## China's Economic Aid

### JANUARY 1978

#### ETHIOPIA

On December 29 China and Ethiopia signed an interim agreement providing for the enlargement of the veterinary centres in Gondar, Mekele and Kombolcha. A number of Chinese veterinary experts are serving in Bahir Dar and Kombolcha (SWB/W 963).

#### LAOS

Two protocols concerning Chinese aid to Laos were signed on January 20, 1978. Under one of them China will supply Laos with complete sets of equipment (NCNA Jan 21, 1978).

Projects now under construction with Chinese assistance are the Lao-Chinese Friendship printing house, a sawmill, and a medium-sized textile factory (Vientiane Radio, Jan 27, 1978; cit. SWB 5725).

#### PAKISTAN

China has agreed to supply Pakistan with a timber-seasoning plant for the heavy foundry and forge in Taxila (Karachi Radio, Jan 15, 1978; cit. SWB/W 964).

The Karakoram highway is practically finished after 15 years of construction work. Still to be built is a bridge across the Hunza river, and this may take some time. With Bosphorus bridge built, the Karokoram highway completes an overland route between Europe's Atlantic coast and China's Pacific coast. In fact the Karakoram highway has already been opened to traffic. Columns of vehicles daily negotiate the 602 miles between Islamabad and the Khunjerab pass, over 4,600 m high on the China-Pakistan frontier. The highway winds around a 50 square mile triangle in which twelve of the world's 18 highest peaks are to be found. The construction of the highway was started simultaneously 15 years ago by Chinese and Pakistani army engineer corps, each from their respective end. With easier terrain, the Chinese completed their section by about 1970 and offered the use of their road building equipment and other requisites to Pakistan which accepted the offer to let the Chinese take

part in road building on their side. About 10,000 Chinese workers and technicians built the 408-mile section south from Khunjerab to Takot (Tanjug Dec 22, 1977; cit. SWB/W 964).

#### TANZANIA

The Chinese medical team working in Zanzibar completed its mission (NCNA Jan 11, 1978).

#### UPPER VOLTA

The Banfora reclamation area for rice production built with Chinese cooperation was handed over on January 6, 1978 (NCNA Jan 11, 1978).

#### YEMEN, People's Democratic Republic (South Yemen)

With Chinese assistance the state-owned fishery company in Aden is under construction (NCNA Jan 5, 1978).

#### ZAIRE

Chinese agrotechnicians are rendering assistance in the construction of the 80-hectare Bia and Mikonga rice fields project on the outskirts of Kinshasa (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

## Personal Data

### Known Cadres on New Posts

CHANG HSIANG-SHAN 张香山

Identified as vice-director of the CCP Central Committee's Propaganda Department (NCNA Dec 31, 1977).

Chang had been director of the Marxism-Leninism Institute in the fifties and vice-chairman of the Afro-Asian Solidarity Committee since 1965. Reactivated in 1971, he was made vice-chairman of the China-Japan Friendship Association in 1973. Since March 1977 he has also been director of the Central Broadcasting Administration.

CHANG HSIU-LUNG 张秀龙

Elected vice-chairman of the Hupei Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 5, 1978).

Chang is a major-general of the PLA. Since 1976 he has been commander of the Hupei Military District.

CHANG JUI-YING (f) 张瑞英

Elected vice-chairman of the Kiangsu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Chang had been a member of the Standing Committee of the Kiangsu Provincial Revolutionary Committee since 1971 and was made chairman of the Kiangsu Trade Unions in June 1977.

CHANG K'E-HSIN

Elected vice-chairman of the Fukien Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 12, 1977).

Chang had been a vice-director of the Fukien CCP Committee in the fifties and has been director of that committee since November 1977.

CHANG WEN-CHIN 章文晋

Identified as vice-minister of Foreign Affairs (NCNA Jan 29, 1978).

Chang is a diplomat of long standing. His last posts were that of a minister-assistant in the Foreign Ministry (1972-1973) and that of ambassador to Canada (from 1973 until recently).

CH'EN CHIEN-FEI 陈剑飞

Elected vice-chairman of the Heilungkiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Ch'en, a vice-governor of Heilungkiang province since the

fifties who disappeared during the Cultural Revolution, was reactivated in 1973 to be a member of the Heilungkiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee's Standing Committee.

