Appointed deputy director of the State Council Development Research Center. (RMRB, 25 Apr 95) Lu has served as director of the center's General Office since April 1992.

Shu Huiguo (5)

Appointed deputy secretary of CCP Jiangxi Provincial Committee. (Jiangxi People's Broadcasting Station, 15 Apr 95, in SWB, 18 Apr 95) He concurrently serves as vice-governor of Jiangxi Province (since March 1991). Shu was born in July 1938 in Jing'an County, Jiangxi Province, and joined the CCP in 1980. He is a senior agronomist. In 1960 he graduated from the Sericulture Department of Zhejiang Agriculture College. He then served as deputy director of the Jiangxi Provincial Institute of Sericulture and Tea, deputy head and head of Jiangxi Provincial Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Fishery Department, deputy secretary of CCP Fuzhou Prefectural Committee, commissioner of Fuzhou Prefectural Administrative Office, deputy secretary-general of Jiangxi Provincial People's Government. He was deputy to the 7th NPC in 1988.

Shu Shengyou (6)

Appointed deputy secretary of CCP Jiangxi Provincial Committee. (Jiangxi People's Broadcasting Station, 15 Apr 95, in SWB, 18 Apr 95) Shu, (executive) vice-governor of Jiangxi Province (since March 1991), was also appointed acting governor of the Provincial People's Government at the 15th session of the 8th Provincial People's Congress Standing Committee which concluded on April 29, 1995 in Nanchang. (Jiangxi People's Broadcasting Station, 29 Apr 95, in SWB, 3 May 95) Shu was born in December 1936 in Yushan County, Jiangxi Province, and joined the CCP in 1959. He served as director of the Political Department of the No.2 Light Industry Bureau and the Commerce Bureau of Jingdezhen City, deputy secretary of CCP Jiangxi Provincial Pottery Sales Corporation Committee, Standing Committee member and deputy secretary of CCP Jingdezhen Municipal Committee, director of the Economic Committee, vice-mayor and mayor of Jingdezhen City, assistant to the governor of Jiangxi Province, and as Standing Committee member of CCP Jiangxi Provincial Committee. He was a deputy to the 7th NPC in 1988 and to the 8th NPC in 1993.

Wang Jianlun (f)

Identified as vice-minister of labor. (XNA, 12 Apr 95)

Wei Jianxing

According to a decision of the CCP CC, Wei Jianxing has taken the posts of member, Standing Committee member and secretary of CCP Beijing Municipal Committee. (RMRB, XNA, 28 Apr 95) Wei currently serves as member of the CCP CC Politbureau, member of the CCP CC Secretariat, secretary of the CCP CC Commission for Inspecting Discipline, and as president of the All-China Federation of Trade Unions. For his vita see C.a., 1993/10, p.1056/12.

Wu Guanzheng (7)

According to a decision of the CCP CC, Wu Guanzheng, deputy secretary of CCP Jiangxi Provincial Committee and governor of Jiangxi Province since October 1986, became the new secretary of CCP Jiangxi Provincial Committee. (XNA, 15 Apr 95) He resigned as governor of the Provincial People's Government. Wu was born in August 1938 in Yugan County, Jiangxi Province, and joined the CCP in 1962. He studied hot-work measurement and automatic control. In 1965 he graduated from the Power Department of Qinghua University. In 1968 he completed post-graduate studies at the department. He then served as deputy chief of the Technical Section and vice-chairman of the Revolutionary Committee of the Wuhan Gedian Chemical Plant, deputy director of Wuhan City Science and Technology Committee and director of Wuhan City Scientific and Technical Engineering Research Centre (1975-1982), vice-chairman of Wuhan City Association of Science and Technology, Standing Committee member and secretary of CCP Wuhan Municipal Committee (1982-1983), and as mayor of Wuhan (1983-1986). He was a deputy to the 6th, 7th and 8th NPC in 1983, 1988 and 1993. Wu is a member of the 14th CCP CC.

Zhang Yunchuan (8)

Appointed vice-chairman of Xinjiang Autonomous Regional People's Government at the 14th meeting of the 8th Regional People's Congress Standing Committee on April 8, 1995. (Xinjiang Ribao, 9 Apr 95, in SWB, 25 Apr 95) He is currently a Standing Committee member of CCP Xinjiang Regional Committee. Zhang was born in October 1946 in Dongyang City, Zhejiang Province, and joined the CCP in April 1973. From 1964 to 1970, he studied motor ships at the Harbin Military Engineering Academy. From 1970 to 1983, he worked as a technician, deputy section head, and section head at the No.6214 Plant of the 6th Ministry of Machine-Building Industry. From 1983 to 1985,

he served as the plant's production commander and Party committee member. From 1985 to 1986, he assumed the posts of Standing Committee member of CCP Jiujiang Municipal Committee and vice-mayor of Jiujiang City. From 1986 to 1991, he was deputy secretary of CCP Ganzhou Prefectural Committee and commissioner of Ganzhou Prefectural Administrative Office. From 1991 to 1993, he served as assistant to the governor of Jiangxi Province, Party group member of the provincial government, and Party group secretary of the provincial Economic and Planning Commission. From February 1993 to February 1995, he served as vice-governor of Jiangxi. Zhang was a deputy to the 7th NPC. See also C.a., 1993/2, p.180/14.

