## Agreements with Foreign Countries

May 1979

- May 1 EGYPT Executive programme of cultural cooperation 1979-1981. It covers education, health, culture, and art, press, radio, television, sports and youth; exchange of teaching experience and students; study of endemic and epidemic diseases; exchange of delegations in culture, art and sports; and exchange of news, radio and TV programmes (1)
- 2 FRANCE Minutes of talks between the Chinese State Bureau of Weights and Measures and the National Metrological Bureau of France (2)
- 8 PHILIPPINES  
USA Initialling of a civil air transport agreement (3)
- Five-year protocol between the Chinese State Scientific and Technological Commission and the US Department of Commerce on cooperation in the fields of management in science and technology and scientific and technical information. The protocol stipulates that the parties agree to conduct exchanges and collaborative activities on the basis of equality, reciprocity and mutual benefit. Cooperation in the field of management of industrial science and technology may take any of the following forms: - exchange and provision of publications and literature on the management of industrial science and technology; - exchange of specialists and scholars to lecture on the management of industrial science and technology; - exchange of personnel in the management of industrial science and technology for training purposes; - joint organization of conferences, symposia and courses; and such other forms of cooperation as are mutually agreed. Cooperation in the field of scientific and technical information may take any of the following forms: - exchange and provision of scientific and technical information; - the making available of information systems and data banks; - cooperation in the development and refinement of such data banks and information systems; and - exchange of personnel for training purposes.
- Protocol on cooperation in the field of atmospheric science and technology  
Protocol on cooperation in the field of fishery and marine science and technology  
Protocol on cooperation in the field of metrology and standards.  
(The four protocols referred to above are related to the agreement on science and technology which was signed on January 31, 1979) (3)
- 9 FRANCE Credit agreement between the Bank of China and 18 French banks (4)
- 10 USA Trade exhibition agreement. Under this agreement China agrees that the USA may hold an exhibition in Peking in 1980, and exhibitions in Peking and other cities in subsequent years. The USA agrees that China may hold its economic and trade exhibition from May to October 1980 in New York, Chicago and San Francisco, and exhibitions in these other cities in subsequent years (5)
- 11 USA Agreement on the settlement of claims on assets (6)
- 12 JORDAN Trade agreement (7)
- 14 ITALY Agreement on scientific cooperation between the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the Italian National Research Committee (8)
- USA Initialling of a trade agreement under which the contracting parties will accord each other most-favoured nation treatment (8)



- May 15 JAPAN Credit agreement between the Bank of China and the Export-Import Bank of Japan for the development of China's oil and coal resources and their export to Japan (9)
- SWEDEN Trade agreement for 5 years (9). It is to replace the one dating back to 1957. Under this agreement Swedish companies will be allowed to open sales offices in Peking. The Swedish side has offered China a credit of 350,000,000 US dollars (10)
- 15? ITALY Credit agreement under which Italy is to grant China credit up to 1,000 million dollars (11)
- 16 LIBERIA Trade agreement (12)
- 17 TUNISIA Trade agreement under which the contracting parties will grant each other most-favoured nation treatment. According to the agreement China will export tea, textiles and other light industry products and chemical products; Tunisia will export triple superphosphate, cork, crude oil and pig-lead (13)
- 18 JAPAN Credit agreement between the Bank of China and Japanese commercial banks under which the latter may extend short-term trade funds and medium-term syndicated loans to China (12)
- 19 CANADA Credit agreement under which Canada will extend 2,000 million Canadian dollars of credit to China to cover purchases of Canadian goods and services (14)
- ALGERIA Three-year trade agreement, which may be extended for another three years, if both signatories so desire. According to the agreement China will export tea, textiles, light industrial goods and chemicals, while Algeria will export pig iron iron sand, crude oil, and paper (15)
- 22 BRAZIL Agreement on maritime transport (16) under which ships from both countries will be allowed to navigate between ports open to foreign trade and provide freight and passenger services between the two countries (18)
- ROMANIA Protocol on the first meeting of the Economic and Technical Cooperation Committee of China and Romania. The protocol mentions the concrete objectives regarding cooperation in production in the machine-building, mining and chemical industries, in forestry and in other areas of common interest. It also settles the measures for expanding and diversifying commercial exchanges and technical and scientific collaboration (16).
- NORWAY Programme on cultural, educational and scientific cooperation for 1979-1980 (16)
- 24 MALI Protocol on economic and technical cooperation (18)
- 25 GERMANY, Agreement between the German Standardization Institute and the Chinese Association for Federal Republic Standardization under which the two countries will exchange their national standardization catalogues and reinforce their consultations on standardization through visits by experts (19)
- 29 FINLAND Agreement on economic, industrial, scientific and technical cooperation (20)
- JORDAN Trade agreement on organizing bilateral trade (21)

