**AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES**

**Portugal (Oct 04)**

Agreement for economic industrial and technical cooperation. It says, "with a view to strengthening the friendly relations between two countries, the contracting parties shall encourage the development of economic, industrial and technical cooperation between institutions, economic organizations and enterprises in the respective countries. The contracting parties shall promote the realization of cooperation projects between institutions, economic organizations and enterprises in the two countries." Under the agreement, the two contracting parties will establish a mixed commission, consisting of representatives of competent authorities and economic organizations of the two countries.

**World Health Organization**

(Oct 04)

Basic agreement. According to it, the two sides will strengthen technical cooperation in health activities in a spirit of friendly cooperation, and they agreed to the establishment of technical advisory cooperation. Such technical advisory cooperation may consist of organizing and conducting seminars, training personnel, establishing demonstration projects and collaborating centers, carrying out tests and investigations in such places as may be mutually agreed upon, awarding research training grants and fellowships and sponsoring study tours.

**Comoros (Oct 06)**

Contract under which China will help Comoros build a people's palace.

**Denmark (Oct 12)**

Agreement to jointly establish a post-graduate training center in the medicobiological field in Beijing. Under the agreement, Denmark will provide consultative service for the design and construction of the center, and supply special technical items of which there is a shortage in China, as well as laboratory and teaching equipment. It will also supply sets of color slides covering diagnosis in oral pathology with accompanying texts for each of the approximately 25 existing and planned faculties of stomatology in China, and supply laboratory equipment for teaching purposes to the stomatology hospital of Beijing Medical College. The Chinese side will provide the land for the post-graduate training center and covers the cost of construction of the buildings with basic technical installations and the facilities for operation and maintenance of the equipment to be supplied by Denmark.

**Germany, Federal Republic**

(Oct 13)

Agreement on technical cooperation. Under it, the Federal Republic will send experts to work in China, supply material and equipment for technical cooperation projects and train Chinese technical and managerial personnel.

**Morocco (Oct 13)**

Agreement on sports and youth exchanges and cooperation for 1983 and 1984.

XNA, Oct 14, 1982

**Sri Lanka (Oct 17?)**

Trade protocol, doing away with the old barter system; it will come into operation on 1st January next year. The agreement provides for cash trading in a wide range of goods, and replaces the traditional rubber-for-rice barter deal. Both countries expect overall trade to rise sharply from the present 1,000 million rupees to 1,600 million rupees during 1983. Colombo Radio, Oct 17, 1982; cit. SWB/W 1208

**Japan (Oct 18)**

Agreement on a Japanese government loan to the Chinese government. Under the agreement, the Japanese government loan is 65,000 million Japanese yen, of which 20,000 million yen (commodity loan) will be used on the Daqing Petro-chemical Project and the first phase of the Baoshan Iron and Steel Complex; the rest will be used for the construction of the Beijing-Qinhuangdao railway, Yanzhou-Shijiusuo railway and Shijiusuo port. This agreement is the fourth one since 1979, and the total sum of loans of the previous three agreements is 166,000 million yen.

**Germany, Democratic****Republic (Oct 18)**

Agreement on sports exchanges in 1983. Under the agreement, the GDR will send track and field, swimming and hockey teams to visit China, and the GDR sports federation will send a delegation of observers to attend the fifth All-China Sport Games to be held in Shanghai next September. In return, China will send track and field, gymnastics, diving and fencing teams to visit GDR.

**Pakistan (Oct 19)**

Agreement on the establishment of a joint committee for economic, trade, scientific and technical cooperation. Under it the joint committee will review the progress on implementation of protocols signed in the fields of economic, trade, scientific and technical cooperation between the two parties, study and explore possibilities of broadening cooperation in these fields and make suggestions for strengthening and promoting such cooperation, and consider and draft protocols to be signed in the fields of economic, trade, scientific and technical cooperation deemed necessary by both parties.

Agreement on the protection of Sweden's investments in China

Protocol on scientific and technical cooperation. It states both sides will work together in the fields of machinery, chemical industry, agriculture, forestry, water conservancy, building materials and medicine.

