AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

Wolfgang Bartke

Czechoslovakia (Mar 15)

Protocol on scientific cooperation covering 28 projects in the fields of electronics, machine building, wood processing and environmental protection.

Djibouti (Mar 16)

A Agreement on economic and technological cooperation;

B Agreement on cultural cooperation.

Great Britain (Mar 15)

Program to promote cultural, educational and scientific exchanges in 1991-93. Under it, the two countries pledged to advance exchanges and cooperation in the areas of culture, arts, broadcasting and television, publishing, archives, education, youth and sports.

India (Mar 12)

Executive program of cultural cooperation, which covers the exchange activities from 1991 to 1993 on areas of culture and arts, education, social sciences, books and publications, information and mass media and sports.

Exchange of notes concerning the 3rd batch of the 3rd round of Japanese loan to China for 1990. The third batch loan, totalling 43.38 billion yen, will be used in the construction of five projects including highway and communication projects in Qingdao, Baoji-Zhongwei railway and Wuhan Dahe airport.

Namibia (Mar 27)

Cultural agreement covering the fields of culture, education, science, health, sports and mass media.

New Zealand (Mar 20)

Memorandum on strengthening academic cooperation. According to it, the research cooperation will involve exchanging scientists and information on science and technology and implementing cooperative research and development projects.

Trade protocol for 1991.

Philippines (Mar 08)

Trade protocol for 1991. According to it, the 1991 targeted volume for a bilateral exchange of goods worth 400-450 million U.S. dollars initially. Major commodities China will import from the Philippines this year include phosphatic and compound fertilizer, coconut oil, coffee and coffee beans, fresh bananas, chrome ore, plywood and cashew nuts. Among the major commodities the Philippines will import from China this year are crude oil, coal, machinery, textiles, equipment, electrical products, steel billets, cotton, cement, mineral and mineral products. Crude oil accounted for the bulk of the Philippine imports from China. Bilateral trade peaked in 1985 when the Philippines imported 276.08 million U.S. dollars worth of goods from China and exported 79.79 million U.S. dollars worth of goods to China.

A Protocol for scientific and technological cooperation;

B Cooperation plan on health care and medical sciences for 1991-94.

Soviet Union (Mar 01)

Agreement on mutual exemption of visiting groups from visa requirements. The agreement, a supplement to an earlier one on visits to each other's countries by Chinese and Soviet citizens, signed by the two governments in July 1988, will become effective March 31 this year.

Soviet Union (Mar 15)

Agreement on China providing preferential commodity loans worth one billion Swiss francs to the Soviet Union. The commodities to be provided include grain, meat, peanuts, tea, tobacco and textiles and other light industrial products, according to earlier reports.

Soviet Union (Mar 21)

Protocol on economic cooperation and trade for 1991. This is the first trade protocol signed by the two countries after the two-way trade switched from the old clearing agreement trade to cash trade not long ago.

Soviet Union (Mar 26)

Agreement on cooperation in civil aviation. According to it, in addition to the three existing air routes, a new Shenyang-Irkutsk route will be opened. Both sides will engage in broad cooperation in air freight and civil aviation.

UNICEF (Mar 18)

A World Declaration on the survival, protection and development of children;

B The plan of action in the 1990s.

The documents urge the international community to pay enough attention to children, particularly in developing countries. The declaration stipulates seven goals for the next decade in the protection of children and improvement of their life.

United Nations Development Program (Mar 22)

Agreement under which UNDP will provide 4,428,000 U.S. dollars of assistance to a 3-year-project in China. The project, entitled "transfer of knowledge through expatriate nationals" and "senior technical recruitment service", is aimed at improving efficiency, productivity and management in high-priority development areas through human resource development.

Elected vice-chairman of Guizhou People's Congress (XNA, Mar 15, 1991).

Chen is a newcomer.

Chen Ziyang 陈滋英

Appointed deputy director of the State Hongkong and Macao Affairs office (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

Chen has been director of the Hongkong and Macao Affairs Office under the Ministry of Foreign Affairs before.

Diao Congzhou 刁从洲

Identified as commander of Inner Mongolia Military District (XNA, Mar 16, 1991).

Since 1988 Diao has been commander of a group army under Beijing Military Region.

Ge Hongsheng 葛洪升

Elected governor of Zhejiang Province (XNA, Mar 13, 1991).

Ge, an alternate member of the CCP 13th Central Committee, has been acting governor of Zhejiang before.

Gu Erxiong 顾二熊

Appointed vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA, Mar 3, 1991).

Gu has been Party secretary and mayor of Qinghuangdao City before.