#### Addendum April 1979

- April 26 PHILIPPINES The Philippines has agreed to export 20,000 metric tons of copper concentrates to China in 1979. China will continue to export 1,200,000 metric tons of Chinese crude oil and other minerals with a total value of 130,000,000 dollars. The oil, valued at 120,000,000 dollars a year is covered by a separate agreement due to expire in 1981, which involves a total of 6,000,000 metric tons of crude oil over a period of five years. (22)

## China's Economic Aid

May 1979

### MALI

A protocol on economic and technical cooperation was signed on May 24 (XNA May 24, 1979).

### PAKISTAN

A foundation-stone laying ceremony for a new Chinese-aided factory was held at Wah, 30 kilometres from Islamabad, in the presence of Pakistan's defence minister Talpur (XNA May 21, 1979). The factory is defence-orientated (AFP May 20, 1979; cit. SWB 6123).

### SENEGAL

Chinese-aided agricultural projects were handed over on May 2. Started in 1973 these projects included land improvement, the building of small irrigation and water conservancy facilities, technical guidance about rice and vegetable growing and the training of Senegalese personnel (XNA May 2, 1979).

### TANZANIA

Freight trains have resumed operation on the Tanzam Railway on a trial bases after one month's stoppage. The railway line was closed to all traffic last month after heavy rain had damaged the line at 18 points between Mlinbar and Makumbako stations on the Tanzanian side. A stretch of 150 kilometres has been rebuilt (XNA May 23, 1979).

### TOGO

The third Chinese medical team left for home after its two-year service on May 11. The fourth team arrived on April 23 (XNA May 11, 1979).

A ceremony marking the delivery of the Chinese-aided agro-technical cooperation projects was held on May 11 in Mission Tove of the Region of Tsevie in Southern Togo (XNA May 11, 1979).

### YEMEN, Arab Republic

Chinese technicians are constructing the Amran-Hajja road (XNA May 4, 1979). The cornerstone-laying of this 48-kilometres long road took place in December 1974 (XNA Sep 24, 1974).

The foundation-stone laying ceremony for a cotton ginning and oil-pressing plant was held in Hodeida on May 20. The plant, to be built with Chinese aid, is located in an eastern suburb of Hodeida, 18 km from the city, covering an area of 11 hectares. When completed it can gin 17,980 tons of cotton and turn out 1,990 tons of oil every year (XNA May 20, 1979).

### ZAIRE

The Chinese-aided Palace of the People of Zaire was inaugurated on May 19, in the presence of President Mobutu. It is located near the Zaire river not far from downtown Kinshasa (XNA May 19, 1979). The groundbreaking ceremony for the building took place in November 1975 (XNA Nov 21, 1975).

Identified as vice-minister of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission (XNA May 27, 1979).

Bu belongs to the Mongol minority. Before the Cultural Revolution he had been head of the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region's Cultural Office. Reactivated in December 1978, he is director of the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region's CCP Propaganda Department.

CHEN PENG 陈鹏

Identified as secretary of the Beijing Municipal CP Committee (XNA May 5, 1979).

Chen had been on the same post before the Cultural Revolution and was not reactivated until February 1979.

FAN RUSHENG 范儒生

Identified as secretary of the Tianjin Municipality CP Committee (Tianjin Radio May 3, 1979).

In the late fifties Fan had been secretary of the Beijing Municipal CP Committee. Reactivated in December 1978, he has been a member of the CCP Central Committee's Commission for Inspecting Discipline since.

HUANG ZHIZHEN 黄知真

Identified as secretary of the Hubei Provincial CP Committee (Wuhan Radio May 4, 1979).