CHAO SHOU-YI 赵守一

Elected vice-chairman of the Anhui Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 24, 1978).

Chao worked in the People's Court of the Anching district in Anhui province before the Cultural Revolution. In May 1968 he was publicly denounced as a capitalist roader, but reactivated in June 1977 when he was sent to Anhui province by order of Hua and the Central Committee. Since October 1977 he has been Party secretary of the Anhui Provincial Party Committee.

CH'EN YUNG-LIN 陈永林

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Ch'en was a newcomer when he was elected an alternate member of the 11th CCP Central Committee in August last year.

CH'ENG T'O-PIN 郑拓彬

Identified as vice-minister of foreign trade (NCNA Jan 11, 1978).

From 1960 until 1964 Ch'eng had been a commercial counsellor of the Third Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1973. Since 1975 he has been leading a number of commercial delegations to Canada, France, Norway, Denmark, Italy, the Netherlands, Sweden, Australia, and New Zealand.

CHIANG YI 姜一

Elected vice-chairman of the Shensi Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Chiang had been a cadre of Hupei province from 1965 until mid-1977 when he was ordered to Shensi province to become Party secretary of that province in September last year.

CHOU WEI-CHIH 周巍峙

Identified as vice-minister of culture (NCNA Jan 25, 1978). From 1960 until 1966 Chou was director of the Arts Bureau under the Ministry of Culture and also vice-chairman of the Dancers' Association. He disappeared in 1966 to be reactivated in September 1975 as a cadre of culture and arts circles.

CH'ÜAN HSING-YÜAN 权星垣

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Ch'üan had been a cadre of Inner Mongolia before the Cultural Revolution and became a secretary of that Region's Party Committee in 1963.

FENG CHI-HSIN 冯纪新

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Feng had been secretary of the Heilungkiang Party Committee from 1960 until 1964 and vice-governor of Kiangsu province from 1964 until 1965 when he disappeared. He was reactivated in 1973 but had not been known to hold a post since.

FU TZU-HO 傅子和

Elected vice-chairman of the Shensi Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Fu had been a vice-governor of Shensi province before the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1977 he has been a member of the Shensi Provincial Party Committee's Standing Committee since.

HO CHING-CHIH 贺敬之

Identified as vice-minister of culture (NCNA Jan 14, 1978).

Ho is the playwright of the famous Chinese opera "The White-Haired Girl" which was banned by the "Gang of Four". His first reappearance after the Cultural Revolution was in December 1976.

HU PING-YÜN 胡炳云

Hu has the rank of a major-general in the PLA. Before the Cultural Revolution he was commander of the Shensi Military District, a post he was again given in July 1977.

HU SHANG-LI

Identified as secretary of the Honan Provincial Party Committee (Hengchou Radio Jan 1, 1978).

Hu was elected vice-chairman of the Honan Provincial Revolutionary Committee in December 1977.

JEN CHUNG-YI 任仲夷

Elected vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

Jen, a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP, had been first vice-chairman of the Liaoning Revolutionary Committee before his recent appointment.

JU FU-YI

Elected vice-chairman of the Szechuan Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 1, 1978).

Ju had been chief of staff of the Chengtu Military Region in 1960. The first time he was seen after the Cultural Revolution was in February 1977.

KU CHO-HSIN 顾卓新

Elected vice-chairman of the Anhui Provincial Revolutionary

Committee (NCNA Jan 24, 1978).

Ku had been vice-chairman of the State Planning Commission from 1958 until 1963 and secretary of the CCP Central Committee's Northeast Bureau between 1963 and 1967 when he disappeared. He was reactivated in June 1977 and sent to Anhui province by order of Hua Kuo-feng and the CCP Central Committee. In October 1977 he was identified as secretary of the Anhui Provincial Party Committee.

KU TA-CH'UN 顾大椿

Elected vice-chairman of the Hupei Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 5, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Ku had been a secretary of the All China Trade Unions (1957-1964), whose vice-chairman he became in 1966. Reactivated in 1973, Ku became Party secretary of the Hupei Provincial Party Committee in May 1977, and has been acting first Party secretary of Wuhan municipality since November 1977.