Leaders Removed from Office**Chen Xitong**

The CCP CC has approved the resignation of Chen Xitong from the CCP Beijing Municipal Committee as secretary, Standing Committee member and member. It is learned that Chen resigned because he has unshirkable responsibilities for Wang Baosen's case. Wang, a vice-mayor of Beijing, committed suicide 4th April faced with an imminent investigation into economic irregularities and crimes. (XNA, RMRB, 28 Apr 95)

Identified as deputy commander of Beijing Garrison. (Beijing Ribao, 1 Feb 95, in ZGYJ, 1995/3, p.129)

Wang Jiangong (11)

Wang Jiangong, vice-governor of Shandong since March 1991, was identified as deputy secretary of CCP Heilongjiang Provincial Committee. (*Heilongjiang Ribao*, 21 Jan 95, in ZDY, 1995/3, p.74) See also C.a., 1995/2, p.149/11.

Wu Guangyu (12)

Identified as deputy commander of the PLA Air Force. (*Zhongxinshe*, 19 Feb 95, in ZGYJ, 1995/3, p.129) Wu was born in December 1940 in Hongze County, Jiangsu Province into a peasant family. In 1958 he finished middle school. Wu joined the PLA in 1958 and the CCP in 1964. In 1964 he emerged as "ace pilot" from the all-Army grand competitions of military skills. After graduating from the Air Force Aviation School in 1962, he served as Air Force pilot and squadron leader (1962-1970), group commander, regiment commander, deputy division commander, division commander and corps commander of the Air Force Aviation (1970-1985). In October 1985 he was identified as commander of the Air Force units of the PLA Shanghai Base. He then served as commander of the PLA Air Force Command Post (1985-1990), deputy commander of Nanjing Military Regional Air Force (1990-1993), and as deputy commander and Air Force commander of Jinan Military Region (1993). Wu was granted rank of Air Force major general in 1988. He was a deputy to the 6th NPC in 1983. Wu is an alternate member of the 14th CCP CC.

Xing Shizhong (13)

Identified as deputy commander of Jinan Military Region. (*Shandong Broadcasting Station*, 25 Jan 95, in ZDY, 1995/3, p.75) He has served as deputy commander of Lanzhou Military Region since May 1988. Xing was born in September 1938 in Licheng County, Shandong Province, and joined the CCP in 1957. In 1956 he graduated from the Nanjing Engineering Army School. He then served as staff officer of a division engineer section (1959), staff officer of a division operational training section (1965), commander of corps-affiliated engineering battalion (1969), regiment commander (1975), chief of corps operational training division (1978), division chief of staff (1978), division commander (1979), corps commander (1983), and as chief of staff of Lanzhou Military Region (1985). Xing was granted rank of major general in 1988 and lieutenant general in 1993. He was a deputy for the PLA to the 7th NPC and is a deputy to the 8th NPC.

Deaths

Chen Yun, China's most influential Party veteran next to Deng Xiaoping, died on April 10, 1995 at the age of 89 at Beijing's Beijing Hospital. He has been ill since many years. Chen served as member of the CCP CC for 56 years (1931-1987) and as member of the CCP CC Politburo for more than four decades (1934-1987). Chen Yun (original name: Liao Chengyun), was born in Shanghai in 1905, and joined the CCP in 1925. At the age of 15 he started working as an apprentice and then as a clerk in Shanghai's Commercial Press. He took part in the workers' armed uprisings in Shanghai, and also took part in the Long March and attended the Zunyi Conference. After 1949 Chen held the posts of vice-premier of the Government Administration Council, chairman of the Financial and Economic Commission, minister of heavy industry, member of the CCP CC Secretariat, vice-premier of the State Council, minister of commerce, head of the CCP CC Financial and Economic Group, vice-chairman of the NPC Standing Committee, chairman of the State Council's Financial and Economic Commission, member of the Politburo and its Standing Committee, and first secretary of the Central Commission for Inspecting Discipline. In 1987, he was elected chairman of the Central Advisory Commission (until 1992). Chen Yun, China's leading Party cadre in the field of economy, was famous for his "bird cage economy" (market mechanism in China should be like a bird in the cage of the planned economy). His son Chen Yuan is vice-governor of the People's Bank of China.

Kang Shi'en, a former vice-premier and a veteran expert on the petrochemicals industry, died of illness on April 21, 1995 in Beijing at the age of 80. As vice-minister and minister of petroleum industry for over two decades, Kang was an outstanding pioneer and leader of China's petroleum and petrochemicals industries. He also served as chairman of the State Economic Commission, State councillor and Standing Committee member of the Central Advisory Commission. (RMRB, XNA, 23 Apr 95)

Wang Baosen, (executive) vice-mayor of Beijing Municipality since June 1991, committed suicide on April 4, 1995. It has learned that Wang, 60, killed himself ahead of facing an investigation into economic irregularities. (XNA, 9 Apr 95)
