16	JAPAN	Long-term trade agreement for the period from 1978 until 1985. During this period, the total amount of money for exports on each side will be 10.000 million US dollars (3). China will supply, during the five years to come, 47.1 million tons of crude oil, between 5.15 and 5.3 million tons of coke, and between 3.3 and 3.9 million tons of coal for fuel. Within the same period the Japanese enterprises concerned will export to China industrial plants worth between 7 and 8 billion US dollars and technical equipment worth between 2 and 3 billion dollars (4).

China's Economic Aid

February 1978

BURUNDI

The Mugere hydroelectric station is now underway with Chinese assistance. It is situated 15km south of Bujumbra. A dam 60 metres long and 10 metres high will be built to contain the water of a brook flowing at a velocity of 3.77 cubic metres per second. The water will be diverted through a tunnel into the station. The generating capacity of the station is to be 2,000 to 8,000 kW. It will supply enough power for Bujumbra consumption needs (NCNA Feb 15, 1978).

CONGO (Brazz.)

A Chinese agrotechnical team recently arrived in Congo. It will help the Congolese to build a centre to popularize farming techniques throughout the country (Peking Radio, Feb 3, 1978).

ETHIOPIA

The Chinese-aided diesel power station at Bonga, Kaffa administrative region, was handed over on Feb 15, 1978. With a capacity of 270 kW, it is the fourth completed station of eight to be built in the country (NCNA Feb 17, 1978).

Minutes of talks on the construction of the Addis Ababa gymnasium, which is to be built with Chinese assistance, were signed on Feb 21, 1978 (NCNA Feb 21, 1978).

GUYANA

The construction of the state-owned Sanata Textile Company situated in the southern part of Georgetown has been started in July 1976 (NCNA Feb 2, 1978).

NEPAL

10,000 Nepalese workers and technical personnel, together with Chinese technicians, are working on the South-North Gorkha-Narayanga highway in the hilly regions of Central Nepal. This is the fourth highway to be built with Chinese assistance. It links with Nepal's arteries, the Mahendra highway and the Prithvi highway. The surveying of this highway started late in 1976 and was completed three months

later. Though only 59 km long, the topographic and geological conditions in the region are very complicated (NCNA Feb 3, 1978).

After having seen off Teng Hsiao-p'ing, the Nepalese premier Kirti Nidhi Bista stated that three projects will be set up in Nepal with Chinese assistance: (1) a sugar refinery, (2) a paper mill (3) (no details given). (Kyodo Feb 7, 1978; cit. SWB 5734).

PAKISTAN

A programme has been set up for the training of Pakistanis by Chinese engineers in various technologies (Karachi Radio, Jan 16, 1978; cit. SWB/W 966).

In the North-West Frontier Province work on a glass factory near Naushehra is beginning in February. The factory will cost 45,000,000 rupees. Shipment of machinery for the factory from China is expected to begin in March. China will also train Pakistani technicians in the glass industry; 16 of them are to leave for China in mid-1978. The factory is to produce 50 tons of glass sheets daily (Karachi Radio, Feb 14, 1978; cit. SWB/W 969).

SIERRA LEONE

The Kambia highway bridge spanning the great Scarcies river near the border between Sierra Leone and Guinea was opened to traffic on Feb 17, 1978. The bridge forms a link in the Trans-African Highway. The construction of this bridge, which will be 360 metres long and 9 metres wide, began in March 1976, and was completed in January 1978. (NCNA Feb 18, 1978).

SUDAN

The Hassaheisa Friendship Textile Mill in Gezira Province built with Chinese aid was handed over on Feb 28, 1978 (NCNA Feb 28, 1978).

Personal Data

Known Cadres on New Posts

CHANG CHAO 张昭

Identified as vice-minister of the coal industry (NCNA Feb 22, 1978).

Chang had been a vice-minister of forestry before the Cultural Revolution. He was reactivated in 1975.

CHANG CHIEH-CH'ENG 张竭诚

Elected vice-chairman of the Sinkiang Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Feb 11, 1978).

Chang, a major-general, also holds the post of vice-commander of the Sinkiang Military Region. He was also (and probably still is) commander of the Sinkiang Production and Construction Corps.

CH'EN LEI 陈雷

Identified as secretary of the Heilungkiang CCP Committee (Harbin Radio, Feb 3, 1978).

Ch'en who was elected vice-chairman of Heilungkiang Revolutionary Committee only a month ago, had been vice-governor of Heilungkiang province before the Cultural Revolution.

CHIA HUI-SHENG

Identified as vice-minister of the coal industry (NCNA Feb 22, 1978).

Chia was identified on this post when he started for the Federal Republic of Germany as leader of a coal industry study group. Since 1976 he had been known as a cadre of the State Council.