KUAN CHOU 关舟

Elected vice-chairman of the Heilungkiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Kuan had been a vice-governor of Heilungkiang province before the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1973 he became a member of the Standing Committees of the Heilungkiang Party Committee and Revolutionary Committee until he was elected vice-chairman of the latter.

LI CH'ENG-FANG 李成芳

Identified as first political commissar of the Wuhan Military Region Wuhan Radio, Jan 20, 1978).

Li, a lieutenant-general of the PLA, had been commander of the Kunming Military Region from 1965 until 1967. He was criticized in 1967 and disappeared. Reactivated in 1973, Li became minister of the Fifth Ministry of Machine-Building in January 1975, and was elected alternate member of the 11th CCP Central Committee in August 1977.

LI CHENG-TUNG

Elected vice-chairman of the Anhui Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 24, 1978).

Li was first identified as a member of that Committee's Standing Committee in 1969 and has been director of the Propaganda Department of the Anhui Provincial Party Committee since 1976.

LI LIN-CHIH 李林枝

Elected vice-chairman of the Szechuan Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 1, 1978).

Li had been a vice-governor of Szechuan province before the Cultural Revolution.

LI TZU-YÜAN 李子元

Elected vice-chairman of the Szechuan Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 1, 1978).

Li has been a secretary of the Szechuan Provincial Party Committee since January 1977, and was elected member of the 11th Central Committee of the Party in August 1977.

LIAO HAN-SHENG 廖汉生

Identified as first political commissar of the Nanking Military Region (Nanking Radio, Dec 8, 1977).

Liao is a PLA lieutenant-general and had been vice-minister of national defence before the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1974 he became political commissar of the Nanking Military Region in 1975 and was elected member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP in August 1977.

LIU FU-CHIH 刘复文

Identified as vice-minister of culture (NCNA Jan 29, 1978).

Liu had been vice-minister of public security between 1964 and 1972 when he disappeared.

LU TA-TUNG 鲁大东

Elected vice-chairman of the Szechuan Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 1, 1978).

Lu is a cadre of long standing in that province. Since 1975 he has been chairman of the revolutionary committee and first Party secretary of Chungking municipality. The 11th Party Congress elected him a member of the CCP Central Committee in August 1977.

MA CH'ANG-YEN 马长彦

Elected vice-chairman of the Anhui Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Ma had been a vice-governor of Anhui province. Reactivated in 1973 he was made a member of that province's revolutionary committee's Standing Committee.

MA HSING-YÜAN 马兴元

Elected vice-chairman of the Fukien Provincial Revolutionary Committee (Fuchou Radio Jan 11, 1978).

Ma has been secretary of the Fukien Provincial Party Committee since 1975. The 11th Party Congress elected him a member of its Central Committee in August 1977.

MA SZU-CHUNG 马思忠

Elected vice-chairman of the Revolutionary Committee of the Ninghsia Autonomous Region (NCNA Jan 2, 1978).

Ma who belongs to the Hui minority was a deputy for Ninghsia to the Third National People's Congress. The 11th Party Congress elected him an alternate member of the CCP Central Committee.

MU LIN 穆林

Elected vice-chairman of the Kirin Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 2, 1978).

Mu had been a cadre of Shantung province (vice-governor since 1964) until early in 1977 when he was ordered to Kirin province to become a member of the Kirin Party Committee's Standing Committee in the fall of that year.

PU TUNG-HSIU

Identified as vice-minister of education (NCNA Jan 30, 1978).

Pu is a newcomer who first appeared in public in Dec 1977.

SHEN T'U 沈图

Identified as director-general of the General Administration of Civil Aviation (NCNA Jan 30, 1978).

Shen had been a vice-director in the administration since 1961.

SUNG CHEN-T'ING 宋振庭

Elected vice-chairman of the Kirin Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 2, 1978).

Sung is a Kirin cadre of long standing. He was criticized in 1967 and disappeared to be reactivated in December 1977 as a member of the Kirin Provincial Party Committee's Standing Committee, - a post he had already held before the Cultural Revolution.

SUNG CHI-WEN 宋季文

Identified as vice-minister of light industry (NCNA Jan 26, 1978).

Sung had been deputy mayor of Shanghai City from 1957 until 1967 when he was ousted on the charge of being a counter-revolutionary. He was reactivated in December 1977 when he was elected president of Shanghai's Superior People's Court.

