China's Economic Aid

October 1977

CAMEROON

An agreement on economic and technical cooperation was signed on October 7, 1977 (NCNA Oct 7, 1977).

CONGO (Brazzaville)

The Chinese medical team left for home (NCNA Oct 20, 1977).

GAMBIA

The first Chinese medical team arrived on October 10, 1977 (NCNA Oct 15, 1977).

MADAGASCAR

The Chinese medical team left for home after having completed its term of service (NCNA Oct 16, 1977).

MOROCCO

The first Chinese medical team concluded its service at the Hassan II Hospital in the Settat province while another team has arrived (NCNA Oct 8, 1977).

NIGER

A training class on Chinese acupuncture therapy was inaugurated in Niamey in the presence of the leader of the Chinese medical team (NCNA Oct 25, 1977).

PAKISTAN

A specialized refractory project is to be set up near Abbotabad with Chinese assistance (Karachi Radio Oct 17, 1977; cit. SWB/W 953).

SAO TOME AND PRINCIPE

A Chinese agro-technical team gave assistance in the development of the Diogo Nunes state farm in the suburbs of Sao Tome city which concentrates on rice-growing (NCNA Oct 10, 1977).

SIERRA LEONE

The second Chinese medical team completed its mission at the Rotifunk hospital in the Southern province while the third team has arrived (NCNA Oct 23, 1977).

SOMALIA

The second section of the Belet Uen-Burao highway was opened to traffic. It is the 228km Galcaio-Garowe section. The first section was transferred to the Somali government on November 15 last year (NCNA Oct 20, 1977).

The Chinese medical team ended its term of service while a new one has arrived (NCNA Oct 31, 1977).

SUDAN

Chinese experts who explored the (Alanqas Na?) region in the Blue Nile district for chromium ore between 1974 and mid-1977 have submitted a report to the Sudanese Ministry of Energy and Mining. Studies made will help the Chinese experts to establish a chromium industry in the region (SUNA Oct 1, 1977); cit. SWB/W 951).

A Chinese medical team concluded its mission while a new one has arrived (NCNA Oct 5, 1977).

TANZANIA

The Mbarali state farm which was constructed with Chinese aid was handed over on October 4, 1977. It covers an area of 8,000 acres of land with a complete irrigation system, a 320 kilowatt hydro-electric power station, a farm tools repair shop, a rice-mill as well as units of poultry, piggery and dairy. Rice is the major crop of the farm, which turned out 12,000 tons of rice this year, one third of the amount of state purchases of rice (NCNA Oct 6, 1977).

The farm is located in the plain of Usangu in Mbeya region, 700 km west of Dar es Salaam. It has more than ten combines and dozens of trucks. The rice-mill can process 10,000 tons of rice annually. The water-conservancy projects include a dam, 60 metres long and seven metres high, across the Mbarali river, 1,400 canals and ditches and 11,000 culverts. In the newly-cultivated land the average per acre output of rice has steadily risen from 2,400 kg in 1974 to 3,300 kg in 1977. The rice output of reformed land in the old farm has doubled (NCNA Oct 7, 1977).

VIETNAM

The Ha Bac nitrogenous fertilizer factory, the first of its kind, was inaugurated on October 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 30, 1977). The factory was built with Chinese assistance. Completed and

put into operation in 1965, the factory was seriously damaged by US bombing. Restoration and expansion of the factory began in June 1973 and was completed in August 1976 (NCNA Oct 6, 1977).

The No.2 Viet Nam cotton printing and dyeing mill in Vinh Phu province was inaugurated on October 19, 1977. The construction of the mill started in 1973. It was completed in October 1977, with an annual output of 50 million metres of cloth (NCNA Oct 20, 1977). This Chinese-built textile combine ranks among the biggest in Vietnam (VNA Oct 19, 1977; cit. SWB/W 953).- The inauguration ceremony was attended by Chiao Shan-min, vice-minister of the Chinese Ministry of Light Industry (NCNA Oct 17, 1977).- This modern textile mill is located in Viet Tri city and was built on 23 hectares of land since September 1973. It consists of four major workshops for spinning, weaving, printing and dyeing and repairing, with a total floor space of 70,000 square metres. In 1976, the workers produced 3,000 tons of yarn and 9.4 million metres of qualified cloth (NCNA Oct 27, 1977).

