Known Cadres on New Posts

AN FA-CHIEN 安法乾

Identified as vice-minister of commerce (NCNA May 21, 1976).
Now reactivated. Before the Cultural Revolution he had been a vice-minister of food industry.

AN KANG 安岗

Identified as deputy editor-in-chief of Jen-min Jih-pao (NCNA May 5, 1976).
Reactivated in January this year. Before the cultural revolution, An had held the same post from 1960 till 1965 and that of a secretary of the Journalists' Association from 1960 till 1966.

CHANG CHUNG 张忠

Chang, commander of the Kansu Military District, vice-chairman of the Kansu Revolutionary Committee and secretary of the Kansu CP until mid 1975 when he disappeared, was identified as "a leading cadre" in Kueichou province (Kueiyang Radio May 2 and 14, 1976).

CH'EN MAO-HUI 陈茂辉

Identified as 3rd political commissar of the Kiangsu. Military District (NCNA May 20, 1976).

Ch'en, who was recently reactivated and is a major-general of the PLA, had been a leading military cadre in the Kiangsu Military District before the cultural revolution.

CHIAO HSIAO-KUANG 乔晓光

Identified as 2nd secretary of the Kuangsi Autonomous Region's Party Committee (Nanchang Radio, May 20, 1976).

Chiao has held the post of CP secretary in this region since 1974 and that of a vice-chairman of the Kuangsi Revolutionary Committee since 1973.

CH'IH PI-CH'ING 池必卿

Identified as second secretary of the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region's Party Committee and as a vice-chairman of that region's Revolutionary Committee (Huhehot Radio, May 2 and 9, 1976).

Ch'ih had been first secretary of Taiyuan (1956), CP secretary of Shansi province (1958-1967), and secretary of the CC CCP North China Bureau (1966-1967) before the cultural revolution.

HO T'ING-YI 何迺一

Identified as deputy commander of the PLA Air Force (NCNA May 30, 1976).

Reactivated in January this year, Ho, a major-general of the PLA Air Force, had been deputy chief of staff of the Air Force from 1965 until the cultural revolution.

HSI CHIN-WU

Identified as commander of the Tibet Military District (Lhasa

Radio May 8, 1976).

Hsi was identified as deputy commander of the Tibet Military District in February 1975, and later succeeded Ch'en Ming-yi, the former commander, who disappeared in September 1975.

KAO HOU-LIANG 高厚良

Identified as deputy political commissar of the PLA Air Force (NCNA May 30, 1976).

Kao was reactivated in July 1974. In 1964 he had been a major-general in the Nanking Military Region.

KAO WEI-SUNG 高维嵩

Identified as deputy political commissar of the Lanchou Military Region (Lanchou Radio, May 5, 1976), a post he had already held before the cultural revolution. Kao, a major-general, was elected member of the 9th Central Committee of the CCP but not reelected to the 10th in 1973.

LIAO PU-YÜN 廖步云

Identified as a leading cadre in Szechuan province (Chengtu Radio May 11, 1976).

As deputy commander of Tibet Military Region Liao was elected vice-chairman of the Tibet Revolutionary Committee on its foundation in 1968. He had temporarily disappeared in 1969.

TENG HSING-KUO 邓兴国

Identified as vice-chairman of Szechuan's trade union (NCNA April 9, 1976).

Teng has been a vice-chairman of Szechuan's Revolutionary Committee since its establishment in 1968.

WANG HUAN-JU 王隼如

Identified as member of the Standing CP Committee of Chengtu Military Region (Chengtu Radio, May 11, 1976).

This is the second time that a CCP committee of a military region has been mentioned.

WANG T'I 王体

Identified as vice-chairman of the Shansi Revolutionary Committee (NCNA May 15, 1976).

Wang, an alternate member of the 10th Central Committee of the CCP, used to hold the post of chairman of the trade union of Shansi province.

WU TSUNG-SHU 吴从树

Identified as a member of the Anhui CCP standing committee (Hofei Radio, May 8, 1976).

Wu has been chairman of the Anhui trade union since June 1973, alternate member of the 10th Central Committee of the CCP since August of the same year, and a member of the standing committee of the 4th National People's Congress since January 1975.