SUNG CHIH-KUANG 宋之光

Identified as assistant minister of the Affairs (NCNA Jan 12, 1978).

Sung has worked in the diplomatic service since 1970. His posts were: embassy counsellor in France (1970); ambassador to the German Democratic Republic (1970-1972); ambassador to Great Britain (1972-1977).

TAI WEI-JEN

Elected vice-chairman of the Kiangsu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Tai has been the director of the Propaganda Department under the Provincial Party Committee since 1973 and was made first vice-director of that province's Party School in October 1977.

TING FENG-YING (f) 丁凤英

Elected vice-chairman of the Hupei Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 5, 1978).

Ting has been chairman of the Hupei Women's Federation since 1973.

WANG FENG 汪锋

Identified as first secretary of the Sinkiang Party Committee, chairman of the Sinkiang Revolutionary Committee, first Party secretary of the Sinkiang Military Region, and first political commissar of the Sinkiang Military Region (Urumchi Radio Jan 29, 1978).

Wang had been a prominent cadre of the CCP before the Cultural Revolution. He was first Party secretary of the Ninghsia Autonomous Region's Party Committee between 1958 and 1960 and of the Kansu Provincial Party Committee between 1961 and 1966 when he was purged as a capitalist roader. He was reactivated in 1977 when he was

elected member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP. Since August 1977 he has held the post of first vice-chairman of the Sinkiang Revolutionary Committee, second Party secretary of that region and second political commissar of the Sinkiang Military Region.

WANG PING-SHIH 汪冰石

Elected vice-chairman of the Kiangsu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Wang had been vice-director of the Economic Commission of the Kiangsu People's Council in 1964. Reactivated in 1977, he was made a member of Kiangsu's CCP Standing Committee in December 1977.

WANG SHIH-T'AI 王世泰

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Wang had been an alternate member of the 8th Central Committee of the CCP and Party secretary of the Kansu Provincial Party Committee since 1961. Purged in 1967, he was reactivated in 1975 and elected member of the Standing Committee of the Fourth National People's Congress. The 11th Party Congress elected him member of the Central Committee in August 1977.

WANG YING-CHUNG 王应中

Elected vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

Wang had been chief of staff of the Liaoning Military District between 1965 and 1968.

WU EN 乌恩

Elected vice-chairman of the Inner Mongolia Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

Wu has been chairman of the Inner Mongolia Trade Unions since 1973.

YANG CH'ENG-WU 杨成武

Identified as commander of the Fuchou Military Region (Fuchou Radio Jan 12, 1978).

Yang is one of the ten deputy chiefs of staff of the PLA. He now occupies a post in Fuchou Military Region which had been vacant since the mysterious death of the former commander P'i Ting-chün in July 1976.

YANG CHING-JEN 杨静仁

Elected vice-chairman of the Ninghsia Revolutionary Committee; identified as deputy secretary of the Ninghsia CCP Committee (NCNA Jan 2, 1978).

Yang had been first Party secretary and chairman of the Ninghsia Autonomous Region before the Cultural Revolution. Purged in 1967 he was reactivated in August 1977 when he was elected member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP.

YÜ HUNG-LIANG 于洪亮

Elected vice-chairman of the Heilungkiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Yü has been chairman of the Heilungkiang Trade Unions and secretary of the Heilungkiang CCP Committee since 1973. In July 1977 he was elected a member of the 11th Central Committee of the CCP.

YÜ K'O 于克

Elected vice-chairman of the Kirin Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 2, 1978).

A vice-governor of Kirin province before the Cultural Revolution and ousted in 1967, Yü was reactivated in 1977 and has held the post of Party secretary of Kirin province since October 1977.

YÜ KUANG-YÜAN 于光远

Identified as vice-minister of the State Scientific and Technical Commission (NCNA Dec 22, 1977).

Yü had been director of the Science Department under the Propaganda Department of the 8th CCP Central Committee in 1958 and vice-chairman of the State Scientific and Technical Commission from 1964 until the Cultural Revolution when he disappeared. Yü was reactivated in 1975 but was not identified in any post until now.

### Deceased Cadre

YANG MEI-SHENG 杨梅生

died on Jan 9, 1978 (Canton Radio, Jan 17, 1978).