YEMEN, PEOPLE'S DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC (South)

The completion of the Mahfid-Mukalla highway was marked at a ceremony on October 15, 1977. Construction started in January 1974. 325 km in total length, the highway links the Ain-Mahfid highway built with Chinese aid, goes through the

third, fourth and fifth provinces of the country and links the cotton and cereal-producing third and fifth provinces with Aden. The new highway has more than 70 bridges and 600 tunnels; 3,316,800 cubic metres of earth and stone had to be moved for its construction.- The hand-over ceremony took place in the presence of Yeh Fei, Chinese minister of communications.

At the same time, minutes of talks on the construction of the Shihr-Sayhut highway were signed. The construction of the highway, which will be more than 200 km long, will begin as soon as the surveying work is completed (NCNA Oct 16, 1977).

ZAIRE

A new Chinese medical team has replaced the last one in Ibibandaka, capital of the Equatorial Region of Zaire (NCNA Oct 11, and 26, 1977).

Personal Data

Known Cadres on New Posts

CHANG AI-P'ING 张爱萍

Identified as deputy chief of staff of the PLA (NCNA Oct 6, 1977).

Chang has been chairman of the Science and Technology Commission for National Defence since 1975, and was elected member of the CCP Central Committee two months ago.

CHAO SHOU-YI

Identified as secretary of the Anhui CCP Committee (Hofei Radio Oct 16, 1977).

Chao is one of several persons who, by a special directive of Hua Kuo-feng's, was delegated to Anhui province in June 1977.

CH'EN HSIEN-JUI 陈先瑞

Identified as political commissar of the Chengtu Military Region (NCNA Oct 20, 1977).

Ch'en is a military leader of long standing. He was political commissar of the Peking Military Region before his recent appointment in Chengtu. Having been a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1969, the 11th Party Congress degraded him to alternate membership.

CHIA CHIU-MIN 贾久民

Identified as vice-chairman of the Fukien Revolutionary Committee (Fuchou Radio Oct 2, 1977).

Chia had been a Party secretary of the Fukien CCP Committee before the Cultural Revolution, and was not reactivated until this year.

CHIANG YI 姜一

Identified as secretary of the Shensi CCP Committee (Sian Radio, Oct 13, 1977).

Chiang had been in an identical position in Hupei province since 1971 before he was called to Shensi.

CHIN CHAO-TIEN 金昭典

Identified as a vice-chairman of the Fukien Revolutionary Committee (Fuchou Radio Oct 15, 1977).

Having been a cadre of Hupei province before the Cultural Revolution, Chin was reactivated in 1976 to become a secretary of the Fukien CCP Committee in January this year.

CHOU TZU-CHIEN 周子健

Identified as minister of the First Ministry of Machine-Building (NCNA Oct 7, 1977).

Chou had been a vice-minister of that ministry since 1960. He was elected alternate member of the CCP Central Committee at the recent 11th Party Congress.

HSIANG CHUNG-HUA 向仲华

Identified as political commissar of the Canton Military Region (Canton Radio Oct 1, 1977).

Hsiang, an alternate member of the CCP Central Committee since 1973, with the military rank of a lieutenant-general, had been a deputy chief of staff of the PLA since 1972.

HU LI-CHIAO 胡立教

Identified as second secretary of the Honan CCP Committee (Chengchou Radio Oct 26, 1977).

Hu, a vice-minister of finance and acting president of the People's Bank before the Cultural Revolution, was reactivated in 1974 to become a deputy secretary of the Honan Provincial Party Committee in 1975. He was elected member of the CCP Central Committee by the 11th Party Congress recently.