Huang, who is a member of the 11th CCP Central Committee, had been secretary of the Jiangxi Provincial CP Committee from 1973 until January 1979.

JIA TINGSAN 贾庭三

Elected vice-chairman of the Beijing Municipality's Revolutionary Committee (XNA May 14, 1979).

Jia, who had been a vice-mayor of Beijing before the Cultural Revolution, was reactivated in 1971. He held a post in Guizhou Province until he was ordered to Beijing to become third secretary of the Beijing Municipal CP Committee in October 1978.

JIANG PING 江平

Identified as vice-minister of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission (XNA May 27, 1979).

Jiang has been known as a cadre of that commission since

December 1978.

JIANG WEN 江文

Identified as director of the PLA General Staff's Communications Department (XNA May 27, 1979).

Before the Cultural Revolution Jiang was a deputy of the PLA to the Third National People's Congress. In 1974 he was identified as deputy commander of the Wuhan Military Region and in September 1977, as head of the Signals Department of General Staff Headquarters.

LI BONING 李伯宁

Identified as vice-minister of water conservancy (XNA May 24, 1979).

Li had been a vice-minister of the Ministry of Water Conservancy and Electric Power until that ministry was divided to form the Ministry of Water Conservancy and the Ministry of Power in February 1979.

LI QINGWEI 李庆伟

Identified as secretary of the Henan Provincial CP Committee (Zhengzhou Radio Apr 30, 1979).

Li, a former vice-governor of Henan, has been a vice-chairman of the Henan Revolutionary Committee since 1977 and had been a member of the Henan CP Committee's Standing Committee before his present appointment.

LI RUI 李锐

Identified as vice-minister of power industry (XNA May 17, 1979).

Li had been a vice-minister of the Fourth Ministry of Machine Building before his present appointment. Prior to the Cultural Revolution he had been vice-minister of water conservancy and electric power.

LI XUEZHI 李学智

Identified as first secretary of the Ningxia Autonomous Region's CP Committee (XNA May 13, 1979).

Li had been secretary of that committee before and has now succeeded Huo Shilian, who became minister of agriculture in February 1979.

LI ZHIZHONG 李质忠

Identified as vice-director of the General Office of the CCP



Central Committee (XNA May 27, 1979).

Li had been a deputy of Hebei Province to the Second and Third National People's Congresses. He was reactivated in 1973. In 1978 he led a study group to centres of the World Health Organization in Western Europe.

LING YÜN 凌云

Identified as vice-minister of public security (XNA May 21, 1979).

Ling had been on the same post between 1964 and the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in September 1975, he was repeatedly mentioned, among other vice-ministers of public security, since December 1975. It may, therefore, be deemed likely that he has held his position since that time.

LIU MINGHUI 刘明辉

Identified as second secretary of the Yunnan Provincial CP Committee (Kunming Radio May 1, 1979).

Liu, who is an alternate member of the 11th CCP Central Committee, had been secretary of the Yunnan CP Committee before.

LIU XIANGSAN 刘向三

Identified as vice-minister of water conservancy (XNA May 16, 1979);

Liu had been a vice-minister of the Ministry of Water Conservancy and Electric Power until it was divided, in February 1979, into the Ministry of Water Conservancy and the Ministry for the Power Industry.

LIU XIGENG 刘锡更

Identified as vice-minister of agriculture (XNA May 29, 1979).

Liu had been a vice-minister of agriculture and forestry until that ministry was divided, in February 1979, to form the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Forestry.

LU ZHIAN 鲁治安

Identified as secretary of the Qinghai Provincial CP Committee (Xining Radio, Apr 28, 1979).

Liu had been deputy secretary of that committee before.

MAO LIN 茅林

Identified as a vice-minister of metallurgical industry (XNA May 27, 1979).

Mao had been secretary of the Gansu Provincial CP Committee between 1975 and 1978.

TEMURE DAWAMAD 铁木尔达瓦提

Identified as vice-minister of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission (XNA May 27, 1979).

Temure, who belongs to the Uighur minority, had been secretary of the Xinjiang Autonomous Region CP Committee before.

XI ZHONGXUN 习仲勋

Identified as chairman of the Guangdong Provincial Revolutionary Committee (Guangzhou Radio May 5, 1979).

