AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

- Aug 1? **Germany, Fed-Rep.**
 Compensatory trade agreement between the Shanghai Shipyard, Contrans and Habatec (container leasing and engineering companies of the Fed-Rep. of Germany). Under the agreement, funds for building a container factory at the Shanghai Shipyard will be provided by Contrans. The factory is scheduled to begin production in October 1981. The main building will be constructed, equipment provided and workers trained by Habatec. The Shanghai Shipyard will provide 30,000 containers to Contrans from 1982 to 1986, as compensatory trade. The container factory will produce 7,200 high-quality steel containers annually (6.058 metres long, 2.438 metres wide and 2.951 metres high). It will cover 60,000 square metres of land and will employ 250 workers.

- Aug 6 **Switzerland**
 Protocol on radio and television cooperation. According to the protocol, the two sides have agreed to promote the cooperation and exchange of radio-television news and other programmes for development of understanding between peoples of the two countries. The two-year protocol stipulates that each side will provide facilities for, and give technological assistance to the other side in producing radio and television programmes in its own country.

Under it the two firms will introduce to one another interest wishing to launch joint ventures, exchange technology and start trade; they will also cooperate in raising funds for promoting these activities.

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

Bangladesh

A Chinese technical team is finalizing the discussion regarding the setting up of a fertilizer works at Ghorasal. China will provide the foreign exchange components, technical know-how, plant machinery and the supervisory service for the 1,800 million taka works. Ground work has already started. The works will have an annual capacity to produce 110,000 tons of urea and 60,000 tons of synthetic ammonia, using natural gas as raw material (Dacca Radio, Aug-21, 1980; cit. SWB/W 1098).

Burundi

A ground-breaking ceremony of the Musaga highway near the capital of Bujumbura took place on 27th August. The 110 kilometre-long highway from Bujumbura to the source of the Nile will be built with Chinese assistance (XNA, Aug 27, 1980).

Equatorial Guinea

A Chinese-aided telecommunication project (in Malabo?) was handed over on 3rd August (XNA, Aug 4, 1980).

Korea, North

The Huichon oil pump and nozzle plant, built with China's help, has recently gone into operation (XNA, Aug 13, 1980).

Pakistan

A team of Chinese technical experts is arriving in Lahore in September to finalize the construction of a 66.78 km 220 kV double-circuit line from Tarbela to Mardan, and a new 220/132 kV grid station at Mardan. The cost will be about 268,000,000 rupees including a foreign exchange component of 84,000,000 rupees (Karachi Radio, Aug 9, 1980; cit. SWB/W 1096).

Chinese experts are expanding a cement plant in Daudkhel. This plant is being established at the present site of the Maple Leaf plant with Chinese financial aid. The machinery is being manufactured with Chinese technical help at the heavy machinery complex in Taxila. Another cement plant will be operatin at the Daudkhel complex in 1983 following its completion (Karachi Radio, Aug 4, 1980; cit. SWB/W 1096).

The 100,000,000-rupee sheet glass works being set up by the National Police Foundation at

Nowshera is expected to go into production by January next year. The civil work has already been completed, and machinery procured from China under a loan agreement has also arrived at the site. A Chinese technical team is to install the machinery. Chinese experts are expected to put the works into operation by the end of this year and initial production of the plant. This sheet glass works will ultimately produce 60 tons of sheet glass every day. The factory will help eliminate almost totally the import of sheet glass from abroad to meet local needs. The profits of the factory will be spent on the welfare of the police force in the country (Karachi Radio, Juli 31, 1980; cit. SWB/W 1096).

Somalia

The Fanole water conservancy project is under construction with Chinese assistance in the Jelib District of Southern Somalia (XNA, Aug 31, 1980).

Tanzania/Zambia

A protocol on the 3rd term of technical cooperation for the Tazara railway and five other documents were signed on 29th August. Since the Tazara started in 1976 it has hauled a total of 4.4 million tonnes of cargo and nearly five million passengers. It was pointed out that Tazara inevitably met certain problems and difficulties. Therefore the protocol is related to the rehabilitation of land erosion caused by heavy rains and the reconstruction of bridges, along with ways and means conducive to increasing the efficiency of Tazara (XNA, Aug 29, 1980).

Zaire

At present the Chinese Agricultural Mission operates throughout Zaire 12 stations, with a total cultivated area of 25,000 ha (Zaire Press Agency, Jul 29, 1980; cit. SWB/W 1096).

PERSONAL DATA

Wolfgang Bartke

Known Cadres on new posts

Jiang Zemin 江泽民

Identified as vice-minister of the Administrative Commission on Import and Export Affairs (XNA, Aug 21, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Jiang had been assistant minister of the 1st Ministry of Machine Building. Reactivated in 1976 he became an adviser to the 1st Ministry of Machine Building and vice-president of the Society of Mechanical Engineering two years later. (This is the first time that the Administrative Commission on Import and Export Affairs has been named. We do not yet know its place in the hierarchy.)

Ma Ming 马明

Identified as vice-minister of metallurgical industry (XNA, Aug 5, 1980).

Ma became known as head of a tunneling team at the Longyan mine in Hebei Province. He has been an alternate member of the CCP Central Committee since its 10th Congress in 1973. Now he is also commander-in-chief of the Jiangxi Province copper base at Guixi.