HU YAO-PANG 胡耀邦

Appointed vice-president of the CCP Central Committee's Party School (NCNA Oct 8, 1977).

Before the Cultural Revolution Hu, the first secretary of the Communist Youth League, was the leading youth cadre in People's China. Reactivated in 1972, he was elected member of the CCP Central Committee (having already been a member under the 8th Party Congress). As Hua Kuo-feng, president of the newly reactivated Party School, and Wang Tung-hsing, its first vice-president, are believed to be nominal holders of their respective posts, Hu may be regarded as its acting president.

HUA KUO-FENG 华国锋

Nominated president of the Party School under the CCP Central Committee (NCNA Oct 9, 1977). (see also Hu Yao-pang above).

KU CHO-HSIN 顾卓新

Identified as secretary of the Anhui CCP Committee (Hofei

Radio Oct 17, 1977).

Like Chao Shou-yi, Ku was also delegated to Anhui province in June 1977 by a special directive of Hua Kuo-feng and the Central Committee. Before the Cultural Revolution Ku had been vice-chairman of the State Planning Commission (until 1963) and secretary of the Northeast Bureau of the CCP Central Committee (until 1967).

K'UNG SHIH-CH'UAN 孔石泉

Identified as second political commissar of the Chengtu Military Region (NCNA Oct 12, 1977).

K'ung, a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1969, was last mentioned in the same position in the Canton Military Region on September 30, 1977.

LI CH'I 李琦

Identified as vice-minister of education (NCNA Oct 24, 1977).

Li had been a vice-minister of culture between 1964 and 1966 when he disappeared. Reactivated in 1973, he was a cadre of the Group for Science and Education under the State Council and has been identified as a cadre of the Ministry of Education since 1975.

LI YAO-WEN 李耀文

Identified as political commissar of the Scientific and Technological Commission for National Defence (NCNA Oct 14, 1977).

Li, a former major-general, was ambassador to Tanzania from 1972 until 1976, at the time when the Tan-Zam Railway was built. The 11th Party Congress elected him an alternate member of the CCP Central Committee in August 1977.

LIU CHÜN-HSIU 刘俊秀

Identified as vice-chairman of the Kiangsi Provincial Revolutionary Committee (Nanchang Radio Oct 29, 1977).

Liu had been a member of that Provincial Party Committee's Standing Committee before his appointment to vice-chairmanship.

TAI SU-LI 戴苏里

Identified as secretary of the Honan Provincial Party Committee (Chengchou Radio Oct 22, 1977).

Tai had been a member of the Standing Committee in the same Provincial Party Committee beforehand, and is also a vice-chairman of the Honan Provincial Revolutionary Committee. The 11th Party Congress elected him alternate member of the CCP Central Committee in August 1977.

TING KUO-YÜ 丁国钰

Identified as third secretary of the Peking Municipal Party Committee (NCNA Oct 12, 1977).

Having been ambassador to Afghanistan (until 1958) and Pakistan (until 1966), Ting was ordered to Peking after the purge of P'eng Chen. He had held the post of Party secretary there since 1971, and has been a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1973.

WANG CH'ENG-HAN 王诚汉

Identified as deputy commander of the Chengtu Military Region (Chengtu Radio Oct 10, 1977).

Wang is a major-general, and was deputy commander of the Tibet Military Region before the Cultural Revolution. He disappeared in 1966, and was reactivated in January 1977.

WANG CHIN-SHAN 王金山

Identified as secretary of the Hopei Provincial Party Committee (NCNA Oct 15, 1977).

Wang had been a member of that Party Committee's Standing Committee before his new appointment, and is also a vice-chairman of the Hopei Provincial Revolutionary Committee. The 11th Party Congress elected him alternate member of the CCP Central Committee in August 1977.

WANG HUI 王辉

Identified as a secretary of the Honan Provincial Party Committee and a vice-chairman of that province's Revolutionary Committee (Chengchou Radio Oct 28, 1977).