Yang was a lieutenant-general and held the post of a deputy commander of the Canton Military Region from 1970 until his recent death.

### Reactivated Cadres

AN CHIH-WEN 安志文

Elected vice-chairman of the Kirin Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 2, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution An served as vice-chairman of the State Capital Construction Commission (1957-1958) and as vice-chairman of the State Planning Commission (1958-Cultural Revolution).

CH'ANG CHIH-CH'ING 常芝青

Reactivated on Jan 17, 1978 (NCNA Jan 17, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Ch'ang had held a number of posts as follows: editor-in-chief of Ta Kung-pao (1958-1966); NPC deputy of Shansi province since 1964, and vice-chairman of the Journalists' Association.

CHANG CHIH-YÜAN 张知远

Elected vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

Chang had been vice-chairman of the Honan Provincial Trade Unions in 1966.

CHANG CHUNG-LIANG 张仲良

Elected vice-chairman of the Kiangsu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Chang had been an alternate member of the 8th Central Committee of the CCP, first Party secretary of Kansu province until 1960 and Party secretary of Kiangsu province in 1966. He disappeared soon after.

CHANG P'ENG-T'U 张鹏图

Elected vice-chairman of Inner Mongolia Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

Chang had been Party secretary and vice-governor of Kansu province before the Cultural Revolution.

CH'EN HAN-SHENG 陈翰笙

Before the Cultural Revolution Ch'en had held a number of posts as follows: vice-chairman of the People's Institute of Foreign Affairs (1958? -1965); deputy of Hopei province to the First, Second, and Third National People's Congresses; vice-chairman of the editorial staff of "China Reconstructs" (1959), and member of the Department of Philosophy and Social Sciences of the Academy of Sciences (1961-?).

CHANG SHIH-CHÜN 张世军

Elected vice-chairman of the Heilungkiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Chang had been director of the Forestry Department of the Heilungkiang Party Committee in 1960. In 1965 he was appointed vice-minister of forestry. He disappeared soon afterwards.

CHANG TSO-YIN 张祚阴

Elected vice-chairman of the Anhui Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 24, 1978).

Chang had been vice-governor of Anhui province before the Cultural Revolution.

CHAO CH'I 赵奇

Elected vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1977).

Chao had been vice-director of the Rural Work Department of the Liaoning Provincial Party Committee before the Cultural Revolution.

CHAO CHÜN 赵军

Elected vice-chairman of the Inner Mongolia Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

In 1959 Chao had been first Party secretary of the Southeast Region in Shansi province.

CH'EN KUANG 陈光

Elected vice-chairman of the Kiangsu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Ch'en had been a Party secretary of Kiangsu province before the Cultural Revolution and was then criticized.

CH'EN LEI 陈雷

Elected vice-chairman of the Heilungkiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Ch'en had been a vice-governor of Heilungkiang province before the Cultural Revolution.

CH'ENG KUANG-HUA 程光华

Elected vice-chairman of the Anhui Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 24, 1978).

Ch'eng had been a cadre of the Anhui Party Committee in 1959.

CHIANG HSI 姜诩

Elected vice-chairman of the Inner Mongolia Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

Chiang had been a cadre of the Ministry of Finance before the Cultural Revolution.

CHOU LI-P'Ö 周立波

Chou is the author of the novel "Hurricane". He was deputy of Hunan province to the First, Second and Third National People's Congresses and was criticized as a follower of Liu Shao-ch'i's in 1967.

FENG CHIH 冯直

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Feng had been Party secretary of Sian municipality before the Cultural Revolution.

FENG CHIH 冯至

Feng was a member of the Philosophy and Social Science Department of the Academy of Sciences and a council member of the Writers' Association before the Cultural Revolution. He took his doctor's degree at Heidelberg University with a thesis on Jean Paul.

FENG NAI-CH'AO 冯乃超

Feng was a vice-president of the Sun Yat-sen University before the Cultural Revolution.

HAN CHE-YI 韩哲一

Elected vice-chairman of the Shanghai Municipal Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 13, 1978).

Han had been an alternate secretary of the East Bureau of the CCP Central Committee from 1961 until the Cultural Revolution when he disappeared, to be reactivated now.

HAN YU-T'UNG (f) 韩幽桐

Han had been a prominent woman cadre before the Cultural Revolution. She held posts in the Women's League and the Women's Federation. She was also a council member of the World Peace Council until China left this Moscow-oriented organization in 1960.

