Belgium (Mar 03)

The Chinese government signed an agreement on financial assistance with the Kingdom of Belgium in Beijing. According to the agreement, Belgium grants China 200m Belgian francs to cover the purchase from Belgium of equipment and technology in 1994. (RMRB, XNA, 4 Mar 95)

Croatia (Mar 24)

China and Croatia have decided to exempt travellers holding diplomatic or official passports from visa requirements as of April 19, 1995. Following an agreement signed by the two countries, citizens of China and Croatia holding valid diplomatic or official passports will be exempt from visa requirements for entry, exit, or transit, if their stay does not exceed 90 days. (RMRB, XNA, 25 Mar 95)

Egypt (Mar 25)

A trade agreement between China and Egypt was signed in Cairo by visiting Chinese Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Wu Yi and Mahmoud Mohamed Mahmoud, Egyptian minister of economy and foreign trade. China will also grant 3m RMBY (about 357,000 US\$) to Egypt. (XNA, 26, 27 Mar 95; RMRB, 26 Mar 95)

Ethiopia (Mar 28)

The Chinese government granted 5,000 sets of hand tools worth 1m RMBY (about 120,000 US\$) to Ethiopia. (XNA, 29 Mar 95; RMRB, 30 Mar 95)

India (Mar 02)

An agreement on protecting tigers was signed in Beijing by Chinese Minister of Forestry Xu Youfang and the Indian Minister of the Environment and Forestry Kamal Nath. (RMRB, XNA, 3 Mar 95)

Israel (Mar 27)

A memorandum on education cooperation between China and Israel was signed in Beijing by visiting Israeli

Education Minister Amnon Rubinstein with the State Education Commission. (RMRB, XNA, 28 Mar 95)

Japan (Mar 23)

Japan signed a letter of exchange with China to provide the latter with 852m ¥ (9.45m US\$) in aid for health care. (CD, 24 Mar 95; XNA, 25 Mar 95)

Kirghizstan (Mar 20)

China's capital city Beijing signed a memorandum with Bishek, capital city of the Republic of Kirghizstan, with the aim of expanding friendly exchanges between them. The memorandum was signed in Beijing by Li Qiyen, mayor of Beijing, and Boris Ivandrich Cilaev, mayor of Bishek. (XNA, 21 Mar 95)

North Korea (Mar 29)

The 1995 sports exchange agreement between China and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea was signed in Pyongyang. (XNA, 30 Mar 95)

Kuwait (Mar 24)

Chinese State Councillor and Defence Minister Chi Haotian and Kuwaiti Defence Minister Shaykh Ahmed Sabah signed a memorandum of understanding on military cooperation between the two countries. (XNA, 25, 27 Mar 95)

Latvia (Mar 30)

A protocol on consultation between the foreign ministries of China and Latvia was signed in Riga by visiting Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and his Latvian counterpart Valdis Birkavs. (XNA, 31 Mar 95)

Macau (Mar 07)

Two agreements concerning Air Macau's carrier status and Macau's accession into international organizations were signed at the four-day 22nd meeting of the Sino-Portuguese Joint Liaison Group held in Macau. (XNA, 8 Mar 95)

Morocco (Mar 27)

An agreement on increasing and protecting investments between China and Morocco was signed in Rabat. (RMRB, 29 Mar 95)

New Zealand (Mar 20)

Shanghai, China's largest industrial city, signed a memorandum in Beijing with Dunedin, the fourth largest city in New Zealand, to promote cultural and economic exchanges between the two sister cities in the 1995-1996 fiscal year. The two cities established sisterhood relations on October 21, 1994. (XNA, 21 Mar 95)

Pakistan (Mar 27)

China has agreed to grant Pakistan credit amounting to 750m US\$ for the development of steel, hydro-power, thermo-power industry and the expansion of electricity. Four protocols were signed in Beijing, laying the foun-

dation of their future cooperation in steel-making, heavy engineering and power generation sectors. (XNA, 28 Mar 95)

Rwanda (Mar 22)

A signing ceremony for the exchange of documents on the Chinese government's provision of goods and material to Rwanda took place in Beijing. (XNA, 23 Mar 95)

United States (Mar 11)

Chinese Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic cooperation Wu Yi and visiting US Trade Representative Mickey Kantor officially signed in Beijing the Agreement on Intellectual Property Rights the two sides reached on 26th February. (RMRB, XNA, 12 Mar 95)

United States (Mar 13)

A renewed memorandum of agreement on international satellite launching services was signed in Beijing between the Chinese and US governments. The "Memorandum of Agreement Regarding International Trade in Commercial Launch Services" is valid for seven years. Song Jian, state councillor and chairman of the State Science and Technology Commission, attended the signing ceremony. (RMRB, XNA, 14 Mar 95)