WU YÜ-TE

Identified as a member of the Liaoning CCP standing committee and as first CCP secretary of Shenyang (Shenyang Radio, May 15, 1976).

Wu is an alternate member of the 10th Central Committee of the CCP, having been elected thereto in August 1973, and has been a chairman of Anhui trade union since April 1974.

YANG HSI-KUANG 杨西光

Identified as vice-chairman of Shanghai's Revolutionary Committee (NCNA May 5 and 11, 1976).

Yang, who was reactivated recently, had been vice-president of Fudan University since 1964 and alternate secretary of the Central Committee of Shanghai since 1965. He was purged as a revisionist in December 1967.

YANG TA-YI 杨大为

Identified as a leading military cadre in the Shenyang Military Region or in the Liaoning Military District.

Yang, an alternate member of the 10th Central Committee of the CCP, had been commander of the Hunan Military District until mid-1975 when he was succeeded by T'ung Kuo-kuei.

New Cadres

CHU CHIANG

Identified as a member of the standing committee of Kiangsu CCP and as CCP secretary of Nanking (Nanking Radio, May 16, 1976).

LIU FU-SHENG

Identified as a member of the standing committee of Hunan CCP (Changsha Radio May 25, 1976).

Deceased Cadres

LI TA-CHANG 李大章

Died on May 3, 1976 (NCNA May 8, 1976).

Li is the 13th member of the 10th Central Committee of the Chinese Communist Party who died since it was constituted in August 1973. His posts included that of party secretary and vice-chairman of Szechuan Provincial Revolutionary Committee and of 2nd political commissar of the Chengtu Military Region.

T'AN CHEN 谭真

Died on May 7, 1976 (NCNA May 17, 1976).

Before the cultural revolution T'an had been vice-minister of communications and vice-chairman of the Society of Civil Engineering. He was reactivated in 1973 but was not known to hold any posts since.

CH'EN CH'ANG 陈强

Recalled from the post of consul in Zanzibar (see Liu Hsü-chi).

USA Thomas Sovereign Gates, jr., arrived as new chief of the US Liaison Office in Peking (NCNA May 6, 1976).

LIU CHEN-HUA 刘振华

Called back from his post as ambassador to Albania (NCNA May 29, 1976).

LIU CH'UN 刘春

Identified as ambassador to Tanzania (NCNA May 13, 1976).

Liu's previous appointments:

1961, Nov. Deputy chief of China's Economic and Cultural Mission in Khang Khay (Laos)
1962, Sept. Ambassador to Laos (until about 1970)
1971, Aug. Director of the Foreign Ministry's Asia Department
1972, May Ambassador to Turkey (until March, 1976)

LIU HSÜ-CHI 刘胥奇

Identified as consul in Zanzibar (NCNA May 10, 1976).

Liu was chargé d'affaires ad interim in Finland between 1969 and 1972.

LIU YING-HSIEN

Identified as ambassador to Sao Tome and Principe (NCNA May 15, 1976), also holding the ambassador's post in Gabon.

Liu's previous appointments:

1964, Aug. First secretary at the embassy in Congo (Brazz.)
1972, Mar. Chargé d'affaires ad interim at embassy in Congo (Brazz.)
1974, Aug. Ambassador to Gabon (a post he still holds).

LÜ CHIH-HSIEN 吕志先

Called back as ambassador to Congo (Brazz.) (NCNA June 1, 1976).

TUNG CHÜN-MIN 董俊民

Identified as commercial counsellor at the embassy in Moscow (NCNA May 21, 1976).

Tung had been commercial attaché at the embassy to Romania between 1956 and 1962.

WANG HAO 王浩

Identified as chargé d'affaires ad interim in Luxembourg (NCNA May 13, 1976).

Wang's previous appointments:

1972 Embassy counsellor in South Yemen
1973, Oct. Embassy counsellor in Luxembourg
1974, Aug. Chargé d'affaires ad interim in Belgium

WEI YUNG-CH'ING 韦永清

Identified as ambassador to Turkey (NCNA May 29, 1976).

