

Asien nach dem Ende der Sowjetunion

**Die Auswirkungen des Zerfalls der sowjetischen Großmacht
auf Politik, Gesellschaft und Wirtschaft der asiatischen Staaten**

Der Zerfall der sowjetischen Großmacht hat auf Asien als die volkreichste und wirtschaftlich dynamischste Weltregion differenzierte Auswirkungen in Politik, Gesellschaft und Wirtschaft hervorgerufen. Auf den ersten Blick hat sich die Landschaft in Asien viel weniger verändert als in Europa. Trotzdem hat auch dort eine Zeit der Instabilität und eine Übergangsphase voller Unwägbarkeiten begonnen. Der vorliegende Sammelband faßt die überarbeiteten Beiträge einer Tagung zusammen, die sich dem Thema "Asien nach dem Ende der Sowjetunion: Die Auswirkungen des Zerfalls der sowjetischen Großmacht auf Politik, Gesellschaft und Wirtschaft der asiatischen Staaten" gewidmet hat. Unter der Überschrift "Gesamtasiatische Probleme" werden ein präziser Überblick über die Gesamtentwicklung in der Region nach dem Zerfall der Sowjetunion gegeben und die neue Rolle Japans in Asien untersucht.

Unter regionalen Problemen werden zunächst die neuen Republiken in Zentralasien, die plötzlich an Prominenz gewonnen haben, behandelt. Der fehlerhaften Sicht einer monolithischen "islamischen" Region wird ein differenziertes Bild der geopolitischen, politischen, wirtschaftlichen, ethnischen und religiösen Lage gegenübergestellt. Zu dem Themenbereich "Nationalitäten an Chinas Nordwestgrenze" wird betont, daß hier kein "neuer Konfliktherd" entstanden sei, neu sei nur die Verstärkung ohnehin vorhandener separatistischer Bestrebungen autochthoner ethnischer Gruppen. Es wird die Bedeutung vieler individueller und gesellschaftlicher Identitäts- bzw. Loyalitätskriterien betont. Ein weiterer Beitrag widmet sich dem Thema der souveränen Mongolei zwischen der russischen Föderation und der VR China. Erstmals werden hier Möglichkeiten einer eigenständigen Politik gesehen. Unter dem Titel "Die VR China und die GUS-Staaten" werden die Vor- und Nachteile des Zerfalls der Sowjetunion für die VR China anhand verschiedener Kriterien herausgearbeitet. Ob der Zerfall der Sowjetunion neue Chancen für die Wiedervereinigung in Korea hervorgebracht habe, ist die zentrale Frage eines weiteren Beitrags. Die Friedensvereinbarung für Kambodscha als ein Zeichen der Veränderung und das oft gebrauchte Schlagwort vom Kräftevakuum sind Gesichtspunkte, unter denen Fortschritte in der regionalen Integration Südostasiens untersucht werden. Obwohl mit dem Rückzug der Sowjetunion aus Afghanistan bereits 1988 die Supermachtrivalität abgenommen hat, bedeutete der Zerfall der Sowjetunion, daß Indien einen wichtigen politischen und wirtschaftlichen Partner verloren hat, und auch Pakistan muß seine Position in der Region und gegenüber den USA überdenken.
