AFGHANISTAN

The contract with China for the purchase of equipment required for the second stage of the Parwan irrigation project worth over 810,100 £ sterling, was signed on June 29. The equipment which will be supplied within the next six months will be purchased with a loan supplied by China (Kabul Radio, Jun 30, 1977; cit. SWB/W 937).

ALGERIA

A new hospital was inaugurated on June 12 in Saida, capital of Saida Department in Western Algeria. The hospital has 520 beds, a laboratory and an out-patient department. The Algerian minister of public health received the Chinese medical team in Saida and expressed satisfaction with its work (NCNA Jun 13, 1977).

BURUNDI

The construction of a textile complex, with Chinese aid, is under way in Bujumbura (NCNA Jun 23, 1977).

CONGO (Brazzaville)

On June 18, an agreement on economic and technical cooperation was signed (no details) (NCNA Jun 18, 1977).

EQUATORIAL GUINEA

A protocol was signed on May 31 on the despatch of a new Chinese medical team to Equatorial Guinea (NCNA Jun 3, 1977).

GUINEA

A Chinese agro-technical group left Guinea for home after having completed its mission (no details given) (NCNA Jun 7, 1977).

GUINEA BISSAU

The minutes of a meeting on the construction of a water conservancy project on the Udunduma River with Chinese assistance were signed on June 10 (NCNA Jun 14, 1977).

MADAGASCAR

The "Tely" state farm machine repair and assembly plant at Andranomena on the outskirts of Tulear in Southern Madagascar, built with Chinese aid, was inaugurated on June 24. The construction of the plant began in March 1976. At the start of its operation, it will produce ploughs, hoes and harrows for the local peasants. Later on, it will make spare-parts for tractors and trucks (NCNA Jun 25, 1977).

MAURITANIA

An agreement was signed on June 29 relating to the building of a port in Nouakchott (NCNA Jun 29, 1977).

MOZAMBIQUE

A Chinese agro-technical team is working on the establishment of the Moamba state farm, 90 kilometres northwest of Maputo. Within no more than six months, 230 hectares of land were reclaimed, 50 hectares of vegetables and 50 hectares of maize were cultivated, and 600 tons of vegetables were gathered (NCNA June 20, 1977).

NIGER

One part of the Chinese medical team is working at the central hospital of Maradi province (NCNA Jun 23, 1977).

PAKISTAN

China and Pakistan have signed an agreement on setting up a big textile mill at Tarbela, costing more than 60 million rupees and having 25,000 spindles. The complete textile plant and machinery will be supplied by China (Karachi Radio Jun 2, 1977; cit. SWB 5530). According to a statement made by the Pakistan Minister of Production, a mini steel mill at (? Naukundi) in Baluchistan will be set up soon in collaboration with China (Karachi Radio Jun 28, 1977; cit. SWB/W 937).

RWANDA

The minutes of talks on cooperation in developing a rice-

cultivation project at Rubindi were signed recently (NCNA Jun 11, 1977).

SIERRA LEONE

A graduation ceremony for the third group of agro-technicians graduating from the Makali Agricultural Training Course was held in Makali in the Northern Province on June 2. The training course was initiated with the assistance of the Chinese agro-technical team in 1976. The graduates have mastered the basic know-how of rice-cultivation after five months' of study. (NCNA Jun 4, 1977).

SOMALIA

An agreement on economic and technical cooperation was signed on June 23 (no details given) (NCNA Jun 23, 1977).

SUDAN

An agreement on economic and technical cooperation was signed on June 9 (no details given) (NCNA Jun 9, 1977).

UPPER VOLTA

The minutes of a meeting signed on June 4 provide for the building of a stadium in Ouagadougou to accommodate 35,000 spectators (NCNA Jun 7, 1977).

VIETNAM

The Bac Ha insecticide-sprayer factory was inaugurated on June 28 in Ha Son Binh province. Built with Chinese aid, the factory - the first of its kind in Vietnam - can produce 100,000 friendship brand sprayers a year (NCNA Jun 29, 1977).

YEMEN , Arab Republic

Under an agreement signed on June 7, China is to send a new medical team. The last team departed on June 4 (NCNA Jun 4, 1977).