HSÜ TAO-CH'I 许道琦

Elected vice-chairman of the Hupei Provincial Revolutionary

Committee (NCNA Jan 5, 1978).

Hsü had been a secretary of the Hupei Provincial Party Committee from 1958 until the Cultural Revolution when he disappeared.

HUI YÜ-YÜ 惠浴宇

Elected vice-chairman of the Kiangsu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Hui had been Party secretary and governor of Kiangsu province between 1955 and the Cultural Revolution when he was ousted.

JEN KUO-YI 任国义

Elected vice-chairman of the Shensi Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Jen was elected alternate member of the Communist Youth League in July 1964 and disappeared soon after.

JUAN CHANG-CHING 阮章竞

Juan had been editor of the monthly paper "Poetry" before the Cultural Revolution.

KE SHIH-YING 葛士英

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Ke had been vice-governor of Kansu province between 1959 and the Cultural Revolution.

LI CHUNG 黎中

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Li had been an alternate member of the Executive Council of the Trade Unions in 1963.

LI P'EI-FU 李培福

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Li had been a vice-governor of Kansu province between 1958 and the Cultural Revolution.

LIN MO-HAN 林默涵

Identified as vice-minister of culture (NCNA Jan 30, 1978).

Lin had been on the same post before the Cultural Revolution (since 1959). From 1961 onward he had also been vice-director of the Propaganda Department under the CCP Central Committee.

LIN SHAO-NAN (f) 林少南

Elected vice-chairman of the Hupei Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 16, 1978).

Lin is the widow of Chang T'i-hsüeh, governor of Hupei province before the Cultural Revolution, who died in 1973.

LIU P'ENG 刘鹏

Elected vice-chairman of the Shantung Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Liu had been director of the Miyün Dam Construction Bureau in 1960.

LU KUANG 鲁光

Elected vice-chairman of the Heilungkiang Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 7, 1978).

Lu had been vice-director of the Department for Industrial Work in the Heilungkiang Provincial Party Committee in 1960.

MA CHI-KUNG 马继孔

Elected vice-chairman of the Kansu Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Ma had been secretary of the Kansu Provincial Party Committee between 1965 and the Cultural Revolution when he disappeared.

MA HSIN 马信

Elected vice-chairman of the Ninghsia Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 2, 1978).

Ma had been vice-chairman of the Ninghsia Autonomous Region between 1964 and the Cultural Revolution.

MA YÜ-HUAI 马玉槐

Elected vice-chairman of the Ninghsia Revolutionary Committee (JAN 2, 1978).

Ma had been vice-chairman of the revolutionary committee and secretary of the Party committee of Ninghsia Autonomous Region since 1958. He also held the post of a vice-president of the Muslim League after the League had been founded. He was purged in 1967.

MENG CH'I 孟琦

Elected vice-chairman of the Inner Mongolia Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1978).

Meng had been deputy mayor of Paotou in 1961.

MENG CH'I-YÜ 孟启予

Identified as vice-director of the Peking Television Station (NCNA Jan 17, 1978).

Meng had been editor-in-chief of that station from 1961 onward and a member of the Journalists' Association Standing Committee from 1960 onward, and disappeared in the Cultural Revolution.

SHAO KUNG-WEN 邵公文

Shao had been director of 'Guozi Shudian' before the Cultural Revolution.

SHU T'UNG 舒同

Elected vice-chairman of the Shensi Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 8, 1978).

Shu had been first secretary of the Shantung Provincial Party Committee between 1955 and 1960 when he was dismissed for incorrectly carrying out policies of the Great Leap Forward and People's Communes. He was then made Party secretary in Shensi province and soon after disappeared completely from the scene.

SUN YEH-FANG 孙冶方

Sun had been vice-director of the State Statistical Office

until 1957 and director of the Institute of Economic Sciences under the Academy of Sciences between 1960 and 1966 when he was denounced as a revisionist.

SUNG CHIEH-HAN 宋潔涵

Elected vice-chairman of the Kirin Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 2, 1978); identified as deputy secretary of the Kirin Provincial Party Committee (Changchun Radio Jan 23, 1978).

