Die Südostasien- wissenschaft in den USA in Westeuropa und in der Bundesrepublik Deutschland

Ein Bericht im Auftrag des
Instituts für Asienkunde, Hamburg

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Eine Analyse der Entwicklung der Südostasienwissenschaft in der westlichen Welt bis zum Jahre 1974 und eine Darstellung der mit der Erforschung des Raumes befaßten wissenschaftlichen Institutionen. Darin wird aufgezeigt, wie die überwiegend interdisziplinär ausgerichtete Südostasienwissenschaft in den USA im Rahmen der Area Studies-Programme zunächst einen hohen Stand erreichte und wie dort zu Beginn der Siebzigerjahre die Aktivitäten der Südostasienzentren zum Teil erheblich eingeschränkt wurden. Der Bericht geht dann auf die weniger aufwendig betriebene Südostasienforschung in Westeuropa ein, die im gleichen Zeitraum eher intensiviert wurde, weil einige europäische Staaten an der Neuordnung ihres Verhältnisses zu den ehemaligen Kolonien interessiert waren.

Eine von der Stiftung Volkswagenwerk angeregte Umfrage hat ergeben, daß sich auch in der Bundesrepublik Deutschland zunehmend Wissenschaftler mit südostasiatischen Themen beschäftigen. Die Südostasienforschung in der Bundesrepublik verläuft jedoch im Gegensatz zu vergleichbaren Ländern weder koordiniert noch zentralisiert. Auf diese Weise sind deutsche Forschungsergebnisse national wie international weitgehend unbeachtet geblieben. Die Studie untersucht die Gründe dafür und enthält neben einer Bestandsaufnahme Vorschläge, wie kurzfristig eine bessere Koordination der Forschung erreicht und langfristig eine systematische wissenschaftliche Beschäftigung mit dem Raum verwirklicht werden könnte.