Song Zhenming 宋振明

Relieved from his post as minister of petroleum industry.

Wan Li 万里

Appointed minister of the State Agricultural Commission (XNA, Aug 26, 1980).

Wan is a member of the CCP Central Committee and a member of its secretariat. Since April this year he has also held the post of a vice-premier. On his new post he succeeds Wang Renzhong.

Wang Bingqian 王丙乾

Appointed minister of finance (XNA, Aug 26, 1980).

Wang had been vice-minister in the same department before. He succeeds Wu Bo who probably had to give up this post after having been appointed governor of the World Bank, representing China, in June 1980.

Wang Renzhong 王任重

Relieved from his post as minister of the State Agricultural Commission (XNA, Aug 26, 1980).

Wang remains in his positions of vice-premier,

member of the Secretariat and director of the Propaganda Department under the CCP Central Committee.

Wang Zhaowen 王朝文

Identified as secretary of Guizhou Province CP (Guiyang Radio, Jul 31, 1980).

Wang, who belongs to the Miao minority, has been known as a Guizhou cadre since 1973. In march 1979 he was identified as chairman of the Guizhou Youth Federation. In January 1980 he was elected vice-governor of Guizhou Province.

Wu Bo 吴波

Relieved from his post as minister of finance (XNA, Aug 26, 1980).

In June 1980 Wu was appointed governor of the World Bank, representing the PR China. This post probably takes up so much of his time that he had to give up the post of finance minister.

Wu Lengxi 吴冷西

Identified as secretary of Guangdong Province CP (Guangzhou Radio, Aug 5, 1980).

Before the Cultural Revolution Wu had been editor-in-chief of Renmin Ribao, director of the Xinhua News Agency and deputy director of the Propaganda Department under the CCP 8th Central Committee. Reactivated in 1972 he was elected alternate member of the CCP 11th Central Committee in 1977 and member of the 5th NPC's Standing Committee in 1978. In May 1980 he was seen in Guangdong Province for the first time.

Xie Bangzhi 谢邦治

Identified as vice-minister of justice (XNA, Aug 19, 1980).

Xie had been on the same post in the late fifties before he was ordered to the diplomatic field where he held the posts of an ambassador to Bulgaria (1962-1967), to Afghanistan (1969-1973), to Upper Volta (1973-1978) and to Finland (1979-1980).

Xie Beiyi 谢北一

Identified as vice-minister of the State Foreign Investment Commission (XNA, Aug 19, 1980). Since 1965 Xie has also held the post of a vice-minister of the State Capital Construction Commission.

Xu Chi 徐驰

Identified as vice-minister of the State Commission for Machine Building Industry (XNA, Aug 19, 1980).

Xu has been an alternate member of the CCP Central Committee since its 9th Congress in 1969. From 1959 until Cultural Revolution he had been vice-minister of metallurgical industry to become secretary of Sichuan CP from 1971 until 1977. In 1978 he was again appointed to his former post as vice-minister of metallurgical industry.

Yu Quili 余秋里

Relieved from his post as minister of the State Planning Commission and appointed minister of the newly established State Energy Commission (XNA, Aug 26, 1980).

Yu is a member of the Politburo and vice-premier. As minister of petroleum industry from 1958 to the Cultural Revolution he was responsible for the modernization of China's oil industry.

Zeng Siyu 曾思玉

Zeng was not mentioned in public sources after he had been relieved from his post as commander of Jinan Military Region. He has now reemerged as a military figure of the Nanjing Military Region (Nanjing Radio, Jul 31, 1980).

New Cadre**Zhou Xuancheng**

Identified as vice-minister of the Administrative Commission on Import and Export Affairs (XNA, Aug 10, 1980).

Changes in China's Diplomatic Service**Ding Guoyu 丁国钰**

Appointed ambassador to Norway (XNA, Aug 22, 1980).

Former appointments:

- 1955-1958 Ambassador to Afghanistan
- 1958-1966 Ambassador to Pakistan
- 1966-1977 Secretary of Beijing Municipality CP
- 1973, Aug Elected member of the CCP Central Committee
- 1977-1978 3rd secretary of Beijing Municipality CP

Note: Ding now is the only member of the CCP Central Committee on an ambassador post.

Appointed permanent representative of the PR China to the United Nations (XNA, Aug 12, 1980).

- 1971-1974 Deputy director of the Department of International Organizations and Conferences, Agreements and Laws under the Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- 1975-1978 Ambassador to Venezuela
- 1978-1979 Director of the same department as under 1971-1974

Zhang Shijie 张士杰

Appointed ambassador to Spain (XNA, Aug 14, 1980).

Former appointments:

- 1960-1965 Ambassador to Nepal
- 1975-1979 Ambassador to Somalia

Zhu Yi

Gong was born in 1917(?) in Hefei, Anhui Province. She graduated from the Yanjing University and continued her studies at Columbia University, USA. After her return to China she worked for the Y.M.C.A. About 1947/48 she was sent to the United Nations in New York to work in the Human Rights Commission. Back in China she was elected alternate executive member of the Federation of Democratic Women in March 1949. In September that year she was one of this federation's delegate to the 1st CPPCC.

- 1950, Aug Identified as council member of the Chinese Red Cross
