## China's Economic Aid

JANUARY 1977

### AFGHANISTAN

Part of the Parwan irrigation project was put into operation at the end of December 1976 (NCNA Jan 3, 1977). The construction of this project had started in 1974 (NCNA Sep 27, 1974). The project includes trunk canals, a hydroelectric station, and a pumping station. The water from the Panjsher river flows through the canals to irrigate some 25,000 hectares of land in the dry Parwan plain and is supplied as drinking water for the local people. The construction of branch canals is now underway (NCNA Jan 3, 1977).

### ALBANIA

The Elbasan metallurgical combine went into operation at the end of October 1976 (NCNA Oct 25, 1976). Work on this project had been started in October 1971 (NCNA Oct 18, 1977). It is one of the greatest projects in Albania's 5th Five-Year Plan and enables the country to produce steel for the first time (NCNA Oct 25, 1977).

### BANGLADESH

An agreement on economic and technical cooperation was signed on January 4, 1977 (NCNA Jan 4, 1977).

### CONGO (Brazzaville)

The Chinese medical team works in the hospitalization centres in the towns of Talangai and Makelekele (NCNA Jan 4, 1977).

### ETHIOPIA

The PRChina is now assisting in the Maichew water-supply project. 27 wells have so far been drilled in a dozen of medium and small towns. One year ago fresh water was found more than 70 metres beneath the surface of the Maichew valley and two wells were sunk, each supplying 520 tons of water daily. The water supply project was taken in hand in February 1975 (NCNA Oct 13, 1976).

### LAOS

The construction of a waterworks system, which was built with the assistance of a group of Chinese specialists and workers, was concluded recently. The construction work had begun in early 1976 and the system is now in operation in Phong Saly provincial town (Vientiane Radio Jan 6, 1977; cit. SWB/W 912).

### NIGER

A Chinese cement works survey team was working at Malbaza in October 1976 (NCNA Oct 4, 1976).

### PERU

A Chinese plateau wheat study group visited Peru at the invitation of the Ministry of Food and Nutrition. During their 30-day visit the Chinese wheat experts toured Huancaayo, Acacucho and Cusco, the main wheat-growing areas

of Peru, as well as the Lima agricultural experiment station (NCNA Jan 9, 1977).

### SIERRA LEONE

The construction of the Kambia highway bridge across the Great Scarcies river is under way now. Construction work began in March 1976, immediately on completion of the Mange highway bridge of the same type (NCNA Oct 13, 1976).

Joint efforts have been made by technicians of Sierra Leone and China in the rice-growing technical stations at Lambyama, Newton and Kabala in the past few years to popularize techniques of rice cultivation. For the past two years the Lambyama station has guided 24 units in five counties of the district in opening up over 240 hectares of land and digging 43,000 metres of canal to resist floods and drought. The three agro-technical stations were handed over to Sierra Leone on January 29, 1977 (NCNA Jan 30, 1977).

### TOGO

The Chinese medical team ended the second training class for doctors in acupuncture on Oct 12, 1976. It had run for four months, starting on June 8, 1976 (NCNA Oct 12, 1976).

### TUNISIA

The Chinese medical team and Tunisian medical workers held a joint symposium on acupuncture and stomatic diseases at the "Aziza Othmana" hospital (NCNA Jan 30, 1977).

### VIETNAM

A book-printing factory constructed with Chinese assistance was completed recently. It can print 3,000 million pages annually in Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, English, and French. Since early April it has printed 300,000,000 pages of textbooks for students in the 1976/77 school year (Hanoi Radio, Dec 10, 1976; cit. SWB/W 912).

A glassware factory built with Chinese assistance with an annual output of 1,500 tons of syringes, bottles and other glassware for medical use was recently inaugurated and put into operation in Hai Hung (Hanoi Radio, Dec 31, 1976; cit. SWB/W 911).

The medical glass tubing factory, newly built with Chinese assistance in Chi Linh County, Hai Hung province, was inaugurated on Dec 30, 1976. The construction work started in July 1972 and was completed on Dec 1, 1976, when the factory went into trial production (NCNA Dec 31, 1976).

A group of Chinese experts was decorated with orders and medals for their contributions to the restoration, transformation and expansion of the Ha Bac power station (VNA Jan 15, 1977; cit. SWB 5415).

### ZAIRE

A new group of Chinese experts for the construction of the "People's Palace" arrived in Kinshasa (NCNA Jan 3, 1977). The construction of the palace began in November 1975 (NCNA Nov 21, 1975).

## Personal Data

### Known Cadres on New Posts

CH'EN MU-HUA (f) 陈慕华

Identified as minister for economic relations with foreign countries (NCNA Jan 13, 1977).

Ch'en has been vice-minister of the same ministry since 1973. A member of the CCP Central Committee since 1973, she has now succeeded Fang Yi as minister (see below).

CH' IEN CHI-CHEN 钱其琛

Identified as director of the Foreign Ministry's Information Department (NCNA Jan 14, 1977).

Ch'ien's former appointments:

1960-1962: Second Secretary at the Chinese embassy in Moscow

1974-1976: Ambassador to Guinea and to Guinea-Bissau (until 1975)

CHIN CHAO-TIEN 金昭典

Identified as secretary of the Fukien Party Committee (Fuchou Radio Jan 14, 1977). Before the Cultural Revolution, Chin had been a deputy of the National People's Congress for Hupei province.