Wei's previous appointments:

1962, June Assistant director, Protocol Department, Foreign Ministry (until March 1965).
1965, Sept. Chargé d'affaires ad interim in Mauritania (until November 1967)
1971, Sept. Member of the Council of the Foreign Affairs Institute
1972, June Chargé d'affaires ad interim in Ghana

China's Economic Aid

MAY 1976

BENIN

A project relating to the cultivation of 80 hectares of rice fields has been completed in Mono province, and was handed over on May 11 (NCNA May 13, 1976)

BURMA

The first stage of the expansion project of the Meiktila textile mill was put into operation on May 3, 1976 (NCNA May 10, 1976). During the test run of 3 months beginning in February 1976, the mill was observed to be operating normally (Peking Radio in Burmese, May 12, 1976; cit. SWB/W 879).

CONGO (Brazz.)

The Madingou limestone-crushing plant, the construction of which was started in November 1974, was handed over on May 26. It will help facilitate the amelioration of soil (NCNA May 26, 1976).

EQUATORIAL GUINEA

Minutes of talks for the construction of a hydroelectric station in Bicombo and a high-voltage power transformer and transmission line between Bicombo and Bata were signed on May 1 (NCNA May 4, 1976).

GAMBIA

A Chinese agro-technical team is engaged in a rice cultivation project at Sapu (NCNA May 14, 1976).

GUINEA BISSAU

A protocol on the despatch of a Chinese medical team was signed on May 11 (NCNA May 12, 1976).

GUYANA

Guyana's first state-owned clay-brick factory, on the west bank of Demerara river, began trial production on May 29. The factory on which work began in March 1975, was built under the 1972 agreement on economic and technical cooperation between the PR China and Guyana. It covers an area of 15 acres and has an installed capacity of producing 10 million clay bricks a year (NCNA May 29, 1976).

PAKISTAN

Chinese road builders are constructing the Karakoram Highway, which attains a height of 15,500 feet, passing through the world's most difficult terrain (Karachi Radio May 14, 1976; cit. SWB 5210).

China will give Pakistan a 15,000,000-rupee loan for setting up a

glass-sheet factory at (? Nosira) in the North-West Frontier Region (Karachi Radio, May 20, 1976; cit. SWB/W 880). An agreement and a protocol on scientific and technical cooperation was signed on May 30, 1976 (NCNA May 30, 1976).

SIERRA LEONE

Three Chinese-aided rice stations at Mange, Bo, and Makeni as well as a vegetable station at Lumley were handed over on May 20. The work on these stations began in 1972 (NCNA May 20, 1976).

SRI LANKA

On April 30, 1976, Prime Minister Mrs. Bandaranaike attended the foundation-stone laying ceremony of the Minneriya textile mill, which is to be constructed with Chinese aid (NCNA May 2, 1976).

SOUTH YEMEN (see YEMEN, PDR)

SUDAN

The friendship hall located on the bank of the Blue Nile was completed on May 16 (NCNA May 17, 1976) and inaugurated on May 23. It consists of a grand international conference hall with simultaneous interpretation equipment for eight languages, a medium-sized conference room, and a number of small meeting rooms, a banquet hall, a modern theatre, an exhibition hall, and other attached buildings and equipment. The total area is 50,000 square metres, all buildings covering 11,000 sq.m, their total floor space amounting to 24,000 sq.m. and in addition, a square, a car park, and afforested zones. The main building has a height of 40 metres (NCNA May 23, 1976).

The beginning of trial production in the spinning and weaving sections of the Hassaheisa textile mill was reported for May 27 (NCNA May 27, 1976).

VIETNAM, DR

After more than four years of construction, the medical glassware factory in Hai Hung province is nearing completion. The factory has been equipped with machines to produce syringes, ampules, and vials for penicillin through a rotary production chain. More than 5,500 tons of machinery and equipment are installed (Hanoi Radio April 17, 1976; cit. SWB/W 878).

A 110/35/10 kV transformer station has been completed in Than Hoa province after 16 months of construction. The station has two 20 kV transformers which provide electric power for the Co Dinh chromium mine and the Ban Tach, Yen Thai, and Ham Rong areas to support industrial and agricultural production. This is one of three transformer stations built with Chinese assistance (Hanoi Radio, Apr 29, 1976, cit. SWB/W 880).