The Sanaa - Sada highway was opened to traffic on June 14. It is 244 kilometres long, covered with asphalt, and links the capital of Sanaa with the important city of Sada in the north of the country (NCNA Jun 14, 1977). The construction of the road started in September 1967 (NCNA Sept 26, 1967).

ZAIRE

On June 1, minutes of talks were signed under which China will render assistance to build a station in Mbanza-Ngungu to encourage rice production. China will provide farm machinery for opening up 600 hectares of rice fields and will help build water conservancy projects for the paddy fields. A Chinese agro-technical group has been in Zaire since 1973 to help the peasants of nine agricultural centres to learn all about rice-growing (NCNA Jun 3, 1977).

Before, Ch'en had been a deputy secretary of that Committee.

CH'EN WEI-TA 陈 伟达

Identified as secretary of the Chekiang CP Committee (Hangchou Radio, Jun 2, 1977).

Before, Ch'en had been a deputy secretary of that Committee. He also holds the post of a vice-chairman of the Chekiang Revolutionary Committee.

CHENG KUO-CHUNG 郑 国仲

Identified as commander of the East China Sea Fleet (NCNA Jun 20, 1977).

Cheng was identified as a rear admiral in 1964. He disappeared during the Cultural Revolution and was reactivated in 1975.

HO CH'ENG 贺 诚

Identified as vice-director of the PLA Logistics Department (NCNA Jun 17, 1977).

Ho, on a comparable post in the Chengtu Military Region in 1965, is a lieutenant-general. He disappeared during the Cultural Revolution and was reactivated in 1973.

HSIAO HUA 肖 华

Identified as first political commissar of the Lanchou Military Region and as secretary of the Kansu CP Committee (Lanchou Radio Jun 19, 1977).

Hsiao, a colonel-general, member of the 8th Central Committee of the CCP and director of the PLA's General Political Department until the Cultural Revolution, was reactivated in 1974. In May he had been made political commissar of the Lanchou Military Region and has been promoted to the post of first political commissar in that region now.

LIU FU-SHENG

Identified as secretary of the Hunan CP (NCNA Jun 3, 1977).

Liu had been a member of the Standing Committee and secretary-general of the Hunan CP Committee before.

MAO CHIH-YUNG 毛 致用

Identified as first secretary of Hunan CP Committee, chairman of the Hunan Revolutionary Committee (Changsha Radio Jun 6, 1977), and first political commissar of the Hunan Military District (Changsha Radio, Jun 15, 1977).

Mao did not enter the political scene until 1973 when he was identified as secretary of the Hunan CP Committee in August and as a vice-chairman of Hunan's Peasants' Association. He has now succeeded Hua Kuo-feng as first Party secretary in Hunan who had still been nominally holding that post although he was mentioned there for the last time in February 1973.

SUN YI-CH'ING 孙 轶青

Identified as deputy editor-in-chief of JMJP (NCNA Jun 6, 1977).

Sun was editor-in-chief of Ch'ing-nien pao (Daily Youth) from 1958 (?) until 1962, and held posts in the Communist Youth League and the Journalists' Association until the Cultural Revolution. Reactivated in 1975, he became editor-in-chief of "Peking Daily" a post which he is possibly still holding.

SUNG P'ING 宋 平

Identified as first secretary of Kansu CP Committee, chairman of the Kansu Revolutionary Committee, first political commissar of Kansu Military District (Lanchou Radio Jun 19, 1977), and second political commissar of Lanchou Military Region (Lanchou Radio Jul 4, 1977).

Before the Cultural Revolution Sung had been secretary-general of the Taiyuan CP. After a long period of absence, he became secretary of the Kansu CP Committee and vice-chairman of that province's revolutionary committee in 1973. He is now successor to one of the most prominent posts in Kansu province to Hsien Heng-han who was purged for having managed, in a luke-warm manner, the campaign against the Gang of Four and their followers.

WAN LI 万 里

Identified as first secretary of the Anhui CP Committee, chairman of the Anhui Revolutionary Committee and first political commissar of Anhui Military District (Hofei Radio Jun 25, 1977).