CH'IN HO-CHEN 秦和珍

Identified as secretary of the Shantung Party Committee and as vice-chairman of the Shantung Revolutionary Committee (Tsinan Radio Jan 9, 1977).

Ch'in had been a member of the Standing Committee of Shantung's Party Committee since 1973.

FAN FA-YÜAN 樊发源

Identified as editor-in-chief of Hsinhua Daily (NCNA Jan 10, 1977), Fan had been identified as a member of the Journalists Association's Standing Committee in 1960.

FANG YI 方毅

Identified as vice-president of the Chinese Academy of Sciences (NCNA Jan 26, 1977).

Fang, a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1973, had been minister for economic relations with foreign countries from 1969 to 1976.

HUO SHIH-LIEN 霍士廉

Identified as First Secretary of the Ninghsia Party Committee and as chairman of the Ninghsia Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 26, 1977).

Before the Cultural Revolution Hua had been First Secretary of the Shensi Party Committee and was purged in 1967. Re-activated in 1973, he then became secretary of the Shensi Party Committee and vice-chairman of that province's Revolutionary Committee.

KUO WEI-CH'ENG 郭维城

Identified as deputy commander of the PLA's Railway Corps (NCNA Jan 2, 1977).

Kuo had been on that post before the Cultural Revolution. He was purged and not reactivated until 1974.

LI JIH-NAI 厉日耐

Identified as secretary of the Shantung Party Committee and as vice-chairman of the Shantung Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Jan 9, 1977).

Li, a vice-chairman of Shantung's Peasants' Association since 1975, had been elected alternate member of the CCP Central Committee in 1973.

LI PAO-HUA 李葆华

Li had been referred to as chairman of the Kueichou Revolutionary Committee in the January issue of C.a., in accordance with an announcement of Kueiyang Radio. This must have been an error, as Keuiyang Radio (Jan 7, 1977) mentioned him on his old post as vice-chairman.

LI TZU-YÜN 李子元

Identified as secretary of the Szechuan Party Committee (Chengtu Radio Jan 3, 1977), Li had been secretary-general of the Kuangtung Party Committee and was purged during the Cultural Revolution. He was reactivated in 1975, and mentioned as a cadre in Szechuan.

LIN HU-CHIA 林乎加

Identified as secretary of the Shanghai Party Committee and as vice-chairman of the Shanghai Revolutionary Committee (Shanghai Radio, Jan 26, 1977).



Lin had been referred to as a cadre of the State Council in 1974.

LIU HSI-YAO 刘西尧

Identified as minister of education (NCNA Jan 29, 1977).

Liu, an alternate member of the Central Committee of the CCP since 1969, had been minister in the Second Machine-Building Ministry since 1975.

LUNG FEI-HU 左飞虎

Identified as deputy commander of the Fuchou Military Region, Lung became first known as a cadre of that region in 1972.

WANG YI-P'ING 王一平

Identified as secretary of the Shanghai Party Committee (Shanghai Radio Jan 26, 1977).

Wang is a vice-chairman of the Shanghai Revolutionary Committee since 1972.

YANG FU-CHEN (f) 杨富珍

Identified as member of the Standing Committee of the Shanghai Party Committee (Shanghai Radio, Jan 26, 1977).

Yang, an alternate member of the CCP Central Committee since 1973 (having been a full member before the 1973 Party Congress) has been a vice-chairman of Shanghai's Revolutionary Committee since 1970.

YEN YU-MIN 严佑民

Identified as secretary of the Shanghai Party Committee and as vice-chairman of the Shanghai Revolutionary Committee (Shanghai Radio Jan 26, 1977).

Yen had been a vice-minister of public security before the Cultural Revolution.

YÜ SANG 于桑

Identified as vice-minister of public security (Changsha Radio Jan 18, 1977).

Yü, a member of the CCP Central Committee, has been on this post since 1964 but this was the first time after the Cultural Revolution that he was mentioned again in this position.

### Deceased Cadres

K'ANG CHIEN-MIN 康健民

Died on January 18, 1977 (NCNA Jan 26, 1977).

K'ang was first Party secretary and chairman of the Revolutionary Committee of the Ninghsia Autonomous Region.

Besides, he was an alternate member of the Central Committee of the CCP. K'ang was the first of the 124 alternate members now in office to die.

LIN LI-JU 林砺儒

Died on January 20, 1977 (NCNA Jan 29, 1977).

Lin had been a vice-minister of education between 1958 and 1966 when he was purged. Reactivated in 1974, he has not been identified on a new post.

CHIAO JO-YÜ 焦若愚

Recalled from his post as ambassador to Peru (NCNA Jan 3, 1977).

HAO TE-CH'ING 郝德青

Recalled from his post as ambassador to Iran (NCNA Jan 15, 1977).

LIN CHUNG 林中

Recalled from his post as ambassador to Mozambique (NCNA Jan 21, 1977).

LIU SHU-CHING 刘述卿

Recalled from his post as ambassador to Poland (NCNA Jan 9, 1977).

P'ENG HUA 彭华

Appointed ambassador to Guinea (NCNA Jan 24, 1977).

P'eng had been a vice-director of the Foreign Ministry's Information Department since 1971 to become its director in 1972 - a post he held until the summer of 1974 when he disappeared from the public eye.