FANG YI 方毅

Identified as minister of the Scientific and Technical Commission under the State Council (NCNA Feb 3, 1978).

Fang, a member of the Political Bureau of the 11th CCP Central Committee, is at the same time vice president of

the Academy of Sciences.

HAMDINNYAS

Elected vice-chairman of the Sinkiang Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Feb 11, 1978).

Hamdinnyas became known in August 1977 when he was referred to as first Party secretary of Urumchi.

HAN CHE-YI 韩哲一

Identified as secretary of the Shanghai CCP Committee (Shanghai Radio, January 27, 1978).

Han was elected vice-chairman of the Shanghai Revolutionary Committee only two weeks before the above publication.

HO PING-CHANG 贺秉章

Identified as vice-minister of the coal industry (NCNA Feb 22, 1978).

Ho held the same post before the Cultural Revolution. In 1975 he was reactivated to become director of the Scientific Coal Research Institute in Peking.

HSIA YEN 夏衍

Identified as vice-chairman of the China-Japan Friendship Association (NCNA Feb 4, 1978).

Hsia is one of the few Chinese poets still alive. He was purged during the Cultural Revolution and reactivated as late as October 1977.

LI CHIEN-PAI 李剑白

Identified as secretary of the Heilungkiang Party Committee (Harbin Radio, Feb 3, 1978).

Li had been on the same post before the Cultural Revolution. Since 1976 he has also held the post of Party secretary of Harbin.

LI YI-CHANG 李毅章

Elected vice-chairman of the Kiangsi Revolutionary Committee

(NCNA Feb 20, 1978).

Li has been a member of the Standing Committee of the Kiangsi Party Committee since October 1977.

TENG YÜEH 邓岳

Identified as deputy commander of the Nanking Military Region (Hangchou Radio, January 27, 1978).

Teng was known to hold the same post in the Shenyang Military Region in the fall of 1977.

TEMÜR DAWAMAD 铁木·达瓦买提

Elected vice-chairman of the Sinkiang Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Feb 11, 1978).

Temür held the post of a vice-chairman of the Sinkiang Autonomous Region before the Cultural Revolution and was elected member of the Standing Committee of Sinkiang Revolutionary Committee in 1970. He then disappeared and was not reactivated until 1976.

WANG SHIH-KUANG 王士光

Identified as vice-minister of the Fourth Ministry of Machine Building (NCNA Feb 21, 1978).

Wang had held the same post before the Cultural Revolution. He was reactivated in 1975.

YANG SHOU-SHAN 杨寿山

Identified as secretary of the Peking CCP Committee (Peking Radio, Feb 13, 1978).

Yang who had been a vice-minister of the First Ministry of Machine-Building before the Cultural Revolution, has held the post of a vice-chairman of the Peking Revolutionary Committee since 1973.

Reactivated Cadres

BURHAN SHAHIDI 包尔汉

Burhan came to Peking to attend the CPPCC session (NCNA Feb 23, 1978).

He had held several posts before he was purged in the Cultural Revolution, the most prominent of which was that of chairman of the Islamic League.

CHAI HSI-WU 翟翥武

Elected vice-chairman of the Chekiang Revolutionary Committee (Hangchou Radio, Feb 21, 1978).

Chai had been director of the Chekiang Light Industry Office before the Cultural Revolution.

CHANG CHIA-SHU 张家树

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Chang was purged in the Cultural Revolution. He had previously been bishop of the Shanghai Diocese.

CHANG LIEN-K'UEI 张连奎

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Chang had been vice-minister in various ministries before the Cultural Revolution: in the Second until 1959, in the Third 1960-1963, and in the Fifth 1963 until Cultural Revolution.

CHANG SU 张苏

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Chang who was purged during the Cultural Revolution had held the following posts before he disappeared: alternate member of the 8th CCP Central Committee, vice-resident of the Supreme People's Court (1954), member of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress (1959), and deputy chief procurator of the Supreme People's Procuratorate.

CHANG TA-YÜ 张大煜

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Chang was purged during the Cultural Revolution. He had held the following posts before: director of the Petroleum Institute under the Academy of Sciences (1958); director of the Institute of Chemical Physics, Academy of Sciences (1964), and vice-chairman of the Chemical Association of China.

CHAO FANG-HSIUNG 赵访熊

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Chang had been vice-president of Tsinghua University between 1962 and the Cultural Revolution when he was purged.

CH'EN YEH-P'ING 陈野萍

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Ch'en was denounced as a counterrevolutionary revisionist in March 1967., after having been vice-president of the North Kiangsu College of Agriculture.

CHIA-MU-YANG LO-TSANG-CHIU-JO T'U-TAN-CH'UEH-CHI-NI'MA 嘉木样·罗藏久著·土丹却吉尼玛

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

This 'Living Buddha' had been vice-chairman of the Chinese Buddhists' League and chairman of the Buddhist League of Kansu province before he disappeared in the Cultural

Revolution.