**Nepal (Oct 28)**

Notes exchange saying China will give 2,000 metric tons of maize to Nepal.

XNA, Oct 28, 1982

**Bulgaria (Oct 29)**

Protocol on exchange of industrial experts. Under it Bulgaria will send experts to study production and design of porcelain products, cotton textiles, printing and jacquard weave. China will send experts to study raising high-yield vegetables, plate-glass production research and environmental protection by the building materials industry.

XNA, Oct 29, 1982

**Libya (Oct 29)**

Agreement on the establishment of a China-Libya Joint Committee and a cooperation program. Under the agreement, the joint committee will supervise and check the implementation of the agreements on economic, trade and scientific and technological cooperation between the two countries and study the possibilities of expanding such cooperation. According to the cooperation program, the two sides will cooperate in trade, communications, light industry, agriculture and housing projects as well as joint investment.

## Comoros

A diversion project in Comoro's Nioumakele Island was completed lying in the south of the Anjouan Island in Comoro. The Nioumakale's diversion project includes seven dams, 18 reservoirs and a 60-kilometers-long canal. The project was started in April 1981. (XNA, Oct 23, 1982)

China and Comoros signed a contract under which China will help Comoros build a "people's palace". (XNA, Oct 7, 1982)

## Madagascar

The first phase - about one third of the 235-kilometer-long Horamanga-Andranonampango highway in the eastern Tamtave Province was finished. (XNA, Oct 15, 1982)

A farm machinery plant built with Chinese equipment was inaugurated at Farafangana in southeast Madagascar. The plant makes rice mills, maize shellers, pumps and parts for motor vehicles and tractors. (XNA, Oct 30, 1982)

## Pakistan

Pakistan's Hazara urea fertilizer plant in Haripur, the northwest province, was officially put into production on Oct 14, 1982. The plant's equipment was provided by China and designed to produce 288 tons urea fertilizer daily. The construction started in December 1978. (XNA, Oct 14, 1982)

## Senegal

The last three of 60 China-aided wells in Senegal were inaugurated recently. The three wells are located in Maka-Couli Bantan, Koussanar and Koumpentoum of Tambacounda province, east Senegal. The supply system with each well includes a tower, two ponds and water troughs for animals. The drilling of the 60 wells with the help of Chinese technicians started five years ago to improve the water supply to the farmers in five of the eight administrative divisions of the country. The whole project costs one billion cfaf (one US\$ equals 338 cfaf). (XNA, Oct 25, 1982)

## Somalia

A hydraulic power station and the main canal of the Fanole project were put into operation. The Fanole water project is the largest agricultural project in Somalia. After its completion, the project would be able to water more than 40,000 hectares of farmland. At present, there are about 370 Chinese experts working on this project. (XNA, Oct 24, 1982)

## Yemen, Arab Republic

200 sets of housing units in southern Sanaa of a total 500 were put into use. (XNA, Oct 2, 1982)

## Liu Huaqing 刘华清

Identified as commander of the PLA Navy (XNA, Oct 7, 1982)  
Liu is an PLA admiral since the 1950s. The 12th Party Congress in September this year elected him member of the Central Committee. His last position had been deputy chief of the PLA General Staff.

## Liu Zhenhua 刘振华

Identified as political commissar of Shenyang Military Region (Shenyang Radio, Oct 30, 1982)  
Liu has been deputy political commissar of the same military region before. Last month the 12th Party Congress elevated him from alternate member to member of its Central Committee.

## Wang Chenghan 王诚汉

Identified as commander of Chengdu Military Region (Chengdu Radio, Oct 28, 1982)  
Wang has been deputy commander of the same region before. The 12th Party Congress elected him member of its Central Committee in September this year.

## Xie Beiyi 谢北

Deceased in October 1982 (XNA, Oct 20, 1982)  
His last position was vice-minister of the Ministry for Urban and Rural Construction and Environmental Protection.

## Xie Fang 解方
