help Burma build eight projects including a highway bridge linking Rangoon with Syriam across the Rangoon river. The projects are to be financed by China with 100,000 yuan (XNA, Jul 4, 1980). Among the projects are a yarn-making machine with 40,000 spindles, three rice mills each with a daily milling capacity of 150 tons, the Moulmein city water supply project, a lock and key factory and 3,000,000 yuan worth of machinery tools. (Rangoon Radio, Jul 9, 1980; cit SWB 6470)

**Cape Verde**

A protocol on economic and technical cooperation was signed on 25th July. (XNA, Jul 25, 1980)

**Congo (Brazzaville)**

An agreement on economic and technical cooperation and a summary of talks on the arrangements for it were signed on 8th July. (XNA, Jul 8, 1980)

**Guinea**

The 6th Chinese medical team left for home after completing their two-year service. It worked in several medical centres giving people medical treatment and training medical workers. (XNA, Jul 23, 1980)

**Iraq**

The No.3 bridge of Mosul in Northern Iraq built with Chinese assistance was opened to traffic on 17th July. The bridge was completed in May 1979. Spanning the Tigris river, it is 667 metres long and 20 metres wide, on which four cars can drive abreast. Its approach was completed recently. (XNA, Jul 19, 1980)

**Madagascar**

With Chinese help to No.2 national highway project is under construction. The 223-kilometre long highway will link Tamatave, the largest port in the country, and Moramanga near the capital of Tananarive. (XNA, Jul 12, 1980)

**Niger**

A protocol on sending another Chinese medical team to Niger was signed on 10th July. (XNA, Jul 12, 1980)

**Rwanda**

The foundation stone for the Rwanda cement plant to be built with Chinese help was laid on 21st July. (XNA, Jul 24, 1980)

**Sudan**

A protocol on the dispatch of a Chinese medical team was signed on 10th July. (XNA, Jul 12, 1980)

**Tanzania**

The expansion projects of the state-owned Ubungo farm implement factory built with Chinese aid were handed over on 30th July. The expansion programme, which was commenced in July 1978 and completed in March 1980, includes two rolling-forging production lines, three workshops, one office building and some other facilities. It will raise the factory's annual capacity of farm implements including hand hoes and ploughs from 1,000 tons to 3,700 tons. (XNA, Jul 30)

**Yemen, Arab Republic**

The office building of the Yemeni Radio and Television General Administration constructed by the China Construction Engineering Corporation was put to use on 10th July. The construction of the 1,000-square metre building in the northern suburb of Sanaa was completed on 30th June. This is one of the largest projects which have been constructed by the Chinese corporation in Yemen. (XNA, Jul 10, 1980)

**Zaire**

A Chinese agricultural group is working at Kikwit in the region of Bandundu. It is engaged in constructing rice and vegetable fields and related installations as a rice-husking shop and an agricultural machine-repairing shop. The rice-growing area at Kikwit has spread to a total of 3,900 hectares with each hectare yielding five tons in a single harvest. (XNA, Jul 30, 1980)

**Zambia**

With Chinese assistance the Serenje-Mansa road in Central Zambia, 327 kilometres in length, has been under construction since 1977. The construction site of the 2.8-kilometre Mukuku bridge on the Luapula river was inspected by President Kaunda on 27th July. (XNA, Jul 28, 1980)