He Guoqiang 贺国强

Appointed vice-minister of chemical industry (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

He was born in 1944. In 1985 he was elected alternate member of the CCP Central Committee and in 1987 secretary of Jinan City CP.

Hong Hu 洪虎

Appointed vice-minister of the State Commission for Restructuring the Economy (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

Since 1989 Hong has been secretary-general of the commission.

Hou Jie 侯捷

Appointed minister of construction (XNA, Mar 2, 1991).

Hou, a member of the CCP 13th Central Committee, has been vice-minister of water resources before.

Huang Zhendong 黄镇东

Appointed minister of communications (XNA, Mar 2, 1991).

Huang was born in 1940 in Jiangsu Province. He studied at Nanjing Engineering School and Shanghai Shipping Institute. Later he served as director of Qinghuangdao Harbor Administration and as vice-minister of communications.

Jiang Xiasheng 姜燮生

Removed from his position as vice-minister of aeronautics and astronautics (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

Jiang Zhuping 蒋祝平

Appointed director of the Civil Aviation Administration of China (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

Jiang was born in 1937 in Jiangsu Province. In 1963 he graduated from Harbin Military Engineering Institute. 1963-65 he served as a designer in No.5 Institute under the Ministry of National Defense. 1978-85 he served successively as deputy director of the Design Institute at Nanchang Aircraft Manufacturing Plant and Party secretary in the Ministry of Aeronautics Industry. In July 1985 he became vice-governor of Jiangxi Province.

Jing Yannian 敬延年

Elected vice-chairman of Gansu People's Congress (XNA, Mar 17, 1991).

Jing is a newcomer.

Li Changchun 李昌春

Elected governor of Henan Province (Zhengzhou Radio, Mar 11, 1991; cit. SWB, Mar 14, 1991).

Since June 1990 Li has been Henan's acting governor.

Li Luyue 李鹿野

Identified as chairman of the National Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation (XNA, Mar 8, 1991).

From 1983 to 1990 Li served as ambassador of the UN Commission on Human Rights and in 1988 also as president of the UN Security Council.

Lin Hanxiong 林汉雄

Removed from his position as minister of construction for "violating discipline" (XNA, Mar 2, 1991).

Ma Zhongcai 马仲才

Identified as deputy secretary of Shandong Province CP (Jinan Radio, Mar 20, 1991; cit. SWB, Mar 23, 1991).

Since July 1990 Ma has been member of the Standing Committee of Shandong CP and secretary-general of Shandong People's Government.

Nie Ronggui 聂荣贵

Identified as deputy secretary of Sichuan Province CP (XNA, Mar 17, 1991).

Ni served in the same position from 1982 until 1987 when he became deputy secretary of Yunnan CP (until Aug 1990).

Qian Yongchang 钱永昌

Removed from his position as minister of communications for "abusing power" to seek personal gain (XNA, Mar 2, 1991).

Tong Zhiguang 佟志广

Appointed vice-minister of Foreign Economic Relations and Trade (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

Tong has been vice-chairman of the Board of Directors of the China Resources Company before.

Wang Ang 王昂

Appointed vice-minister of aeronautics and astronautics industry (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

Wang served as deputy minister of aeronautics industry from 1985 until 1988 when he became chief engineer of the Ministry of Aeronautics Industry.

Wang Jianguo 王建功

Appointed vice-governor of Shandong Province (XNA, Mar 15, 1991).

An alternate member of the CCP 12th Central Committee, Wang served as deputy secretary of Shanxi Province CP from 1985-87.

Wang Maolin 王茂林

Elected secretary of Shanxi Province CP (XNA, Mar 5, 1991).

Wang was born in 1934 in Jiangsu Province. In the 1960s he worked in the Maiyukou Mine in Datong and in the 1970s in Datong Mining Bureau and as deputy director of the Economic Leading Group of Shanxi CP. In 1979 he became vice-governor of Shanxi and member of the CCP 13th Central Committee. Since 1988 he has been deputy secretary of Shanxi CP.

Wang Zhanchang 王占昌

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Congress of Gansu Province (XNA, Mar 17, 1991).

Since 1987 Wang has been a member of the Central Discipline Inspection Commission under the CCP Central Committee.

Yang Kuifu 杨魁孚

Appointed vice-minister of the State Family Planning Commission (XNA, Mar 6, 1991).

Yang is a newcomer.

Yue Qifeng 岳岐峰

Elected governor of Liaoning Province (XNA, Mar 14, 1991).

Yue has been Liaoning's acting governor since July 1990.

Zhang Fusen

Elected deputy secretary of Xinjiang Autonomous Region CP (Xinjiang TV, Mar 20, 1991; cit. SWB, Mar 22, 1991). Zhang is a newcomer.