CHIANG TING-HSIEN 江定仙

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Chiang was vice-director of the Central Conservatory before being purged during the Cultural Revolution.

CHOU CHIH-HUNG 周志宏

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Chou, an expert in metallurgy, was vice-president of Chiao-tung University between 1962 and 1964, when he disappeared.

FENG TE-P'EI 冯德培

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Feng, a disciple of A.V.Hill, Adrian, and Myerhoff, was director of the Institute of Physiology under the Academy of Sciences. He disappeared in the Cultural Revolution.

FU CHENG-YI 傅承义

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Fu is a brother of the former vice-president of Peking University. Before the Cultural Revolution in which he disappeared, he had been secretary-general of the Geophysical Society.

HO TS'E-HUI 何泽慧

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Ho became known as an expert of radiation at the Institute of Physics under the Academy of Sciences.

HSI CHUNG-HSÜN 羽仲勳

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Hsi, a member of the 8th CCP Central Committee and vice-premier since 1959, disappeared in 1962.

HUANG YEN 黄岩

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Huang held the post of governor of Anhui province in the decade preceding the Cultural Revolution. He was then purged.

KAO WEN-HUA 高文华

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC

(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Kao had been vice-minister of the light industry (1952-1957) and of the ministry of aquatic products (1957-1965).

K'E LIN 柯麟

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution K'e had been chairman of the Medical Association and director of the Chungshan Medical College, Kuangtung province. He was purged in July 1966

K'UNG HSIANG-CHEN 孔祥楨

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Before being denounced as a "big renegade" in June 1967, K'ung had been in a number of prominent positions, viz. e.g. vice-minister of communications (1957-1960), vice-minister of the light industry (1960-1965), and vice-minister of the First Ministry of the Light Industry (1965 until Cultural Revolution).

KUO YING-CH'IU 郭影秋

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Kuo was vice-president of the Peking People's University before he disappeared in the Cultural Revolution. Having reappeared just once in 1972, he was not heard of again until in the above position.

LI CH'U-LI 李初梨

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Li, who had graduated at the No.1 High School of Tokyo and was editor-in-chief of 'Literature and Art News' in the late twenties, became a major-general at the end of the Communist Revolution. He then worked as a cadre in propaganda and organization. The last post he had held before he was denounced as a renegade in June 1967 was that of a vice-director of the Department of Organization of the CCP Central Committee.

LI PO-NING 李伯宁

Identified as vice-minister of water conservancy and electric power (NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Li held the post of a vice-director of the Capital Construction Department of the same ministry in 1958.

LI SHIH-CHANG 李世璋

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Li had been vice-minister of supervision (1954-1959) and vice-governor of Kiangsi province (1962-Cultural Revolution).

LI WEI-HAN 李维汉

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Li a member of the 8th CCP Central Committee, who was denounced as a counterrevolutionary revisionist in June 1967, was a prominent communist cadre before this event. Among the most important posts he then held were that of a director of the United Front Department of the CCP Central Committee (1944-1965) and that of vice-chairman of the First, Second and Third National People's Congresses.

LIU HSIAO 刘晓

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Liu had been an alternate member of the 7th and a member of the 8th CCP Central Committee. Before the Cultural Revolution he had been one of the most prominent figures in the diplomatic service, his various appointments being ambassador to Moscow (1955-1962), vice-minister of foreign affairs (1963-1967), and ambassador to Albania (1967). In May 1968 he was denounced as a counterrevolutionary element.

MENG MU-TI 孟目的

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Meng had been chairman of the Pharmaceutical Society of China.

NIEH CHEN 聂真

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Nieh had been vice-president of the Peking People's University and vice-director of the Peking Institute of Socialism.

PA TAI 巴岱

Elected vice-chairman of the Sinkiang Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Feb 11, 1978).

Pa, a Mongol, had been chairman of the Bayin Gol Autonomous Chou before the Cultural Revolution.

PANCHEN ERDENI CHHOEKYI-GYALTSAN 班禅额尔德尼

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 1978).

P is a 'Living Buddha'. He was vice-chairman of the First through Third National People's Congresses (see also this C.a. number, Übersicht No.18 p.112).

T'AN CHIA-CHEN 谈家桢

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution T'an, a known geneticist, had been vice-president of Fudan University.

T'ANG HUNG-KUANG 唐宏光

Identified as vice-chairman of the Heilungkiang Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Feb 23, 1978).

T'ang had been a case of Heilungkiang province before the Cultural Revolution.

T'AO SHU-TSENG 陶述曾

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

T'ao had been vice-chairman of the Society of Civil Engineering before the Cultural Revolution.