Wang had been a member of the Standing Committee of the Honan Provincial Party Committee since 1971 and disappeared in February 1974. In January this year he was reactivated to become commander of the Engineering Corps of the Wuhan Military Region and third Party secretary of the Chengchou Railway Bureau.

WANG LIN 王林

Identified as secretary of the Shensi Provincial Party Committee and as first secretary of the Party Committee of Sian, capital of Shensi province. (Lanchou Radio Oct 4, 1977).

Wang had been a secretary of the Shensi Party Committee before the Cultural Revolution and disappeared in 1966. He was reactivated in September 1976.

WANG P'ING 王平

Identified as first political commissar of the Wuhan Military Region (NCNA Oct 27, 1977).

Wang, a colonel-general, had been a political commissar of the same Military Region beforehand. The 11th Party Congress elected him a member of the CCP Central Committee in August 1977.

WANG TUNG-HSING 汪东兴

Identified as first vice-president of the Party School under the CCP Central Committee (NCNA Oct 9, 1977). (see also Hu Yao-pang).

WU CHUNG 吴忠

Identified as a leading military person in Canton Military Region (Canton Radio Oct 1, 1977).

Wu, an alternate member of the CCP Central Committee since 1969, had been deputy commander of the Peking Garrison since 1974.

WU K'E-HUA 吴克华

(WU K'E-HUA continued)

Identified as commander of the Chengtu Military Region (Chengtu Radio Oct 10, 1977).

Wu, a lieutenant-general and commander of the PLA Artillery before the Cultural Revolution, was purged in connection with the Wuhan Incident in August 1967. Reactivated in 1974, he was elected alternate member of the 11th Central Committee in August 1977.

YANG WAN-HSÜAN 杨万选

Identified as vice-chairman of the Szechuan Provincial Revolutionary Committee (Chengtu Radio Oct 10, 1977).

Yang was a vice-governor and Party secretary of Szechuan province before the Cultural Revolution. He disappeared in 1967 and was reactivated in 1975.

YANG YUNG 杨勇

Identified as deputy chief of staff of the PLA (NCNA Oct 4, 1977).

Yang, a colonel-general and military leader of long standing, was commander of the Sinkiang Military Region from 1973 until August 1977. In the same month, the 11th Party Congress elected him member of the Central Committee of the CCP again.

YEN CHENG 严政

Identified as political commissar of the Wuhan Military Region (NCNA Oct 27, 1977).

Yen had held the same post in the Chengtu Military Region from 1975 until May 1977.

YEN CHIN-SHENG 颜金生

Identified as a vice-director of the PLA General Political Department (NCNA Oct 10, 1977).

Yen comes from Sinkiang Military Region where he had held the post of deputy political commissar from January 1976 until August 1977.

YÜ MING-TAO 于明涛

Identified as a vice-chairman of the Shensi Provincial Revolutionary Committee (NCNA Oct 30, 1977).

Yü had been on an identical post in Hunan province where he also held the posts of Party secretary and of first Party secretary of Changsha, capital of Hunan province. He was elected member of the 11th Central Committee by this year's Party Congress.

New Cadres

CHOU HUI

Identified as vice-minister of communications (NCNA Oct 23, 1977).

WANG CHI-CHUN

Identified as Party secretary and vice-chairman of the Revo-

lutionary Committee of Kiangsi province (Nanchang Radio Oct 18, 1977).

Deceased Cadre

LIN FENG 林枫

died on September 29, 1977 (NCNA Oct 8, 1977).

As president of the Party School under the CCP Central Committee, Lin had been one of the most prominent Chinese cadres in the period before the Cultural Revolution. In April 1967 he was denounced as an accomplice of Liu Shao-ch'i and not rehabilitated during his lifetime, but only posthumously.

Reactivated Cadres

CH'ANG CH'I-LUNG 张启龙

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Ch'ang had been an alternate member of the 8th Central Committee of the CCP, vice-director of the Organization Department of the Central Committee and (since July 1963) a member of the 'Standing Committee of the National People's Congress (since December 1964).