As Xi became first secretary of the Guangdong Provincial CP Committee in December 1978, it is not surprising to find him in the above position, too, which he has possibly held for some time already.

XU SHAOFU 徐少甫

Identified as secretary of the Liaoning Provincial CP Committee (XNA May 25, 1979).

In the late fifties Xu had been secretary of the Shenyang Municipal CP Committee. Reactivated in December 1978, he has been a member of the CCP Central Committee's Commission for Inspecting Discipline since.

YANG DONGSHENG 杨东生

Identified as vice-minister of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission (XNA May 2, 1979).

Yang, who is a Tibetan, had been secretary of the Tibet Autonomous Region's CP Committee between 1971 and the autumn of 1977. In 1978 he was elected a member of the Standing Committee of the Fifth Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference.

YANG YANSEN

Identified as vice-minister of forestry (XNA May 28, 1979).

In 1974 Yang was identified as director of the Forestry Bureau under the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry and in August 1978 as vice-director of the Administrative Bureau under the same ministry.

YU MINGTAO 于明涛

Identified as chairman of the Shaanxi Provincial CP Committee (XNA May 26, 1979).

Yu, who is a member of the 11th CCP Central Committee, had been secretary of that committee before. He is a Hunan man who served under Hua Guofeng in that province until he went to Shaanxi in 1977.

ZHANG CHENGXIAN 张承先

Identified as vice-minister of education (NCNA May 27, 1979).

Zhang who had been a party secretary and vice-governor of Hebei Province before the Cultural Revolution, was reactivated in that province in 1977 to become a vice-chairman of the revolutionary committee and a member of the Standing Committee of Hebei Province's CP Committee.

ZHANG CHENGZONG 张承宗

Identified as vice-chairman of the Shanghai Municipal Revolutionary Committee (Shanghai Radio May 25, 1979).

Before the Cultural Revolution Zhang had been a vice-mayor



of Shanghai. Reactivated in 1978, he has been director of the Shanghai Municipal CP Committee's Department for United Front Work.

ZHAO WENFU 赵文甫

Identified as vice-chairman of the Henan Provincial Revolutionary Committee (Zhengzhou Radio May 12, 1979). Since March 1979, Zhao has been secretary of the Henan Provincial CP Committee. He held the same post before the Cultural Revolution.

ZHAO XINGZHI 赵行志

Identified as secretary of the Shanghai Municipal CP Committee (Shanghai Radio May 5, 1979). Since 1977 Zhao has also held the post of a vice-chairman of the Shanghai Revolutionary Committee. Before that time he served in the diplomatic field, having been consul-general in Geneva from 1963 until 1966, ambassador to Cameroon between 1971 and 1974, and ambassador to Iraq between 1974 and 1976.

#### Reactivated Cadres

CHEN RULONG 陈如龙

Identified as vice-minister of finance (XNA May 16, 1979).

Chen had been on the same post between 1960 and 1964 and became director of the Central College for Finance and Banking in 1964.

GONG CIRONG 龚子荣

Identified as secretary of the Guangdong Provincial CP Committee (Guangzhou Radio May 7, 1979).

Between 1959 and 1965 Gong had been deputy secretary of the State Council and vice-director of the CCP Central Committee's General Office.

WANG DE 王德

Identified as secretary of the Guangdong Provincial CP Committee (Guangzhou Radio May 7, 1979).

Wang held the same position before the Cultural Revolution. He had also been first secretary of Guangzhou Provincial CP Committee between 1958 and 1966 when he was purged.

XIA ZHENGHONG 夏征农

Identified as secretary of the Shanghai Municipal CP Committee and as first secretary of the Fudan University's CP Committee (Shanghai Radio May 25, 1979).

Before the Cultural Revolution Xia had been secretary of Shandong CP Committee (1958) and director of the East China Bureau of the CCP Central Committee.

XIE HECHOU 谢鹤筹

Identified as vice-minister of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission (XNA May 2, 1979).

Xie, who belongs to the Zhuang minority, held the same position from 1957 (?) until the Cultural Revolution.

WU JINGHUA 伍精华

Identified as vice-minister of the State Nationalities Affairs Commission (XNA May 27, 1979).
