Belarus (Jan 17)

An agreement on the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income and on property, and an agreement relating to civil transportation between the governments of China and Belarus were signed in Beijing. President Jiang Zemin and visiting Belarus President Alyaksandr Lukashenka attended the signing ceremony. An agreement on setting up a Belarussian-Chinese enterprise for the production of "Belaz"-type heavy-freight trucks was also signed. President Jiang and President Lukashenka signed the "Joint Statement of the PRC and the Republic of Belarus on Further Developing and Deepening Cooperation". (RMRB, XNA, 18, 20 Jan 95; Xinhua, 19 Jan 95, in SWB, 21 Jan 95)

Croatia (Jan 09)

An agreement on mutual exemption of visas between China and Croatia for holders of diplomatic and official passports and a protocol on avoidance of double taxation and prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income were signed in Beijing. Premier Li Peng and Croatian Prime Minister Nikica Calentic attended the signing ceremony. (Xinhua, 9/10 Jan 95, in SWB, 14 Jan 95; RMRB, XNA, 10 Jan 95)

Finland (Jan 12)

A memorandum of understanding on judicial cooperation and exchanges between China and Finland was signed in

Beijing by China's Minister of Justice Xiao Yang and his Finnish counterpart Anneli Jaatteenvaeki. (RMRB, XNA, 13 Jan 95)

France (Jan 15)

A memorandum of understanding on the Construction of Daya Bay Second Nuclear Power Station in Guangdong Province was signed in Beijing by Ye Qing, Chinese vice-chairman of the State Planning Commission, and Jose Rossi, French minister of industry, posts, telecommunications and foreign trade. (RMRB, XNA, 16 Jan 95)

Japan (Jan 13)

An agreement on the third group of Japanese loans to China for 1994, totaling 140 342 billion Y., was signed in Beijing by Chinese Vice-Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Gu Yongjiang and President of the Japanese Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund Akira Nishigaki. Chinese Foreign Trade Minister Wu Yi attended the signing ceremony. The Japanese loans will go into 15 projects for communications, power industry and agriculture. The Japanese started in 1979 providing such loans for China through this Japanese fund. So far, the Japanese government has committed three loans, amounting to 1.681 trillion Y. (XNA, RMRB, 14 Jan 95)

Togo (Jan 20)

A document relating to a million RMBY aid package (approximately 120 000 US\$) China will provide to Togo was signed in Lome by visiting Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and Boumbera Alassounouma, minister of foreign affairs and cooperation. (XNA, 22 Jan 95)

United States (Jan 16)

China and the United States renewed two agreements of cooperation in basic sciences and in metrology and standards. The agreements were inked at the end of the second session of the sixth Sino-US Joint Commission on Science and Technology Cooperation held in Beijing. (XNA, 17 Jan 95)

International Agreements

European Union (Jan 19)

The European Union announced that it has reached a number of agreements with China on Chinese textile exports to

Europe after 10 months of talks. An EU spokesman said the documents will "substantially help to reduce trade friction between China and the EU". In addition, the two trading partners also have signed for the first time an agreement on Chinese export of silk linen products to Europe, signifying an end to unilateral EU restrictions on China in this field. (Order No.170 of the State Council signed by Premier Li Peng on January 12, 1995) (Xinhua, 18 Jan 95, in SWB, 20 Jan 95; XNA, 19 Jan 95) These measures shall become effective on the date of promulgation. (Full text and translation: RMRB, 19 Jan 95; Xinhua, 18 Jan 95, in SWB, 2 Feb 95)

"Regulations regarding the Management of Expenses for State Compensation", adopted at the 29th meeting of the State Council Standing Conference on January 16, 1995. (Order No.171 of the State Council signed by Premier Li Peng on January 25, 1995) These regulations shall become effective on the date of promulgation. (Full text and translation: RMRB, 30 Jan 95; Xinhua, 29 Jan 95, in SWB, 9 Feb 95)

The State Land Administration and the State Commission for Restructuring the Economy recently jointly promulgated the "Provisional regulations on administration over land use rights of shareholding companies". (Zhongguo xinwen she news agency, Beijing, 24 Jan 95, in SWB, 26 Jan 95; full text and translation: RMRB, 7 Jan 95; Xinhua, 5 Jan 95, in SWB, 9 Feb 95) These regulations shall become effective on the date of promulgation.

"Temporary provisions on curtailing excessive profit-making" (State Planning Commission, 25th January 1995) went into effect to control fraud and monopolization of service and other industries. This is the first specific regulation of its kind in China's history, said Luo Zhiling, vice-chairman of the State Planning Commission. According to the regulation, excessive profit-making is defined as posting prices that are unreasonably above the average

pricing for similar goods of similar quality in the same area at the particular time. (XNA, 28 Jan 95; full text and translation: RMRB, 28 Jan 95; Xinhua, 27 Jan 95, in SWB, 9 Feb 95) The provisions will take effect on the day of promulgation.

The "Provisions on Prohibiting the Sending by Mail or Illegally Carrying Classified State Documents, Information and other Materials out of the Territory", formulated by the State Bureau of Secrecy and General Administration of Customs, will go into effect on 1st April 1995. According to a briefing, the main contents of the provisions are: Classified state documents, information and other materials are banned from being sent by mail or being illegally carried out of the territory; where in special circumstances such materials need to be carried out of the territory, permission should be obtained from departments or agencies in charge of maintaining secrets in line with relevant state regulations. The provisions, which were formulated on the basis of "The Law of the People's Republic of China on Maintaining State Secrets" and the "Customs Law of the People's Republic of China", stipulate that violators of the "provisions" will be punished in accordance with the "Rules for the Implementation of Administrative Punishments Under the Customs Law of the People's Republic of China". (Xinhua, 13 Jan 95, in SWB, 14 Jan 95)

Provisions of the National Committee of the CPPCC on Political Consultation, Democratic Supervision and Political Participation and Discussion, adopted at the 9th session of the Standing Committee of the CPPCC 8th National Committee on 14th January 1995. (Xinhua, 14 Jan 95, in SWB, 27 Jan 95; full text: RMRB, 15 Jan 95)

With the approval of the Central Military Commission, the General Staff Headquarters recently issued an order to enact the Army's first regulations on radio control - "Regulations on Radio Control of the Chinese People's Liberation Army".