CHANG WEI-CHEN 张维桢

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Chang had been a secretary of the Chinese Trade Unions from 1961 until early in 1967 when he was eliminated.

CHAO P'ENG-FEI 赵鹏飞

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Chao had been a deputy mayor of Peking (1960-1963), director of the State Housing Administrative Bureau (1962-Cultural Revolution) and deputy secretary-general of the National People's Congress (1963 until Cultural Revolution). He was denounced as a counterrevolutionary revisionist in May 1967 and purged.

CHIA CHEN 贾震

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Chia had been a vice-president of the Party School under the CCP Central Committee from 1963 until the Cultural Revolution.

CHOU YANG 周扬

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Chou had been an alternate member of the 8th Central Committee of the CCP and vice-director of the Central Committee's Propaganda Department since 1957, having been one

of the most active Communist writers. In July 1966 he was denounced as a leftist opportunist and purged.

FANG CHIH-CH'UN 方志纯

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Fang had been governor of Kiangsi province since September 1965. He was denounced as an agent of China's Krushchev in Kiangsi in October 1967 and purged.

HSIA YEN 夏衍

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Hsia used to be one of Communist China's most prominent writers and playwrights. He held many posts, the highest being that of a vice-minister of culture (1954-1965). He was criticized before the Cultural Revolution, in May 1965, and finally purged in 1966.

HUANG HUO-CH'ING 黄火青

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Huang had been an alternate member of the 8th CCP Central Committee, first Party secretary of Liaoning province (since 1958) and secretary of the Northeast Bureau of the CCP Central Committee. Severely criticized in 1966, he was purged in January 1967.

HUNG HSÜEH-CHIH 洪学智

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Huang had been a colonel-general and alternate member of the 8th CCP Central Committee. As director of the General Rear Services Department of the PLA he got involved in the case of P'eng Te-huai in 1958, and disappeared.

KAN WEI-HAN 甘渭汉

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977).

Kan, a lieutenant-general, had at one time been director of the Cadre Department under the General Political Department of the PLA, his last post in 1967 being that of third political commissar of the Chengtu Military Region. He was purged on the charge of being an anti-Mao-Lin element.

KAO YI 高沂

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Kao had been a vice-president of Tsinghua University (since 1962) and vice-minister of higher education (since 1965), until he disappeared in 1966.

LI TENG-YING 李登瀛

Identified as a vice-chairman of the Shensi Provincial Revolutionary Committee (Sian Radio Oct 13, 1977).

Li had been vice-director of the State Office of Agriculture

and Forestry (1956-1960) and was appointed director of the Farmwork Department of the Northwest Bureau of the CCP Central Committee in 1966. Soon afterwards he disappeared.

LIU TIEH-SHAN

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Liu was a vice-chairman of the Central Song and Dance Ensemble in 1960.

SHEN HUNG 沈鸿

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 30, 1977).

Liu had been a vice-minister of the electrical equipment industry (in 1957), of the coal industry (1957-1959), of the agricultural machinery industry (1959-1961) and of the First Ministry of Machine-Building (1961 until the Cultural Revolution).

TS'AI JO-HUNG 蔡若虹

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Ts'ai, a painter, had been vice-chairman of the Union of Chinese Artists (since 1953) and deputy for Kiangsi province to the Third National People's Congress. In January 1967, he was denounced as being the anti-Party boss in the field of fine arts.

WAN YI 万毅

First reappearance after the Cultural Revolution on September 30, 1977 (NCNA Oct 1, 1977).

Wan was an alternate member of the 8th CCP Central Committee and a lieutenant-general. He was given several appointments in the central military leadership: member of the National Defence Council (1954-1956); member of the State Scientific Planning Commission (1957-1958), director of the Department of Military Equipment under the PLA's General Logistics Department (1958) and vice-chairman of the Scientific and Technological Association (1958-1967). In 1967 he was accused of being a trusted follower of P'eng Te-huai and purged.