Wan had been minister of building construction between 1952 and 1958 and minister of urban construction between 1956 and 1958 to become a Party secretary and vice-mayor of Peking afterwards. Denounced as a "reactionary bourgeois" in December 1966, he was reactivated in 1971 when he was elected member of the Standing

Committee of the Peking CP Committee. Elevated to the position of Party secretary in November 1974, he was appointed minister of railways in January 1975. After the Tien-an-men incident he again disappeared from the political scene in April 1976 to show up again at the Peking May festival in 1977.

WANG CH'ÜAN-KUO 王 全 国

Identified as vice-minister of the State Planning Commission (NCNA Jun 16, 1977).

Wang grew up in the Fourth Field Army to hold different minor posts in Central South China until the Cultural Revolution. He became vice-chairman of Kuangtung's Revolutionary Committee in 1975 and member of that province's CP Standing Committee in February 1977.

Hsiao was born in Hsingkuo (Kiangsi province, in 1914 (1915?) as the son of a bricklayer. At the age of between 11 and 13 he was already working for the Communist Party of China and was made a member of the Party in December 1928. Afterwards he was a CCP youth cadre in his home hsien. When Mao Tse-tung stayed in Hsingkuo in March 1929, a seminar was founded there where Hsiao, too, was given his first political training. In the same year he joined the Red Army. During the years preceding the Long March, Hsiao successively held the posts of a director of the youth division of the First Red Army Group, head of the Youth Division of the General Political Department of the Red Army and political commissar of the Young Communists' Division which formed part of the Fifth Red Army Group. During the Long March he was head of the Youth Division of the Political Department of the First Route Army which formed the vanguard of the Communist units during the March. In April 1936 he was appointed commander and political commissar of the second division of the First Route Army stationed in Kansu. A short while afterwards he was badly wounded. In 1938 he was appointed political commissar of the 343rd brigade of the 115th Division of the 8th Route Army. Four months later he became commander of the Shantung-Hopei border area. In March 1939 he was made political commissar of the 115th Division which shortly afterwards occupied West Shantung. Hsiao was then appointed chairman of the West Shantung Administrative Office as well as commander and political commissar of the Shantung Military Region. At the end of the Sino-Japanese War, Hsiao became political commissar of the Liaotung Military Region in 1946, and in October 1948 he was made political commissar of the 12th Army Group which was commanded by Hsiao Ching-kuang. In April 1949 Hsiao was elected member of the Central Committee of the Youth League, one month later he was made member of the Central Committee of the Democratic Youth Association. In July 1949 he led a delegation of the Democratic Youth Association to attend the second Congress of the World Federation of Democratic Youth in Budapest where he was elected Council member.

1962 After the reorganization of the Central Control Commission, Hsiao was identified as one of its members, as member of the Standing Committee and as deputy secretary of the Commission (until about 1964)
1964, Sep Appointed director of the General Political Department of the People's Liberation Army (until the Cultural Revolution)
1965, Jan Appointed member of the National Defence Council (until the Cultural Revolution)
1967, Jan Identified as vice-chairman of the Cultural Revolutionary Group of the PLA (that group was founded in August 1966 under the leadership of Liu Chih-chien who was purged in November 1966). Other vice-chairmen of the Cultural Revolutionary Group, then led by Hsü Hsiang-ch'ien, were Yang Ch'eng-wu, Wang Hsin-t'ing, Hsü Li-ch'ing, Kuan Feng, Hsieh T'ang-chung and Li Man-ts'un. Chian Ch'ing, Mao Tse-tung's wife, was acting as "advisor" to the Cultural Revolutionary Group, i.e. she was the one in charge of the group. It was Chiang Ch'ing, too, who made sure that Hsiao Hua was purged by accusing him, before a group of rebels on Jan 19, 1967, that he had not subjected himself to self-criticism in connection with Liu Chih-chien's fall
Aug Hsiao was denounced for being a follower of Liu Shao-ch'i, for having pursued the Liu Shao-ch'i-Teng Hsiao-p'ing line which made the Party enter the military establishment, for having criticism of Liu Shao-ch'i inside the PLA, for having defended P'eng Te-huai (minister of national defence until 1959), and for having referred to Lo Jui-ch'ing as the best Chief of General Staff
1974, Sep First appearance after the Cultural Revolution
1977, May Identified as political commissar of the Lanchou Military Region
Jun Identified as first political commissar of the Lanchou Military Region