TS'AI PANG-HUA 蔡邦华

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Ts'ai, an entomologist, had been vice-chairman of the Society of Plant Protection and vice-director of the Institute of Entomology under the Academy of Sciences before the Cultural Revolution.

WANG CHIEN-MING 王鉴明

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Wang had been director of the Sugar Cane Research Institute.

WANG FU 王甫

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Wang had been vice-director of the Department of Organization of the CCP Central Committee and secretary of the Northwest China Bureau.

WANG TS'UNG-WU 王从吾

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 25, 1978).

Wang, a member of the 8th CCP Central Committee, who was purged in May 1967 as a 'three-anti element, had been president of the Higher Party School between 1961 and 1967.

WENG WEN-P'O 翁文波

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Weng had been a vice-chairman of the Geophysical Society.

WU HSIEN-WEN 伍献文

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Wu had been vice-director of the Institute of Hydrobiology under the Academy of Sciences and director of the Institute of Limnology under

the Academy of Sciences.

WU HSÜEH-CHIH 吳雪之

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Wu had been a vice-
minister of commerce before the Cultural Revolution.

WU WEN-CHÜN

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Wu, who returned from the USA in 1950, had been vice-
director of the Department of Mathematics under the
Academy of Sciences before the Cultural Revolution.

YANG SHIH-HSIEN 楊石先

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Yang had been chairman of the Chemical Society and
director of the Institute for Organic Chemistry of the
Elements at Nankai University.

YÜ CHIEH 喻杰

Member of the National Committee of the 5th CPPCC
(NCNA Feb 24, 1978).

Before the Cultural Revolution Yü had been vice-minister
of the food industry (1954-1961) and of commerce
(1962-1963).

Elected vice-chairman of the Sinkiang Revolutionary Com-
mittee (NCNA Feb 11, 1978).

PAI CH'ENG-MING 白成銘

Die Entwicklungen in Ost- und Südostasien stehen im Brennpunkt der Weltpolitik: Der Konflikt zwischen Moskau und Peking wie die innerpolitischen Ereignisse in China selbst, die Rolle Japans als wirtschaftliche Großmacht, das Ringen um die Zukunft Südostasiens nach dem Sieg der kommunistischen Bewegungen in Vietnam, Kambodscha und Laos, der wachsende Zusammenschluß der "Association of Southeast Asian Nations" (ASEAN) reichen in ihrer Bedeutung weit über die engeren regionalen Grenzen hinaus und haben auch auf die deutsche Außenpolitik und Wirtschaft maßgeblichen Einfluß gewonnen.

Die am 6. März 1967 in Bonn gegründete Deutsche Gesellschaft für Ostasienkunde e.V. hatte bereits versucht, durch die Verbindung der traditionellen Wissenschaft wie Sinologie und Japanologie mit sozialwissenschaftlichen Disziplinen und Fragestellungen zu einer wissenschaftlich fundierten Interpretation der Gegenwart Ostasiens beizutragen. Im Frühjahr 1977 schlossen sich ihr eine größere Zahl deutscher Südostasienwissenschaftler an, was auf der am 16. April 1977 in Königstein/Taunus tagenden Mitgliederversammlung zu einer Änderung des Namens der Gesellschaft und der Einrichtung von getrennt arbeitenden wissenschaftlichen Beiräten für China, Japan, Korea und Südostasien führte.

Die Aufgaben der Deutschen Gesellschaft für Ost- und Südostasienkunde e.V., die ausschließlich und unmittelbar gemeinnützige Zwecke verfolgt, sind u.a.

- das Studium des gegenwärtigen Ost- und Südasiens zu fördern und wissenschaftlich gesicherte Kenntnisse von der Region zu verbreiten,
- den Austausch ost- und südostasienbezogener wissenschaftlicher Informationen, Erfahrungen und Ideen zu beleben,
- die Zusammenarbeit der an Ost- und Südostasien interessierten Personen und Institutionen auf nationaler und

internationaler Ebene aus

Wirtschaft
Kultur
Wissenschaft
zu intensivieren.

Die Ziele der Gesellschaft sollen unter anderem erreicht werden durch Tagungen, Vorträge, Ausstellungen und Informationsveröffentlichungen sowie die Förderung des Austausches mit ost- und südostasiatischen Ländern. Die Gesellschaft bemüht sich in diesem Sinne auch um Kontakte zu Massenmedien.

Es ist das Anliegen der Gesellschaft, durch den Zusammenschluß eines weiten repräsentativen Kreises von Persönlichkeiten aus dem politischen, wirtschaftlichen und kulturellen Leben eine verstärkte Beteiligung auch der Bundesrepublik am Gedankenaustausch über das heutige Ost- und Südostasien zu erreichen.