Sung had been first Party secretary of the Changchun Party Committee since 1960 and alternate member of the Standing Committee of the Kirin Provincial Party Committee since 1965.

TS'AO CHING-HUA 曹靖华

Ts'ao is a writer.

WANG CHI-YÜAN 王纪元

Elected vice-chairman of the Liaoning Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 3, 1977).

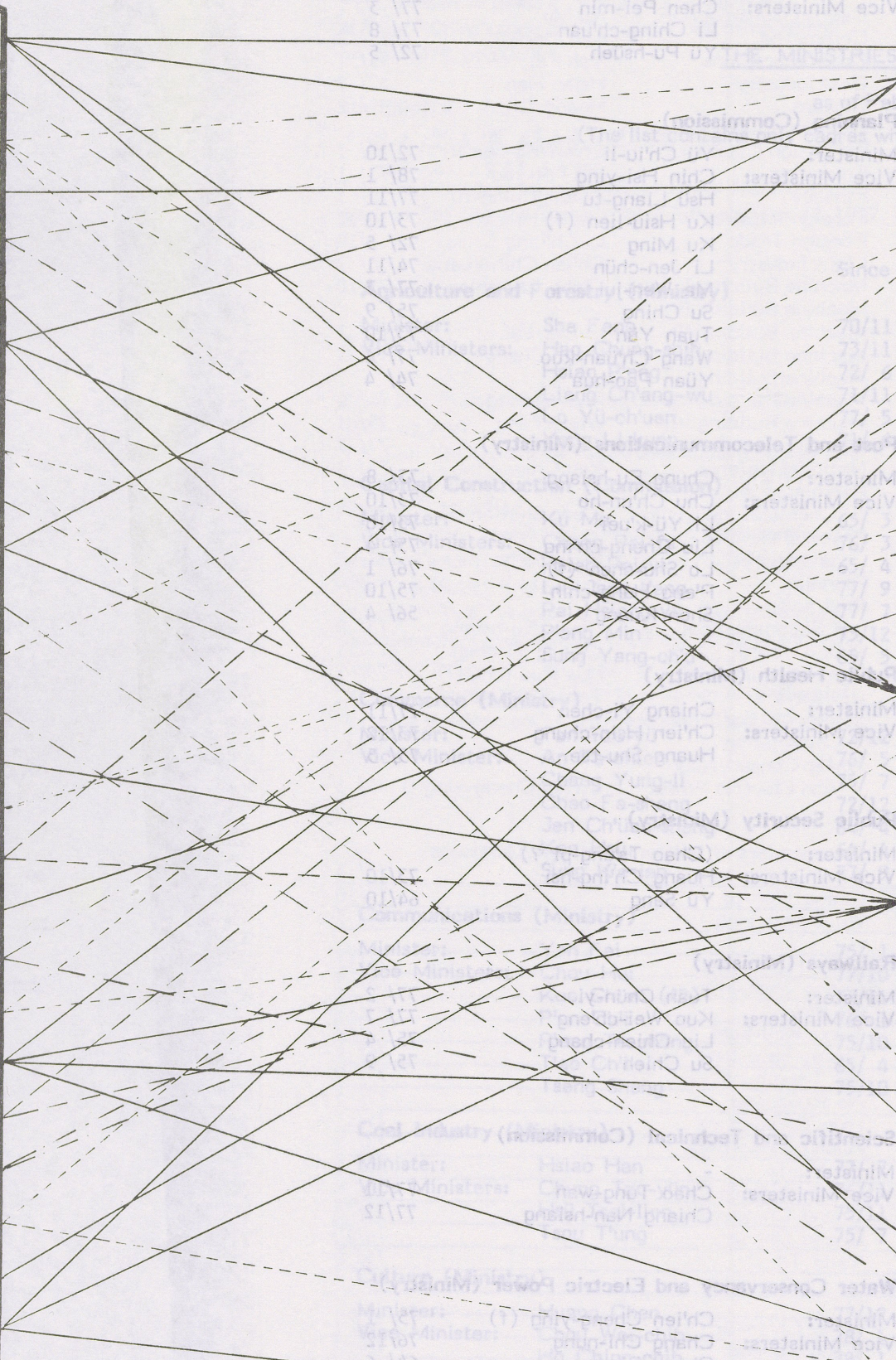