United States (Mar 27)

The Chinese and U.S. civil aviation administrations have signed the New Schedule of Implementation Procedures to extend the "Bilateral Airworthiness Agreement" previously signed by the two governments. (RMRB, 25 Mar 95; XNA, 28 Mar 95)

International Agreements

The first meeting of Sino-ASEAN Joint Committee on Science and Technology Cooperation was held on March 21, 1995 with an agreement signed in Bandar Seri Begawan, the capital of Brunei. (Decree No.45 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on March 18, 1995). (Full text: RMRB, 22 May 95; Xinhua, 20 Mar 95, in SWB, 29 Mar 95)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on the People's Bank of China", adopted at the 3rd session of the 8th NPC on 18th March 1995. This law becomes ef-

fective upon promulgation. (Decree No.46 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on March 18, 1995). (Full text: RMRB, 22 May 95; Xinhua, 20 Mar 95, in SWB, 24 Mar 95)

State Council issues amended "State Council's Regulations Concerning Working Hours of Workers and Staff". The decision on amending the regulations was passed at the 8th plenary session of the State Council on February 17, 1995. The regulations will come into effect on May 1, 1995. (Order No.174 of the State Council of the PRC, signed by Premier Li Peng on March 25, 1995) (Full text: RMRB, 25 Mar 95; Xinhua, 24 Mar 95, in SWB, 3 Apr 95)

Methods to implement the "State Council's Regulations Concerning Working Hours of Workers and Staff" were issued by the Ministry of Personnel. These methods come into force on May 1, 1995. (Full text: RMRB, 26 Mar 95; Xinhua, 25 Mar 95, in SWB, 30 Mar 95)

Methods to implement the "State Council's Regulations Concerning Working Hours of Workers and Staff" were issued by the Ministry of Labor. These methods will be implemented together with the "Regulations". (Full text: RMRB, 26 Mar 95)

China issued a detailed set of regulations on the management of state property in administrative government departments and institutions on March 8, 1995. The regulations, the first of its kind in China, were issued by the State Administration of State Property and the Ministry of Finance. (Xinhua, 8 Mar 95, in SWB, 11 Mar 95; XNA, 11 Mar 95)

China's State Council has issued new regulations governing inspection of ships entering and exiting Chinese ports. These regulations will become effective upon promulgation. (Order No.175 of the State Council of the PRC, signed by Premier Li Peng on March 21, 1995) (XNA, 28 Mar 95; full text: RMRB, 28 Mar 95)

The State Administration of Industry and Commerce has issued the "Regulation that industrial and commercial administrative and managerial personnel must not accept invitations to receptions that may affect the fair execution of public affairs" and the "Regulation that industrial and commercial administrative and managerial personnel must not participate in recreational activities at public places of entertainment with public funds" as well as the "Methods for handling those who violate the 'two regulations'". (Xinhua, 22 Mar 95, in SWB, 27 Mar 95)

The Ministry of Personnel has promulgated regulations forbidding its employees to seek personal gain by abusing their power. (XNA, 28 Mar 95)

"Regulations on labor management in foreign-funded enterprises", jointly promulgated by the Ministry of Labor and Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation on August 11, 1994. (Full text: *Guoji Shangbao* [International Commerce], Beijing, 14 Feb 95, in SWB, 30 Mar 95)

"Provisional regulations on control of archives related to foreign-funded enterprises", jointly promulgated by the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation, the State Economic and Trade Commission, and the State Bureau of Archives on December 29, 1994. (Full text: *Guoji Shangbao*, 14 Feb 95, in SWB, 30 Mar 95)

Chief of the General Staff Zhang Wan-nian and Director of the General Logistics Department Fu Quanyou jointly ordered the promulgation of the "Regulations on Auditing Payments for Equipment for the Chinese People's Liberation Army [PLA]"; Fu Quanyou ordered the promulgation of the "Provisional Regulations on Auditing Financial Settlements and Fund Adjustments for the PLA". Those two sets of regulations came into effect on 1st January this year. The promulgation of the regulations was an important measure by the Army to implement the "Auditing Law". (*Jiefangjun Bao* [Liberation Army], Beijing, 12 Jan 95, in SWB, 15 Mar 95)

"The Interim Regulations Governing Public Security Departments Acceptance of Complaints and Petitions", were promulgated by the Ministry of Public Security on February 14, 1995. (Full text: *Fazhi Ribao* [Legal System Daily], Beijing, 15 Feb 95, in SWB, 17 Mar 95)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on Judges". (Full translation: Xinhua, 1 Mar 95, in SWB, 23 Mar 95)
