The contracts and agreements signed in areas involving diesel engine, mini cement factory, mini paper mill, while the memorandums of understanding reached between the two sides covered areas like electrical accessories, mechanical toys, picture tube and radio and cassetts. Letters of intent were exchanges in areas like chemicals, electronics, textiles.

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

Ghana

The Chinese-aided irrigation project was launched at Nobewam about 40 km from Kumasi, capital of Ashanti Region. This project includes the con-

struction of two dams at Nobewam and the opening-up of about 200 hectares of paddy rice field and a two-hectare fish pond in the area. A 29-member Chinese agro-technical group arrived in Ghana last December for making preparation for the project. The three-million-U.S.-dollar project is planned to be completed by the end of 1992. Madagascar

The 7th Chinese medical team sent by Gansu Province left for home after two years' service. The team has treated some 280,000 patients since it came in 1988, winning appreciation from the Malagasy people for its work. A new team from the same province has already started treating patients after it arrived here on May 15. (XNA, May 29, 1990)

Myanmar (ex-Burma)

With Chinese assistance a central satellite television retransmitting station is under construction in Yangon. China has contracted to set up a national satellite television retransmitting system for Myanmar. In accordance with the contract, a central satellite television retransmitting station in the capital and 12 remote ground stations will be built in many places. The central station and some of the ground stations will start operation on May 27. (XNA, May 24, 1990)

Cui Weiyue 崔巍

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Congress of Inner Mongolian Autonomous Region. (XNA, May 4, 1990)
Ciu is a newcomer.

Gu Hui 周辉

Identified as commander of Nanjing Military Region. (XNA, Jun 2, 1990)
Born in 1930 in Gai County, Liaoning Province, he joined the PLA in 1947. Later he served in the 4th Field Army and 1950-53 as staff officer of a regiment with the "Chinese People's Volunteers" in Korea. 1961 he graduated from the PLA Military Academy. From 1966 until 1985 he rose from commander of a regiment to that of an army. In Oct 1985 he was made deputy commander of Jinan Military Region and elected alternate member of the CCP 13th Central Committee in November 1987.

Guo Dongbo 郭东波
Appointed director of the Macao Branch of XNA. (XNA, May 26, 1990)
Since 1984 Guo has been vice-chairman of the China Council for Promoting International Trade.

Guo Shuyan 郭树言
Elected governor of Hubei Province. (XNA, May 4, 1990)
Guo has been acting governor since March 1990.

Gyaincain Norbu 江村罗布
Elected chairman of the People's Government of Tibet Autonomous Region. (XNA, May 31, 1990)

The Tibetan G.N. was born in 1932 in Baan County, Sichuan Province. 1959-69 he served as magistrate of Baxo County and deputy Party secretary of Zhabdun District to become Party secretary of Xigaze Prefecture in 1972; 1973-75 he presided Tibet's Higher People's Court. Since 1985 he has been deputy secretary of Tibet CP.

Li Daqiang 李大强
Elected vice-governor of Hubei. (XNA, May 5, 1990)

Li was a newcomer when elected deputy for Liaoning to the 7th NPC in 1988.

Lin Ruo 林若
Elected chairman of the People's Congress of Guangdong Province. (XNA, May 17, 1990)

Lin, a member of the CCP 13th Central Committee, has been secretary of Guangdong CP since Jul 1955.

Shi Yuxiao 史玉孝
Identified as political commissar of Nanjing Military Region. (XNA, Jun 2, 1990)

Born in 1933 in Baoji, Shaanxi Province, Shi joined the 1st Field Army in 1949 and the "Chinese People's Volunteers" in Korea in 1953. From 1961 until 1979 he rose from chief of a company to political commissar of an army. In 1980 he graduated from the PLA Political Academy and successively served as political commissar of an army. In November 1985 he became deputy political commissar of Nanjing Military Region and was elected member of the CCP 13th Central Committee in November 1987.

Xu Jiaturun 许家屯
Flees PR China (Yomiuri Shimbun May 16, 1990), cit. NZZ, May 18, 1990)
From 1983/06-1990/01 Xu had been director of XNA's Hongkong Branch and China's leading representative there. The Chinese Foreign Ministry disclosed Xu to be on recreation leave for two or three years in U.S.A. The reason for his flight is to be seen in the involvement in the escape of student leaders after the smashing of the unrests in June 1989.

Zhang Taiheng 张太恒
Identified as commander of Chengdu Military Region. (Chengdu Radio, May 5, 1990, cit. SWB, May 8, 1990)
Zhang was born in 1931 in Guangrao County, Shandong Province. 1949-51 he served as a platoon leader and rose from company to battalion comman-

der, 1952-55. In 1961 he graduated from Basic Department of PLA Military Academy. In 1983 he was elected deputy for the PLA to the 6th NPC (confirmed by the 7th in 1988) and became deputy commander of Chengdu Military Region in 1985. Appointed lieutenant-general in August 1988.

Zhou Rongchang 周荣昌
Elected vice-chairman of the People's Congress of Inner Mongolian Autonomous Region. (XNA, May 5, 1990)
Zhou has been a member of the Standing Committee of Inner Mongolian CP since December 1984.
